Weekly Railway Carloadings, Week ended December 14, 1970 - Published only in the DBS Daily and Weekly

Loadings of revenue freight on railways in Canada declined 2.3% to 73,883 cars during the week ended December 14, compared with 75,624 cars in the comparable 1969 period. Eastern carloadings, declined 11.6% to 42,006 cars, while loadings west of the Lakehead rose 13.5% to 31,877.

Year-to-date loadings were up 6.2% to 3,718,386 cars from 3,500,678 in the same period of 1969. Western loadings advanced 10.4% to 1,467,713 while eastern loadings totalled 2,250,673, up 3.7%.

Railway Carloadings, November 1970 - Advance information

Loadings of revenue freight rose 6.1% to 318,168 carloads in November 1970 compared with 299,379 in November 1969. Total tonnage rose 3.9% to 17,599,739 tons. Tonnage received from United States connections was up 2.4% to 2,418,475 leaving total tonnage carried up 3.7% at 20,018,214 tons.

Major increases were reported in loadings of wheat, "other grain", coal and copper-nickel ores, while those of iron ore and passenger automobiles were significantly lower.

Loadings during the first eleven months of 1970 were 7.1% more in carloads and 13.3% more in tonnage. Total freight carried, including receipts from United States connections rose by 11.8% to 217,434,704 tons.

Railway Operating Statistics, September 1970 - Advance information Operating revenues of \$142,725,081 were reported by 24 common carrier railways in Canada for September 1970, an increase of 10.3% from September 1969. Net income rose 95.7% to \$12,033,607.

The amount of revenue freight carried rose 21.8% to 21,886,524 tons, and the number of passengers carried rose 8.9% to 2,142,755.

VITAL STATISTICS

Vital Statistics, November 1970 (84-001, 10c/\$1.00)

The 30,339 births registered in provincial offices during November brought the total number filed for the first eleven months of 1970 to 341,275, a decrease of 0.3% from the 342,395 registrations for the corresponding months of last year. The birth rate for November was 17.2 per 1,000 population.

A total of 16,971 marriages were filed in provincial offices in November giving a rate of 9.6 per 1,000 population. The total for the eleven months exceeded the corresponding period of 1969 by 2.6%.

During November there were 12,320 deaths registered in provincial offices giving a rate of 7.0 per 1,000 population. The total for the first eleven months was 1.4% higher than in the same months of 1969.

CHEQUES

Cheques Cashed in Clearing Centres, October 1970 (61-001, 20¢/\$2.00)

During October, \$72,907 million worths of cheques were cashed in 50 clearing centres in Canada: this was 11.6% more than in the same month of 1969. Payments advanced in Quebec by 16.9%, in Ontario by 14.0%, in the Prairie Provinces by 2.5% and in the Atlantic Provinces by less than 1%. In British Columbia, payments declined by 1.8%.

Thirty of the fifty centres reported a higher value of cheques cashed this October than last. Payments in Montreal rose by 16.4% and in Toronto by 16.7%, but declined in Winnipeg and Vancouver.

The value of cheques cashed in the first ten months of 1970 was 10.5% greater than for the same period of 1969. It increased in Ontario by 14.9%, in the Atlantic Provinces by 11.0%, in the Prairie Provinces by 10.3%, in Quebec by 5.3% and in British Columbia by 1.1%.

Statistical Report on the Operation of the Unemployment Insurance Act, October 1970 (73-001, 20¢/\$2.00)

In October, there were 142,000 claims filed for unemployment insurance. This was 21,000 (17%) more than in September and 18,000 (14%) more than in October 1969.

At 399,000, the number of people claiming benefit at the end of October was 8,000 (2%) more than at the end of September, and 119,000 (42%) more than at the end of October 1969.

Benefit payments totalled \$40.4 million in October, \$37.7 million in September and \$25.5 million in October 1969. The average weekly benefit payments for these 3 months were \$34.62, \$34.11 and \$32.52 respectively.

TOBACCO

Production and Disposition of Tobacco Products (Cigars), November 1970 - Advance information

Canadian manufacturers produced 63,422,000 cigars during November compared to 50,564,000 in November 1969. The opening inventory was 56,833,000 versus 63,026,000 last year, the closing inventory, 59,854,000 against 60,007,000, domestic sales, 60,135,000 up from 53,095,000, ex-warehoused for ships' stores and embassies, 172,000 versus 64,000 and ex-warehoused for export, 94,000 down from 424,000.

MERCHANDISING

Construction Machinery and Equipment Sales, 1969 - Advance information In 1969, \$557.8 million worth of new construction machinery and equipment was sold to end-users. This was 27% more than the \$439.9 million worth sold in 1967, the previous survey year. Sales of used machinery and equipment jumped to \$92.8 million from \$77.9 million; value of rentals to \$52.5 million from \$42.9 million.

For the first time, information is available on additional new equipment and machinery supplied to the end-users through such arrangements as first rental, demonstration or loan. This was valued at \$52.4 million in 1969.

Asphalt and Vinyl-Asbestos Floor Tile, November 1970 - Advance information

November production of viny1-asbestos floor tile came to 7,094 tons or 15,754,739 square feet compared to 6,244 tons or 13,366,977 square feet in 1969. For the year to date 1970, production totalled 67,943 tons (148,089,992 square feet), compared to 82,908 tons (178,523,608 square feet) in 1969.

Report on Fur Farms, 1969 - Advance information

The number of mink on fur farms declined from 641,857 on January 1, 1969 to 572,912 on December 31, 1969, a decrease of 11%. The number of milk pelts produced rose by 7% to 1,780,826 from 1,667,945 and the value of pelt production decreased by 18% to \$18,673,024 from \$22,689,586. The number of mink ranches declined by 13% to 996 from 1,147.

Mink is by farm the most important species raised on fur farms; chinchilla, fox and nutria are also raised but these account for only 1% of the total value of pelts produced.
