Atumobiles from overseas fell $15.2 \%$ to ;8,055 from 1977 and overseas-made commercial vehicles fell $12.7 \%$ to 1.439 Value of the cars rose $2.4 \%$ to $\$ 101.2$ million and the commercial vehicles held sleady at $\$ 8.1$ million Value of U.S. and Canadian cars sold rose $18.2 \%$ to $\$ 580.9$ million commercial vehicles rose $31.4 \%$ to $\$ 336.4$ million.

Sales value of all vehicles increased $20.2 \%$ to $\$ 1,026.7$ million. including 443 coaches and buses valued at $\$ 11.2$ million Seasonally-adjusted sales of automobiles manufactured in Canada and the U.S. rose $5.6 \%$ from May io 70.635 and those of cars from overseas fell $5.4 \%$ to 14,416 Seasonally adjusted sales of all commercial vehicles rose $2.8 \%$ to 32.968 .

## Industry Selling Price Index

The Industry Selling Price Index for manufacturing ( $1971=100$ ) rose $0.4 \%$ to 187.0 in June from its revised May level of 186.2. The index was $7.5 \%$ higher than in June 1977 when it stood at 173.9 .

The food and beverage major group index rose $0.8 \%$ in June, due largely to price increases of $1.8 \%$ for slaughtering and meat processors, $3.2 \%$ for poultry processors, $1.3 \%$ for bakeries, $0.7 \%$ for miscellaneous food processors (n.e.s.) and 1.5\% for soft drink manufacturers. The primary metal major group index registered an increase of $0.9 \%$ due mainly to increases of $1.4 \%$ for smelting and refining, $0.4 \%$ for iron and steel mills and $1.5 \%$ for aluminum rolling. casting and extruding.

## Highway Construction Price Indexes

The Canada total index $(1971=100)$ at March 31, 1978 reached 198.2, an increase of $7.1 \%$ from a year earlier. Prices for new highway construction rose in all provinces over the 12 -month period, ranging from an increase of $1.0 \%$ in British Columbia to a high of $14.5 \%$ in Newfoundland.

## Import, Export/Price, Volume Indexes

Mays current-weighted import price index increased $1.7 \%$ but the fixed-weighted index declined almost $1 \%$. Currentweighted and fixed-weighted export price indexes fell slightly. Since December the fixed-weighted import price index has risen $4.9 \%$ and the export price index $4.2 \%$.

Seasonally-adjusted volumes of both imports and exports declined from high April levels. May import volume is about $1 \%$ higher than the first quarter average but export volume is nearly $4 \%$ lower than the first quarter

## The Labour Force

Canada's seasonally-adjusted unemployment rate edged down to $8.4 \%$ in July from $8.6 \%$ in June. The July 1977 rate, $8.2 \%$.

Last month the employment level reached $10,132.000$, up 62.000 from June. Unemployment decreased by 17,000 is 927.000 persons. The seasonally-adjustec participation rate rose to $62.8 \%$ trom $62.6 \%$.

Seasonally-adjusted July unemployment rates for the provinces, June rates in brackets: Newfoundland $16.7 \%$ (17.3\%): Prince Edward Island 9.1\% (9.7\%); Nova Scotia 10.9\% (10.7\%); New Brunswick 12.9\% (11.6\%); Quebec 10.5\% (11.4\%); Ontario $7.3 \%$ ( $7.4 \%$ ); Maniloba 6.7\% (6.6\%); Saskatchewan 3.9\% (5.0\%); Alberta 4.8\% (4.7\%), and British Columbia 7.7\% (7.8\%).

Unadjusted the July labour force was $11,570,000$ with $10,644,000$ employed and 927.000 unemployed for an unemployment rate of $8.0 \%$. In June, the labour force was $11,304,000$ with 10,400,000 employed and 903.000 unemployed for a rate of $8.0 \%$. In July 1977, the labour force numbered $11,100,000$ with $10,222,000$ employed and 878.000 unemployed for a rate of $7.9 \%$.

## Unemployment insurance Statistics

For the week of May 14848.000 claimants received unemployment insurance bene. fits. down 11\% from April but up 15\% froms year earlier. (Forty percent of the beneficitries were female compared with $42 \%$ in 1977.) Benefits totaled $\$ 453$ million, up 4\% from April and 25\% from a year earlien. Payments to date amount to $\$ 2,335$ million. up $21 \%$ from January-May 1977 Quebec and Ontario received $62 \%$ of total benefits. the Atlantic provinces 18\%, British Columbia 11\% and Prairie provinces 9\%

Claims submitted during May: 215,000, a drop of $1 \%$ from April but $7 \%$ more than 1977. Year to date: $1,150.000$ claims compared with $1,078.000$ in 1977. a rise of $7 \%$ All provinces recorded increases of at least $5 \%$

## Iron Ore

Canadian mines shipped 2.354,200 short tons of iron ore in June ( $6,645,918$ a year earlier). Year-to-date shipments fell to $11.060,626$ short tons in 1978 from 22,222.413 in 1977.

Radio and TV Broadcasting, 1977
Privately-owned radio broadcasting revenues for the year ended August 31. 1977 whe up $11 \%$ from the previous year to $\$ 272$ million. Programming, technical, sales and administrative expenses rose $14 \%$ to $\$ 226$ million. depreciation was $\$ 8$ million and inierest expense was $\$ 6$ million; other adjustments produced revenues of $\$ 4$ million. Net profit before tax was $\$ 36$ million, unchanged from the previous year

Television broadcasting revenues increased $17 \%$ to $\$ 331$ million. Programming. lechnical. sales and administrative expenses rose $21 \%$ to $\$ 255$ million, depreciation was \$14 million and interes! expense $\$ 8$ million: other adjustments produced income of $\$ 7$ million. Net profit betore tax was estimated at $\$ 61$ million, an increase of $3 \%$

In addition. CBC operations produced revenues from sale of air-time of $\$ 66$ million, up from $\$ 59$ million. The net cost of operating the CBC was $\$ 397$ miltion compared to $\$ 334$ million for the previous period.

Cable television revenues for the year ondect August 31. 1977 were $\$ 233$ million, ip 17\% from $\$ 199$ million the previous year. Programming, lechnical, sales and administrative expenses increased $18 \%$ to $\$ 127$ miltion from $\$ 108$ million. Depreciation was estitiated at $\$ 43$ million and interest expense at $\$ 20$ million, other income was $\$ 2$ mittion, leaving a protit before income tax of $\$ 45$ million compared to $\$ 36$ million the previous year. a $25 \%$ increase

## International Travel

June saw 3.7 million United States visitors, up $4.2 \%$ from 1977. Visitors from elsewhere rose $14.1 \%$ to 231,000 . Canadian residents relurning from the U.S. almost equalled June 1977's 3.3 million but residents returning from other countries fell $1.1 \%$ to 121.500 .

Over six months U.S. visitors fell $1.1 \%$ to 123 million against 1977 and 17 million Canadian residents relurned from the U.S., down $1.8 \%$. Visitors from countries other than the U.S rose $11.5 \%$ to 590,000 and 956,100 residents returned from these countries, up $3.7 \%$.
