Travel between Canada and other countries December 2011

Canadian residents made 5.1 million trips outside the country in December, a 1.5% increase from November. It was the first time since March 1994 that monthly travel abroad surpassed 5 million trips.

Almost half of those trips abroad in December involved same-day car travel to the United States. Canadians made 2.5 million same-day car trips to the United States, a 4.2% increase and the highest monthly level since May 1998.

In total, travel by Canadian residents to the United States rose 2.2%. The increase in same-day car travel to the United States offset a 0.6% decline in trips of one or more nights. This decline was mainly the result of a 1.3% decrease in overnight travel by plane.

Travel from Canada to countries other than the United States fell 2.3% from November to 761,000 trips.

In the opposite direction, travel to Canada by residents from abroad rose 0.6% in December to just over 2.0 million trips. This was the result of increases from both the United States and overseas countries.

Travel from the United States increased 0.5% to over 1.6 million trips. The main factor was a 2.0% increase in same-day car trips by American residents to Canada, to 599,000 trips, the highest monthly level in 2011.

The increase in same-day car travel offset a 0.4% decline in overnight travel by United States residents to

Canada. The main factor of the decline was a 3.8% decrease in trips of one or more nights made by plane to 283,000 trips.

Travel by overseas residents to Canada rose 1.3% to 389,000 trips, the highest level since September 2008.

Travel from 8 of Canada's top 12 overseas markets rose in December. Travel from India increased 12.5% to 15,000, the highest level from India since record-keeping began in 1972. Travel from the Netherlands declined 7.7%, the largest decrease.

Livestock estimates

As of January 1, 2012

As of January 1, Canadian farmers had just over 12.5 million cattle on their farms, up 0.5% from January 1, 2011. This was the first year-over-year increase in seven years.

Hog producers reported 12.0 million hogs, up 1.1% from January 1, 2011, while the number of sheep rose 2.0% to 828,600 head.

The increase in the Canadian cattle herd follows six consecutive years of declining inventories. The cattle herd, however, was 16.1% lower than the peak level on January 1, 2005.

Cattle inventories edged up overall as prices increased during the year. The number of beef cows on Canadian farms, however, fell 1.0% to 4.2 million

head, continuing a downward trend that started in January 2006.

This decline was mitigated somewhat by a 4.3% increase in the number of beef heifers held for breeding, to 554,300 head. The increase in replacement heifers suggests producers are beginning to replenish their herds with younger cows.

Canadian farmers had about 1.4 million dairy cows and heifers on their farms, roughly unchanged from January 1, 2011.

As of January 1, 2012, 95,105 farms reported cattle and calves, down 1.4% from January 1, 2011, and down 4.3% from the same date in 2010. Beef farms, by far the largest component, accounted for 85% of the number of farms with cattle in Canada.

In 2011, cattle and calf slaughter declined 7.5% from 2010 to 3.5 million head. Slaughter fell in

all provinces except Newfoundland and Labrador and British Columbia. Cattle and calf exports declined 35.2% from 1.1 million head in 2010 to 689,300 head in 2011.

As of January 1, 2012, there were 6,820 hog farms in Canada, down 2.5% from the same date in 2011. These farms reported 1.3 million sows and gilts, down 0.1% from January 1, 2011, and down 1.3% from the same date in 2010.

Domestic hog slaughter was down 0.1% in 2011 from 2010 to 21.3 million head. Hog slaughter in the fourth quarter of 2011 was up 2.4% from the same quarter in 2010.

Canada exported 5.8 million hogs in 2011, up 1.3% from 2010. This was 8.4% less than the exports in 2009 and 41.8% below the peak in 2007.

Sheep producers increased their herds in 2011 as prices remained strong. The breeding herd increased as the number of ewes rose 0.6% and the number of replacement lambs went up 4.1%. The number of market lambs increased 4.9%.


