# CURRENT PUBLICATIONS

## 1956

### Functions of the Bureau

The Dominion Bureau of Statistics was established under the Statistics Act of 1918 to form a central statistical department. It now operates under the Statistics Act of 1948 (revised in 1953) which defines its duties as follows:

- (a) to collect, compile, analyse, abstract and publish statistical information relative to the commercial, industrial, financial, social, economic and general activities and conditions of the people;
- (b) to collaborate with all other departments of the government in the collection, compilation and publication of statistical records of administration according to any regulations;
- (c) to take the census of Canada as provided in this Act; and
- (d) generally to organize a scheme of co-ordinated social and economic statistics pertaining to the whole of Canada and to each of the provinces thereof.

### Organization

The Bureau is organized in fourteen functional divisions, comprising an Administration Division, Mechanical Tabulation Division, eleven statistical or subject divisions and an Information Services Division. The latter twelve—most of which have two or more sections—are responsible for the preparation of the publications shown in this list. The names of these divisions and of their sections are as follows:

**Distribution of Publications**

The distribution of Bureau publications is based on the policy of sales to the public at cost of paper and presswork only. The aim is to make the information as widely available as possible, and so costs of compilation are not included in the prices. At the same time a charge is made to avoid the danger of waste in free distribution.

**Classification of Publications**

For further purposes of economy and efficiency in distribution, Bureau publications are divided into three classifications:

- (a) regular periodical reports;
- (b) periodical reports of more limited interest called Memoranda and designated by the abbreviation "M" in the list;
- (c) reports or releases on results of special studies called Reference Papers and designated by "R" in the list.

**Abbreviations**

The following abbreviations are used in describing the titles:

Bil. — Bilingual.

E & F. — Separate English and French editions.

M. — Memorandum.

R. — Reference Paper.

## Placing Orders

Subscription orders for weekly, monthly quarterly and other periodical reports should be addressed to the **Information Services Division, Dominion Bureau of Statistics, Ottawa.**

Orders for single copies of such periodical reports and for annual and other regular reports may be addressed either to the **Information Services Division, Dominion Bureau of Statistics,** or to the **Queen's Printer, Ottawa.**

Titles of publications—shown in this list in black face—should be stated carefully when ordering, owing to numerous similarities. In the case of orders addressed to the **Information Services Division, Dominion Bureau of Statistics,** the numbers opposite titles in this list may be used. In the case of orders for single copies of publications, the date of issue wanted should be definitely stated, if known.

The back pages of this catalogue contain an index designed to assist persons seeking information on a particular subject in determining the Bureau publication in which it may be found. In cases where study of this index is inconclusive, Bureau officials are always ready to assist in selecting the publication or to advise if the information is not available, if provided with a clear statement of what is wanted.

## Payment for Publications

Regulations require payment to be made in advance of the start of subscriptions for periodicals or delivery of other orders. Those ordering publications are urged to include remittance with their orders and thus save the time and labour used in the process of billing and returning payment.

To avoid sending small individual remittances—or awaiting quotations when the publications required are unknown—those expecting to purchase publications frequently may open a deposit account with the **Queen's Printer.** Arrangements and remittance for this purpose may be made through the **Information Services Division, Dominion Bureau of Statistics,** or directly with the **Queen's Printer.** Deposits of \$10.00 or more are accepted against which orders may be placed. Orders addressed either to the **Dominion Bureau of Statistics** or the **Queen's Printer** are charged to the account and regular statements supplied.

Remittances should be in the form of cheque or money order made payable to the **Receiver General of Canada.** Bank exchange fee is not necessary. Postage stamps and currency should not be used; apart from postal regulations, no record exists if remittance in this form is lost or inadvertently omitted.

The former practice of allowing discounts on orders of varying value has been discontinued. Charges for publications are now made on the basis of the sum of the listed prices, with one exception. A discount of 25% is allowed on bulk orders of 100 or more copies of an individual publication, but such orders should be placed in advance of its printing when possible.

## Index

Appended to this list of current Bureau publications is a subject and commodity index to their contents. It is designed to serve two purposes: to provide a guide for those using this list in selecting the publication or publications containing the particular information they want; and to assist those keeping files of Bureau publications in locating particular items. It is suggested that the latter keep the list with the index on hand for this purpose.

The index contains upwards of 4,000 entries arranged in alphabetical order, and about four times as many references and cross-references to publications. The latter are indicated concisely by use of the numbers opposite titles in the left-hand column of the list. The number of entries, of course, represents only a part of the great number of subjects and commodities on which the Bureau publishes information; but it is sufficiently large and representative to afford a generally reliable indication to the location also of many items for which there is no entry.

## GENERAL

**Canada Year Book, E & F. Annual.** \$4.00 cloth bound; \$2.00 paper bound. The official statistical annual of the physiography, resources, history, institutions, and social and economic conditions of the country. Over 1,200 pages. Usually ready for release in May or early June.

**Canadian Statistical Review, E & F. Monthly.** \$3.00 a year; single copies 35¢. Statistical summary of current economic conditions in Canada. Contains numerous tables, charts, monthly review in text, special articles. 76 pages. Subscribers receive weekly statistical supplement.

**Canadian Statistical Review, Supplement to, E & F. Biennial.** 75¢. Issued free to regular subscribers to the **Canadian Statistical Review**. Presents the annual record of all statistical series carried in the regular monthly issues of the CSR from 1926, or the earliest year for which data are available, to the last complete year. In addition, monthly data are shown for the last three complete years.

**D.B.S. Daily Bulletin, E & F.** \$1.00 a year. Contains news summaries or announcements of each day's issues of Bureau reports, memoranda or reference papers and other Bureau releases, and a list of titles of the publications released. Designed to serve those who want to be closely informed on the full range of information issued by the Bureau.

**D.B.S. Weekly Bulletin.** \$1.00 a year. Contains news summaries and announcements, similar to the **Daily Bulletin**, covering each week's issues of Bureau reports, memoranda or reference papers and of other Bureau releases, and a list of titles of the publications released; with the addition of a highlights summary.

**Report of the Dominion Bureau of Statistics, Annual.** 40¢. Contains the report of the Dominion Statistician on the activities of the Dominion Bureau of Statistics for the fiscal year, followed by a detailed review of the work of the divisions and sections. Includes an organization chart of the Bureau.

## INDEX TO CURRENT BUREAU PUBLICATIONS

This index is designed to show in which Bureau publication or publications in the foregoing list information on certain subjects or commodities is to be found. It is intended equally as an aid in the selection and ordering of Bureau publications and as an aid for those who maintain files of Bureau publications in locating all the information on specific subjects and commodities. In this latter purpose it answers, at least in part, a request made by some of the larger users of Bureau publications.

The index contains upwards of 4,000 entries, and these—reflecting the many kinds of information on many items—include more than 16,000 references to publications. The Bureau's current publications, of course, cover many more items than indexed here. Specific references to the numerous individual import and export commodities, for instance, are not included, since these are readily found in the various foreign trade publications. In the case of other omissions, the entries for related items usually afford a clue to where the information on them, if available, may be found. Where this procedure fails or there is uncertainty, an enquiry should be sent to the Bureau.

Commodities and subjects are listed alphabetically in the index and the accompanying numbers indicate the publications that contain informations, specified or otherwise, on the commodity or subject. These numbers correspond with those preceding the titles in the foregoing list. For example, the entry for "adding machine paper" is accompanied by the numbers "169, 357, 358." By reference to the list it will be found that the publications indicated are—
