Production and disposition of tobacco products, February 2015

Canadian manufacturers produced 1.5 billion cigarettes in February, down 3.8% from the previous month. Cigarette production decreased 16.0% from the same month a year earlier.

The total number of cigarettes sold in February grew 3.8% from January to 1.4 billion, but was down 0.8% from February 2014.

These data are subject to revision and are not seasonally adjusted.

The monthly survey, Production and Disposition of Tobacco Products, measures the quantities of tobacco products that are produced and sold by Canadian manufacturers.

Sawmills, January 2015

Lumber production by sawmills increased 7.2% from December to 4 847.0 thousand cubic metres in January. Compared with January 2014, lumber production decreased by 3.5%.

Sawmills shipped 4 541.0 thousand cubic metres of lumber in January, down 0.8% from December.

Federal Patents, Licences and Royalties Survey, 2013/2014

Overall, the number of patents held, commercialized and pending in 2013/2014 was 4,409, while total income received from the commercialization of intellectual property activities was \$24.5 million.

Trade by Enterprise Characteristics: Exporters in Canada, 2013 (provisional estimates)

Aggregate data on Canadian exporters are now available for 2013. Data include the number of exporting enterprises and the value of exports for these enterprises, by industry and country of destination.

Standard data tables are available upon request. Users can also request customized data products at the Canada and provincial/territorial levels on a cost-recovery basis.

Data for the 2012 reference year for the previous exporter register product will be archived and, therefore, will no longer be available for dissemination.

Note to readers

To align with other national statistical agencies and international organizations, Statistics Canada has adapted its exporter data program to use the enterprise as the statistical unit of measure for exporters. To differentiate this program from previous vintages of exporter data programs, this new program is called the Trade by Enterprise Characteristics (TEC) – Exporter program.

Enterprises can include more than one plant or location. While within an enterprise structure each of these plants or locations can export goods, for the purposes of the TEC – Exporter program, it is the enterprise as a whole that represents the exporter. Similarly, it is the geography and industry classification of the enterprise and export values aggregated at the enterprise level that are used to present the characteristics of the Canadian exporting population.
