

Greenhouse, sod and nursery industries, 2011

Sales of greenhouse, nursery and sod products in Canada rose 1.3% to nearly \$3.3 billion in 2011. The increase was mostly the result of a 5.5% gain in sales of greenhouse vegetables and fruits, which reached \$1.1 billion.

Canada had 3,220 greenhouse operations in 2011, down from 3,285 in 2010. However, the total greenhouse area increased from 22.5 million square metres to nearly 23.0 million square metres. Most of this expansion was in greenhouse vegetable production.

For a fifth consecutive year, the value of greenhouse vegetable sales exceeded sales of field vegetables. Sales of tomatoes, the most valuable crop, rose 4.0% to \$496 million. Sales of peppers increased 7.7% to \$300 million, while cucumber sales were up 5.3% to \$279 million.

Growers in Ontario, British Columbia and Quebec accounted for 95.6% of greenhouse vegetable and fruit sales in 2011. Ontario alone represented 63.3%.

Sales and resales of greenhouse flowers and plants fell 0.1% to \$1.4 billion. The main factor was a drop in ornamental bedding plants sales for transplanting (-12.8%). Floriculture represented 55.1% of total greenhouse product sales in 2011.

The expansion of total greenhouse area was accompanied by a 0.3% increase in total operating expenses. Labour costs rose 3.0% to \$616 million, which accounted for 29.2% of total expenses. The total number of seasonal and permanent greenhouse workers fell 2.2% to 36,110.

On the nursery side, sales of nursery products declined 2.0% to \$632 million. Total area decreased 1.6% to 19 463 hectares. Costs for nursery operators increased 0.7% to \$582 million in 2011, of which labour accounted for almost 40%. Nurseries employed 13,945 people, nearly 70% of whom were seasonal employees.

In 2011, total area for sod fell 1.0% to 22 903 hectares, while sod sales and resales fell 2.0% to \$137 million.

Salaries and salary scales of full-time teaching staff at Canadian universities, 2010/2011 (final)

This release presents a report that lists a final set of tables for the academic year 2010/2011, which contain information on the salaries of full-time teaching staff for Canadian universities that have more than 100 staff.

This information was collected annually under the University and College Academic Staff System and has a reference date of October 1. Therefore, the data reflect employment in universities as of that date. Each university must authorize Statistics Canada to release their information.

This is the final issue of "Salaries and Salary Scales of Full-time Teaching Staff at Canadian Universities." The Full-time University and College Academic Staff System has been discontinued.
