Horses in British Columbia
There were 57.167 horses in British Columbia at the census of 1931. That wa a decrease of nearly 7 per oent from 1921. The average value of all classes of horses was a little over $\$ 55$, a decrease of almost 47 per cent.

## How Canada's Trade in April was Proportioned

The proportion of Canada's domestic exports which went to the United Kingdom in April was 29.9 per oent and to the British Empire 39.4, whilst to the United States the proportion was 41.7, and to all foreign countries 60.6. Imports from Great Britain were 26.2 per cent of the whole and from the British Enpire 32, while from the United States the proportion was 57.6, and from all foreign countries 68.

These proportions are at variance with the general oxperience during the twolve months ending April for tho exports to Groat Britain were 39 per oent of the whole and to the British Empire 47.3, while to the United Statos the proportion was 29.8 per oent, and to all foreign oountries 52.7. The imports from Great Britain were 21.8 per oont, from hapire countries 30.3, from United States 56.6 and from all foroign countries 69.7.

## Export Clearanoos of Wheat

Export olearanoes of wheat for tho woek ending June 2 were as follows, the figures In brackets being those of a year ago: Montreal 1,381,668 (2,711,480), Vanocuver 1,039,477 ( $1,369,793$ ), United States Atlantic seaboard ports 1, 214,000 (542,000), Victoria 681,031 (nil), Sorel 574,328 ( 549,933 ). Sueboc 218,000 (ní), Total 5,108,504 $(5,173,206)$. Forty-four weoks ending Juno 2: Vancouver $85,356,277(65,383,577)$, Montreal $55,634,419(39,180,525)$, United States ports $24,072,000(28,031,000)$. Sorel $15,234,212(5,574,055)$, Saint John 6,864, $873(2,017,008)$, Suebec 3,754,759 (120,248), Churohil1 2,736,030 (544,769), Victoria 1,847,752 (nil), Halifax 1,655,901 (45,189), Prinoe Rupert 677,813 (nil), Total 197,834,036 (140,896,371).

Nore Religioua Publications Now Coming from U.S.
A change has oome over the importation of bibles, prayer books, hymn books, religious tracts and Sunday School lessons. Prior to this year the majority como fram Great Britain, but during the past twolve months the quantity from the Unibed States was valued at $\$ 141,498$ and from the Unitod Kingdom $\$ 130,457$.

## Reading of British Magazines and Newspapers Increasing

There has beon a large increase in tho reading of British newspapers and magazines by Canadians in the past year. During the twelve months ending April the amount imported was valued at $\$ 130,457$ compared with $\$ 82,332$ in the provious twelvo months. Thero has been a large deorease in the number imported from the Unitod States, fram $\$ 2,866,729$ to $\$ 1,601,182$, but that statoment should bo qualified because, it is understood, there are United States magazines now being printed in Canada which were formerly imported.

## Foeding Wheat on the Farm

As in the two previous year, the Dominion. Bureau of Statistics oonducted a preliminary investigation at the end of March to determine the trend of wheat-feeding on rarms. The porcontage fod in 1932-33 shows a slight increase over that of 1931-32, being 8.5 compared with 8.2 last yoar. The larger crop of 1932 results in an estimate of $36,542,000$ bushols fed, compared with only $26,502,000$ bushels from the smaller orop of 1931.

More Text Books from United States
Imported text books come mostly Iram the United States. During the twelve monthe ending April the value of the text books imported from the United States was $\mathbf{8 5 2 6 , 8 2 2}$ and from the United Kingdom $\$ 458,280$.

## Wholesale Prices Higher in May

The Dominion Buroau of Statistios indox number of wholesalo prioes on the base 1926 $=100$, advancod fram 65.4 in April to 66.9 in May. 149 quotations wore higher, 64 were lower, while 289 remained unchanged.

## Increase in Rotail Sales

The Dominion Bureau of Statistics index number of rotall salos rose from 72.8 in Maroh to 83.8 in April. The numbers are based on returns from 2,700 stores and 25 departmental stores. There were increased sales by boot and shoe stores, clothing, furniture, hardware, dyers and cloanors, general and departmental and candy. Drugs, groceries, meats, music, radio and rostaurant sales doclined.

## Canada Imports Doors

One of the unexpected things found in trade figures is the importation of doors on a largo soalo. During the ifiscal year 1931-2 we imported 51,395 doors from the United States. In 1932.3 we imported 5,101 from the United Statos and 4 from Great Britain. The four from the United Kingdom woro valued at $\$ 397$ and those from the United States at $\$ 11,257$.

Proportions of the 1932 Crope Unmerchantable
Of tho total estimated whoat crop of 1932, viz. $428,514,000$ bushols, 0.5 per oont or $2,108,000$ bushols is reported by crop correspondents as having provod of unmerchantable quality, as comparod with 0.9 per cont or $2,826,100$ bushols for the provious year. of the romaining orops, the quantitios in bushels and the proportions not merchantable are as follows, with last ycar's figuros in brackets: Oats 2.1 per cent ar 8,045,000 ( 2.5 per cont or $8,044,000$ ) ; barley 0.9 per cent or 730,900 ( 1.0 por cent or 699,200 ); rye 0.5 por cont or 45,200 ( 0.9 por cent or 49,500) ; flaxseod 1.3 per cent or 32,000 (2.5 por cont or 65,300 ): buokwhoat 2.5 por cent or 206,600 ( 5.9 per cont or 392,800 ); corn for husking 2.1 per cent or 106,000 ( 1.1 per cont or 62,000 ) ; potatoes 9.1 por oent or $3,581,000 \mathrm{cwt}$. ( 10.8 per cent or $5,634,000 \mathrm{cwt}$.) ; turnips, ote. 5.7 per cent or $2,161,000 \mathrm{cwt}$. (7.2 per cent or 2,112,400 cwt.): hay and clover 3.7 por cont or 502,000 tons ( 3.1 per cent or 432,100 tons.).

## Great Increase in May Export of wheat

Canadian exports of whoat and wheat fl our in May exceoded that of May last year by over six and a third million bushels and by three and a half million dollars in valuo. Exports of wheat for May amounted to $21,464,848$ bushels, valued at $\$ 13,064,991$ as comparod with $15,543,013$ bushels valued at $\$ 9,626,965$ in May, 1932. Exports of wheat flour also incroased from 461,867 barrols to 565,080 barrels in volume and from $\$ 1,647,616$ to $\$ 1,735,078$ in volue. This was equivalent to $2,542,860$ bushels in May as compared with $2,078,401$ bushels, making the total whont export to tho oquivalent of 24,007,708 bushels, an increase of $6,386,294$ bushels.
