

## Financial Activity in Canada Second Quarter 1982

### Overview

Demand for funds remained weak in the second quarter of 1982. Non-financial domestic sectors of the Canadian economy raised \$9083 million on conventional credit markets, representing 10.8% of Gross National Expenditure. This compared with \$8217 million so raised in the previous quarter, at 10.2%, the lowest proportion of GNE on record, but was down considerably from the second quarter of 1981 when \$22,968 million or 28.7% of GNE, was raised.

General government were the major borrowers of these funds in the second quarter, raising \$5803 million or about two thirds of the total. Non-financial private corporations' demand for funds continued to fall: they raised \$4009 million in the second quarter, down from \$5718 million in the previous quarter, and barely one third of the funds so raised in the equivalent period of 1981. The personal sector's liabilities in these instruments fell by \$1917 million. Non-residents, the near banks and trustee pension plans were the major suppliers of funds, while the chartered banks reduced their assets.

Bonds accounted for 41% of these funds, reflecting the increased relative importance of government borrowing; these latter accounted for almost two thirds of net new bond issues. Loans from sources other than the chartered banks accounted for 20% of these funds, with stocks (11%), Government of Canada Treasury bills (8%), other short-term paper (10%) and mortgages (9%) accounting for the balance.

Among factors affecting financial activity in the second quarter were: the continuing recession; the restrictive nature of the Bank of Canada's monetary policy, and the high domestic inflation and financing costs associated with it; a sharp depreciation in the external value of the Canadian dollar; low capacity utilisation ratios; poor corporate profits; lacklustre gross fixed capital formation; a substantial decline in inventory levels; and a swing of nearly \$5 billion in the provincial governments' financing requirement, to become large net borrowers.

### Economic Activity

Gross National Expenditure, in constant dollars, fell 2.1% (seasonally adjusted) from the first quarter, extending the recession to four consecutive quarters, and bringing the drop to 6.2% in real economic activity since the last peak in economic activity reached in the second quarter of 1981. Unemployment reached a post-Depression high of 10.9% (seasonally adjusted) in June. Housing starts for the quarter averaged 117,000 (seasonally adjusted at annual rate), little more than half of the equivalent figure of 216,000 in the same period in 1981.

The weak economy, very low capacity utilisation ratios and very depressed corporate profits, combined to reduce gross fixed capital formation in volume. Seasonally adjusted, total capital expenditures fell 7.2% in real terms. For non-financial private corporations the actual expenditures amounted to \$9037 million. While this represented a small increase from the first quarter — when the weather reduced activity — it was down almost 20% (in current dollars) from the same period the year earlier. Those industries showing an increase in their fixed capital formation were: metal mining, mineral fuels, primary metals, paper, petroleum and coal, pipelines, communications and transportation. Coupled with a drop in inventories of a record \$3414 million, internally generated funds accounted for virtually all the financing required for the acquisition of non-financial capital. The inventory reduction was largely concentrated in the manufacturing sector.

Expenditures by persons in real terms, declined in the second quarter but rose to \$51212 million in current dollars (not seasonally adjusted). Of the latter figure, expenditures on durables — prompted by rebate programs for automobiles — amounted to \$6866 million, up from \$5127 million in the previous quarter, but remained below the \$7325 million in the second quarter of 1981. The overall weakness of consumer expenditures was reflected in the amount of consumer credit demanded: in a quarter normally showing the

largest growth of the year, there was a very small increase of \$11 million. This followed a drop of \$645 million in the first quarter, while in the second quarter of 1981, consumer credit outstanding had risen \$2020 million. In contrast, the personal saving rate remained very high at 12.1% (seasonally adjusted); however, a significant proportion of these funds are not readily accessible — notably, in the form of accrued interest in trustee pension plans, registered retirement savings plans, and life insurance policies.

The recession had a marked impact on all levels of general government. Expenditures were higher and receipts lower. While the federal government's financing requirement increased some \$737 million, to \$5891 million, from the first quarter, it was almost three times the requirement in the same period of 1981. The provincial governments' net lending of \$3215 million in the first quarter swung to a net borrowing requirement of \$1535 million in the second quarter. As a result, all general government combined to produce a net borrowing requirement of \$5823 million, or 6.9% of GNE, in the second quarter, bringing the total for the half year to \$7797 million, or 4.7% of GNE. The comparable figures for 1981 are 1.1% in the second quarter and 0.9% for the half year. During the last recession, from October 1979 to June 1980, this combined financing requirement amounted to 2.0% of GNE.

### Capital Market Developments

With domestic inflationary pressures responding only very slowly to the recession, the Bank of Canada retained a tight monetary policy, with foreign exchange considerations becoming a major concern in the latter part of the quarter.

In April, the Bank reduced its holdings of Government of Canada securities by almost \$1 billion, of which \$587 million were in Treasury bills and the balance in bonds with terms to maturity of under three years. Those sales had the effect of preventing a larger drop in short-term interest rates than might otherwise have occurred. Yields on 30-day bankers' acceptances fell about 45 basis points, while those on longer dated bonds fell on the same order. In May, with interest rates on short-term instruments moving up again, the Bank increased its holdings of Treasury bills and short-term bonds to prevent too sharp a rise.

The Bank's intervention in the market was also related to considerations regarding the external value of the Canadian dollar, but these concerns became acute in June. With interest rates in the United States rising throughout the month, substantial downward pressure was exerted on the Canadian dollar. To limit the extent of drop and its associated inflationary consequences, the Bank allowed interest rates to rise. The Bank rate rose 126 basis points and the chartered banks increased their prime rate by 125 basis points, to 18.25%, after it had remained at 17% since late March. Yields on other short-term instruments also rose, but less steeply, and fell in late June, encouraging borrowers to substitute for bank loans. Yields on longer

dated instruments also rose, though inversely to the period to maturity.

The downward pressure on the Canadian dollar for most of the quarter prompted the federal government to undertake considerable borrowings in foreign currencies to augment Canada's international reserves. U.S. \$900 million was borrowed from Canadian chartered banks, U.S. \$1500 million was drawn from the line of credit with non-resident banks, and U.S. \$750 million was raised on the Eurodollar bond market. In addition, DM 200 million was borrowed on the German bond market to partly refinance the DM 400 million loan that had been borrowed originally in 1978, and became due in April. Despite these foreign currencies borrowings, Canada's international reserves fell \$27 million in the quarter. The dollar closed at 77.48 cents U.S., down from 81.49 cents U.S. at the end of March, but up from the record low of 76.80 cents U.S. reached on June 22nd.

In recent quarters, the Bank's concern for the Canadian dollar's value, vis-à-vis its United States counterpart, appears to have resulted in relatively less importance being paid to monetary aggregate targetting. June marked the eleventh consecutive month that M1 had remained below its target range. It had been moving upward in April and May, but the increase in interest rates in June led to a downturn.

However, factors other than the external value of the Canadian dollar also appear to have been taken into consideration. Among these is the increase in money velocity — at least for M1 — which is related to reduced balances the public holds in currency and demand deposits. Part of this development is a result of the growth of daily interest chequing and savings accounts, which are not included in M1. In addition, the very policy instrument designed to restrict the growth of M1 — high interest rates — has been conducive to a stronger growth of the broader monetary aggregates. Because of the greater opportunity cost of maintaining idle cash balances, the public has been reluctant to leave funds in demand deposits, earning no interest. As a result, deposits in the broader aggregates have been used increasingly for transaction purposes, undermining the formerly stable relationship between M1 and nominal Gross National Expenditure.

The weakening economy, poor profit performances, weak balance sheets and high yields on debt instruments were factors contributing to further declines in the prices of stocks in Canada. The Toronto Stock Exchange Composite Index of 300 Stocks fell 14%, closing at 1366.80, slightly above the closing low for the quarter, 1355.72, recorded on June 21st. For the second quarter running, all of the fourteen major industry indices fell.

Of the more heavily traded industries, financial services (-20%), industrial products (-18%), banks (-15%), utilities (-7%) and oil and gas (-7%) fell the most. In this environment, new equity issues amounted to only \$1328 million, a slight rise from \$1288 million in the previous quarter, but down sharply from \$2297 million

in the second quarter of 1981. Virtually all of the flow for the period under review was attributable to non-financial private corporations, with the pipeline industry accounting for the largest share.

Net new issues of marketable bonds amounted to \$4999 million, compared with \$5791 million in the previous quarter and \$4573 million in the second quarter of the year earlier. The Government of Canada (\$1011 million) and the provincial governments (\$1047 million) were the major issuers. Non-residents were the principal purchasers, acquiring 53% of the net new marketable issues. Of the total gross marketable issues by the federal and provincial governments, almost 70% had terms to maturity of five years or under, while only 13% had terms longer than ten years. None was dated longer than twenty years. On the other hand, for the first quarter since the third quarter of 1980, the Government of Canada did not issue any extendible bonds at the holder's option.

Net new bank loans fell \$1117 million, following a drop of \$565 million in the previous quarter. These declines were a stark contrast with the rapid build-up of bank loans the year earlier: in the equivalent period of 1981, bank loans increased \$11584 million. The drop in this instrument in the second quarter of 1982 reflected the reduction of the large banks' lending in Canadian dollars; their loans in foreign currency rose, however. The Schedule B banks continued to extend new loans in both Canadian and foreign currencies.

Net new mortgage loans were \$872 million, the smallest increase since the first quarter of 1972. Persons and

unincorporated businesses borrowed \$345 million in net new funds, their lowest quarterly flow since the first quarter of 1971. Non-financial private corporations borrowed \$515 million in net new mortgage funds, principally in the real estate industries. The chartered banks continued to reduce their mortgage loan portfolio, transferring the business to their mortgage loan subsidiaries. The slow growth in the mortgage market reflected both the weak housing market and substantial payments by borrowers when renewing existing mortgages.

The Government of Canada's Treasury bill liability increased \$775 million bringing the level to \$20150 million, but it remained below the peak of \$22920 million reached in October 1981, just prior to the very successful Canada Savings Bond campaign.

Short-term paper outstanding rose \$1419 million in the second quarter, compared with increases of \$630 million in the first quarter and \$1652 million in the second quarter of 1981. Non-financial private corporations were the major issuers, selling \$1036 million. The banks (\$514 million) and the near banks (\$942 million) were the principal purchasers. During April and May, the yield on 30-day bankers' acceptances remained between 110 and 160 basis points below the prime rate. However, the increase in interest rates in June lowered the differential to under 50 basis points for a short period, but by the end of the month it had widened to about 175 basis points. This differential may have been sufficient to prompt substitution for short-term bank loans.

### Total Borrowing by Domestic Non-financial Sectors as a Percentage of Gross National Product



### Selected Canadian Interest Rates




(Seasonally Adjusted)
















## Gross Domestic Product by Industry, Quarterly, in 1971 Constant Prices














## Employment Indexes, 1961=100
