Farm Machinery and Equipment, 1971 Census of Agriculture (96-720, AA3,75¢)

Despite the 15.0% decline in the number of census-farms to 366,128 on June 1, 1971 from 430,522 on June 1, 1966, the market value of farm machinery and equipment, as reported by farm operators, continued to increase to \$3.9 billion from \$3.6 billion. Value per farm increased 29% to \$10,700 from \$8,300.

Vital Statistics, June 1972 (84-001, 10c/\$1)

There were 30,922 births registered in June, down from 32,477 a year earlier, bringing the birth rate down to 17.3 per 1,000 population from 18.4. June marriages increased to 18,480 from 17,343, the rate per 1,000 population increasing to 10.4 from 9.8.

Deaths decreased to 12,649 in June from 13,242 a year earlier, decreasing the rate to 7.1 per 1,000 population from 7.5.

Summary of Imports, June 1972 - Advance Information

The External Trade Division reports that, during June Canada's imports increased to a value of \$1,662 million from \$1,438 million a year earlier, and, \$1,308 million in the same month of 1970. Imports for the six months increased to \$9,186 million in 1972 versus \$7,532 million in 1971 and \$7,232 million in 1970.

Electric Power Statistics, June 1972 - Advance information.

In June 1972 net generation rose 11.7% to 18,333.7 million kwh. from 16,410.9 million kwh. a year earlier. There were increases in net generation in all provinces, but the Yukon showed a decrease of 1.5%. The largest increases were 110.5% in Newfoundland and 37.8% in New Brunswick. Hydro generation increased 11.3% while thermal production rose 13.4%.

June 1972 production of footwear of all types increased to 4,030,060 pairs from 3,897,846 in June 1971.

Steel Ingots, Week ended August 5, 1972 - Advance information.

Preliminary steel ingot production for the week ended August 5, totalled 224,669 tons, a decrease of 1.5% from the preceding week's total of 228,040. The comparable week's total in 1971 was 209,637 tons. The index of production based on the average weekly output during 1967 of 183,227 tons equalling 100 was 122.6 in the current week, 124.5 a week earlier and 114.4 one year ago.
