## PUBLICATIONS OF THE DOMINION BUREAU OF STATISTICS

T1a Dominion Bureau of Statistics was set up by statute in 1918 as a central similasioal department for Canada (8-9 Geo. V, c. 43).* The Act was a consolidation oi all previous statistical legislation and was based on the report of a Commission 01 Statistics, appointed in 1912, which recommended (1) a series of specific reforms and enlargements in Canadian statistics, and (2) a policy of statistical co-ordination for the Domininn, under central direction. In 1915, following the recommendations in this report, the office of Dominion Statistician was created lout it was not until 1918 that the recommendations of the Commission werte cmbotien in Fegishation.

The Dominion IBureau of Statisties is the largest publishing department of the Dominion Goverment: the subjects of its reports cover all phases of the national economy. Items in the vote of the Burcau, passed by Parliament each year, provide limited funds for the printing and processing of reports mud bulletins. Reports printed from type are set up by the King's I'rinter, but the bureau itself operates its own offeet printing presses and ull processed reports and bulletins arr completely printed as well as published by the Bureau of statistics.

The present policy with regard to the distribution of pubtications is bused on sales to the public at actual cost of paper and presswork only; compilation, celiting and other overhead eosts are not included. The object is to extend the serviec to the public as widely us possible and so spread the complation and overhead, which are the big items in total costs. A special subseription rate: of $\$ 30$ per year entitles the sulseriber to receive a copy of each publication as issued, with the execpition of news bulletins. Other special rates are set for series of publicatious in related groups; these are referred to in the respective seetions of the list below.
