PREFACE

This second edition of the annotated Catalogue of Current Publications of the Dominion Bureau of Statistics published in October 1960 brings up-to-date the listings which appeared in the first edition published January 1959. A consolidated list of new titles published between January 1959 and October 1960 appears on page xix. It is expected that the next issue will be available towards the end of 1961.

The section on Organization on page vii has been enlarged to include names and telephone numbers for the convenience of those who may wish to get in touch with particular officers. Another new feature of this issue is the alphabetical index of titles which starts on page 127. It is hoped that the title, subject and commodity indexes will simplify the location of particular statistics and publications which contain them. All indexed items refer the reader to appropriate catalogue number or numbers which should be used when placing orders. Tear-out order forms are included at the back of this catalogue.

As some publications now out-of-print or superseded by later editions are of continued interest to the researcher their titles have been retained with the appropriate notations added. Please do not apply to the Queen's Printer for those publications which are indicated as being out-of-print but refer to them at the nearest depository library of Canadian Government publications or at the Library, Dominion Bureau of Statistics.

INTRODUCTION

The Dominion Bureau of Statistics is a centralized national statistical organization and as such collects, compiles and publishes statistical data relating to a wide range and variety of the economic and social activities and conditions of the Canadian people.

Functions of the Bureau

The Dominion Bureau of Statistics was established in 1918 under the *Statistics Act* (S.C., 1918, c. 43) to form a central statistical department. It now operates under the *Statistics Act of 1948* (R.S.C., 1952, c. 257, amended by S.C., 1952/53, c. 18), which defines its duties as follows:

- (a) to collect, compile, analyse, abstract and publish statistical information relative to the commercial, industrial, financial, social, economic and general activities and conditions of the people;
- (b) to collaborate with all other departments of the government in the collection, compilation and publication of statistical records of administration according to any regulations;
- (c) to take the census of Canada as provided in this Act; and
- (d) generally to organize a scheme of co-ordinated social and economic statistics pertaining to the whole of Canada and to each of the provinces thereof.

Organization and Telephone Directory

The Dominion Bureau of Statistics is organized in fifteen functional divisions. These comprise an Administration Division, Mechanical Tabulation Division, Information Services Division, and twelve statistical or subject matter divisions. The twelve statistical divisions—each of which consists of two or more sections—and the Information Services Division are responsible for the preparation of the publications shown in this list. The names of these divisions and sections indicate the range of statistical information available from the Bureau.

The following directory is designed to facilitate contact by users of DBS material with Bureau officers. General enquiries should be directed to the **Information Services Division**, while requests for copies of specific publications should be directed to Publications Distribution. Enquiries concerning the details about particular statistics should be directed to the appropriate division.

Persons telephoning from points outside Ottawa should first call CE2-8211 and then ask for the local number wanted. Those calling from Ottawa should dial "9" followed by the local number.

Publications

The Bureau's publication program is designed to make its statistical information readily available in the form in which it is most frequently wanted. The list of current publications contains approximately 500 titles and all are available for purchase except where as indicated, they are out-of-print. Their distribution is based on the policy of sale at cost of printing; costs of compilation are not included in the prices.

It is obviously impossible to publish compilations of statistics that will serve every purpose or need, and the Bureau is always ready to meet requests for statistical information not contained in any of its publications by the supply of available data from its files. A charge based on the clerical time involved is made for this service when it requires more than brief research and compilation.

SYSTEM OF CLASSIFICATION AND LISTING.—In 1959 the Dominion Bureau of Statistics inaugurated a new system of cataloguing its publications. With the adoption of this system, each publication now has its catalogue number printed on the cover as a means of identification additional to the title. All catalogue numbers consist of five digits. This use of catalogue numbers on the publications is in line with suggestions made to the Bureau by various larger users of Bureau publications; for these and others it should facilitate and simplify both the ordering and the filing of Bureau publications.

Under the new grouping arrangement, all Bureau publications are classified into nine main subject groups, which are numbered 1 to 9. These main subject groups are broken down again into specific sub-groups, which are numbered from 1 to 9, as required. The main subject groups and sub-groups account in this way for the first two digits of each catalogue number. The remaining three digits are used to designate periodicity of publication and are allotted as follows: 001 to 199,

periodicals (issued more than once a year); 201 to 399, annuals; 401 to 499, biennials; 501 to 999, occasional issues (reference papers, special reports, etc.). Publications within these number ranges are listed approximately in alphabetical order of titles, although this order can not always be maintained for new titles subsequently added.

The main features of the new grouping arrangement including code number of main subject groups and specific sub-groups are shown in the table of contents. The groupings, it should be observed, do not coincide with the Bureau's divisional organization and division titles are of no assistance in ordering or cataloguing DBS publications, although they are, of course, in directing inquiries concerning the content of publications.

INDEX TO CONTENTS OF PUBLICATIONS.—Appended to this list of current Bureau publications is a subject and commodity index to their contents. It is designed to provide a guide in the selection of the publication or publications containing statistics on a given subject or commodity.

The index contains several thousand entries arranged in alphabetical order, with corresponding catalogue numbers. The number of entries, of course, represents only a part of the great number of subjects and commodities on which the Bureau publishes information.

TITLE INDEX.—Also appended to this list of publications is an alphabetical list of titles with the appropriate catalogue numbers. This index will further facilitate the location of DBS publications in any collection filed by catalogue number.

SELECTING AND ORDERING PUBLICATIONS

The descriptive notes given with each title or group of titles listed are intended to serve only as a guide to their contents. They should be sufficient, in most cases, to help in selection of publications for any specific purpose. If in doubt, contact the **Information Services Division, Dominion Bureau of Statistics, Ottawa** or your nearest DBS Regional Office (see list page x), stating your requirements as precisely as possible.

HOW TO ORDER.—When ordering, catalogue numbers and titles of publications should be quoted.

Subscription orders for weekly, monthly, quarterly and annual reports should be sent to **Publications Distribution, Dominion Bureau of Statistics, Ottawa**.

Orders for single copies of periodical reports and for other regular and special reports may be sent either to **Publications Distribution, Dominion Bureau of Statistics**, or to the **Queen's Printer, Ottawa**. Such orders should state the date (month, year, etc.) of the issue wanted.

HOW TO MAKE PAYMENT.—Regulations require that remittance be made prior to the servicing of subscriptions to periodical publications or the mailing of single issues. Purchasers of subscriptions or of individual issues of publications will avoid delay and save time and labour for all concerned by including remittance with their order. This catalogue contains all the information needed to determine the required amount of a remittance.

D.B.S. CURRENT PUBLICATIONS

Note.—The practice of allowing discounts on orders of various titles was discontinued some time ago and charges for publications are now the sum of the listed prices, with one exception. A discount of 25% is allowed on bulk orders of 100 or more copies of an individual publication, but such orders should normally be placed in advance of printing. Individuals or corporations requiring this Bureau's current Full Publications Service may purchase it on a quoted annual price approximately the total of the prices listed therein, with the assurance that new DBS publications appearing during the year will be supplied automatically without additional charges.

Remittances should be in the form of cheque or money order made payable to the Receiver General of Canada. Bank exchange fee is not necessary. Postage stamps and currency should not be used; apart from being banned by postal regulations, no record exists if remittance in this form is lost or inadvertently omitted.

To avoid sending small individual remittances those who expect to purchase publications regularly may open a deposit account with the Queen's Printer. Deposits of \$10.00 or more are accepted against which orders may be placed. Orders are charged to the account with regular statements forwarded by the Queen's Printer.

No charge additional to the listed price is made for postage on publications sent to points in Canada and the United States. When publications are mailed to other countries, 30% is added to the selling price to cover cost of postage. A price list showing foreign subscription rates will be supplied on request.

FREE DISTRIBUTION.—The Queen's Printer is authorized to supply one copy of any official publication free of charge, on request, to an officially specified list of persons and institutions (including depository libraries, university libraries, Senators and Members of the Parliament of Canada, etc.). Such persons or institutions may obtain free one copy of a current publication of the Government of Canada by checking and returning the *Daily Checklist* issued by the Queen's Printer. Inquiries regarding this authorized free distribution of publications of the Dominion Bureau of Statistics should be addressed to the Queen's Printer, not to the Dominion Bureau of Statistics.

REFERENCE COLLECTIONS.—The Bureau's current publications are available for consultation at the National Library, Ottawa, at each of the Provincial Legislative Libraries, at the libraries of universities in the ten provinces of Canada, at the larger public libraries, and in DBS regional officers listed on page x. A complete collection of the Bureau's publications, since its founding in 1918, is on file in the Library of the Dominion Bureau of Statistics, Tunney's Pasture, Ottawa.

Publications

Le programme de publications du Bureau vise à présenter les renseignements statistiques disponibles sous la forme la plus communément demandée. Le catalogue des publications courantes comprend environ 500 ouvrages que tous peuvent acheter sauf là où, ainsi qu'il est indiqué, ils sont épuisés. La mise en vente est fondée sur le principe que l'acheteur ne paie que le papier et le travail d'impression; les prix ne comprennent pas les frais de rédaction.

Il est évidemment impossible de publier des statistiques qui donnent pleine satisfaction et le Bureau est toujours disposé à fournir, d'après les données disponibles dans ses dossiers, des renseignements statistiques qui ne sont contenus dans aucune de ses publications. Une compensation estimée d'après le temps requis au bureau est imposée pour ce service, à moins que la recherche et les calculs ne soient brefs.

SYSTÈME DE CLASSIFICATION ET DE CATALOGUE.—En 1959, le Bureau fédéral de la statistique a inauguré une nouvelle forme de catalogue pour ses publications. Grâce au nouveau système, chaque publication portera désormais son numéro de catalogue imprimé sur la couverture, ce qui en permettra l'identification en plus du titre. Tous les numéros du catalogue comprennent cinq chiffres. Ce numérotage des publications est en conformité des dispositions présentées au Bureau par divers abonnés importants et devrait faciliter et simplifier pour toutes les commandes et le classement des publications.

Selon la nouvelle articulation, toutes les publications du Bureau sont classées en neuf groupes, numérotés de 1 à 9. Ces groupes se subdivisent en sous-groupes qui sont numérotés de 1 à 9 selon le besoin. Les groupes et les sous-groupes régissent ainsi les deux premiers chiffres de chaque

numéro de catalogue. Les trois autres chiffres servent à indiquer la périodicité et sont assignés comme il suit: 001 à 199, périodiques (publications paraissant plus d'une fois l'an); 201 à 399, publications annuelles; 401 à 499, publications biennales; 501 à 999, publications irrégulières (documents de référence, rapports spéciaux, etc.). A l'intérieur d'un secteur numérique, les publications suivent à peu près l'ordre alphabétique des titres, mais cet ordre peut être rompu par l'inscription subséquente de nouveaux titres. Toutefois, le nombre de publications dans chaque sous-groupe n'est pas si grand qu'il puisse empêcher de trouver le titre désiré.

Les grandes lignes de la nouvelle classification, y compris les numéros de code des groupes et des sous-groupes figurent à la table des matières. A noter que les groupes ne correspondent pas à l'organisation des divisions du Bureau et le nom de la Division n'est d'aucun secours lorsqu'il s'agit de commander ou de cataloguer les publications du B.F.S., bien qu'il puisse indiquer où s'adresser pour demander des renseignements au sujet du contenu des publications.

INDEX DU CONTENU DES PUBLICATIONS.—On a ajouté à la présente liste des publications du Bureau un index analytique par sujet et par denrée. Cet index est préparé de façon à guider le lecteur dans le choix des publications qui contiennent des statistiques sur un sujet donné ou sur une denrée particulière.

L'index contient plusieurs milliers d'inscriptions classées par ordre alphabétique et se référant toutes à un numéro de catalogue. Malgré leur nombre, les inscriptions ne représentent qu'une partie du grand nombre de sujets et de denrées sur lesquels le Bureau publie des renseignements.

INDEX DES TITRES.—On trouvera aussi à la fin du présent répertoire une liste alphabétique des titres accompagnés des numéros de catalogue appropriés. Cet index aidera à trouver plus facilement les publications de toute collection classée par numéro de catalogue.

CHOIX ET COMMANDE DE PUBLICATIONS

Les notes descriptives données avec chaque titre ou groupe de titres du Catalogue ne servent qu'à indiquer le contenu des publications. Elles devraient, dans la plupart des cas, faciliter le choix des publications pour toutes fins déterminées. En cas de doute, communiquer avec la Division des services d'information, Bureau fédéral de la statistique, Ottawa, ou avec votre bureau régional du B.F.S. le plus près (*voir page xvi*) et faire connaître vos besoins aussi précisément que possible.

COMMANDES.—En dressant sa commande, il faut mentionner le numéro de catalogue et le titre des publications.

Les commandes d'abonnement aux rapports hebdomadaires, mensuels, trimestriels ou annuels doivent être adressées à la **Distribution des publications, Bureau fédéral de la statistique, Ottawa.**

Les commandes d'un seul exemplaire d'un rapport périodique et celles de rapports annuels, réguliers et spéciaux peuvent être adressées soit à la **Distribution des publications, Bureau fédéral de la statistique**, soit à **l'Imprimeur de la Reine, Ottawa.** Ces commandes doivent indiquer la date (mois, année, etc.), des exemplaires désirés.

PAIEMENT.—Les règlements exigent la remise du paiement avant l'envoi des publications périodiques d'un abonnement ou les exemplaires com-

mandés à part. Les acheteurs d'un abonnement ou d'un exemplaire particulier des publications s'éviteront des retards et épargneront du temps et du travail à tous les intéressés en envoyant leur remise avec leur commande. Le catalogue contient tous les renseignements voulus pour établir le montant exact de la remise.

Note.—*La pratique d'accorder un escompte pour les commandes en quantité de différents titres a été discontinuée il y a quelque temps; on devra donc s'en tenir à la somme des prix indiqués. La seule exception est un escompte de 25 p. 100 accordé pour une commande de 100 exemplaires ou plus d'une publication particulière, mais de telles commandes doivent normalement être envoyées avant l'impression. Les particuliers et les groupes constitués qui désirent obtenir le service de toutes les publications courantes du Bureau peuvent se le procurer moyennant un prix annuel fixe qui représente à peu près la somme des prix indiqués, avec l'assurance toutefois qu'ils recevront automatiquement et sans frais supplémentaires toute nouvelle publication du B.F.S. qui paraîtra au cours de l'année.*

Pour éviter l'envoi de petites remises, les personnes qui prévoient commander régulièrement certaines publications peuvent ouvrir un compte de dépôt chez l'Imprimeur de la Reine moyennant un versement de \$10 ou plus. Les commandes seront portées au débit du compte, dont l'Imprimeur de la Reine enverra un relevé régulièrement.

Les paiements se font par chèque ou par mandat au nom du **Receveur général du Canada**. Il n'y a pas de frais d'échange pour les chèques. On ne doit envoyer ni timbres-poste ni argent, pratique qui est déconseillée par les règlements de la poste et ne laisse aucune preuve si la remise se perd ou est omise par mégarde.

L'expédition postale des publications au Canada et aux États-Unis ne comporte aucun frais supplémentaires. Pour leur expédition postale à l'étranger, il faut ajouter 30 p. 100 du prix de vente pour les frais de port. Une liste de prix des abonnements à l'étranger sera envoyée sur demande.

DISTRIBUTION GRATUITE.—L'Imprimeur de la Reine est autorisé à envoyer gratuitement, sur demande, un exemplaire de toute publication officielle aux personnes et institutions dont le nom figure à la liste officielle (y compris les bibliothèques de dépôt, les bibliothèques universitaires, les sénateurs et les députés au Parlement du Canada, etc.). Ces personnes ou institutions peuvent obtenir leur exemplaire gratuit d'une publication courante du Gouvernement du Canada en la pointant dans la *Liste quotidienne* publiée par l'Imprimeur de la Reine et en lui renvoyant cette liste. Les demandes de renseignements concernant la distribution gratuite des publications du Bureau fédéral de la statistique doivent être adressées à l'Imprimeur de la Reine et non au Bureau fédéral de la statistique.

COLLECTIONS DE CONSULTATION.—Les publications courantes du Bureau peuvent être consultées à la **Bibliothèque nationale, Ottawa**, à la bibliothèque de la Législature de chaque province, aux bibliothèques des universités des dix provinces du Canada, aux grandes bibliothèques publiques et aux bureaux régionaux du B.F.S. indiqués à la page xvi. 3: MANUFACTURING — MANUFACTURES

Description of reports

Publications under Manufacturing consist of an extensive series of annual reports on Canadian manufacturing as a whole and on individual manufacturing industries, and a number of monthly, quarterly, and semi-annual reports on the production of certain commodities. These are listed currently in sub-groups 31 to 47: one general and the others under titles broadly indicative of the classification of the products manufactured.

The annual reports on individual industries are generally similar in character and present the following principal statistics on the industry dealt with: list of firms, number of plants, average number of employees, salaries and wages, cost of fuel and electricity, cost of materials, and selling value of factory shipments, with comparative Canada totals for earlier years and breakdown by provinces.

Further detail is also given on the number of wage-earners by sex, by months; fuel by kinds and electricity used, quantity and cost; power equipment; quantity and costs of various materials used; products shipped, with selling value at works and quantity (where applicable).

Owing to the fact that annual surveys cannot be initiated until the end of the calendar year, as well as the time required to collect and compile the extensive data presented, the annual industry reports are not usually available until a year or more after the end of the year reviewed.

However, it should not be assumed that because an annual report (say 1959) for a particular industry is not published that statistics on the operations of the industry for 1959, or later, are not available. The monthly and quarterly publications will frequently contain many of the statistics required. This is particularly the case where the user is concerned with statistics of commodities such as shipments, inventories and orders. However, the user of both "industry" and "commodity" statistics should be aware of the differences in classification and coverage.

Étant donné que les enquêtes annuelles ne peuvent commencer qu'à la fin de l'année civile et en raison du temps requis pour la collection et le dépouillement des abondants renseignements reçus, les rapports annuels sur les industries ne peuvent guère paraître qu'un an ou plus après la fin de l'année observée.

Toutefois, si un rapport annuel, disons celui de 1959, sur une industrie quelconque n'est pas publié, il ne s'ensuit pas nécessairement que la statistique relative à l'exploitation de cette industrie en 1959, ou plus tard, n'existe pas. Souvent, les publications mensuelles et trimestrielles contiendront les renseignements désirés. Tel serait particulièrement le cas, par exemple, d'une personne qui serait intéressée à la statistique des livraisons, des stocks et des commandes de denrées. Toutefois, si elle est intéressée à la fois à la statistique de l'"industrie" et à celle des "denrées", elle devra tenir compte des différences de classement et d'application.

SUBJECT INDEX

This index is designed to show the Bureau publication or publications in which information on certain subjects or commodities is to be found. It is intended to serve as an aid in the selection and ordering of Bureau publications, as pointed out in the introductory section.

The index contains about 7,000 entries. This does not represent, of course, all the subjects and commodities covered in the Bureau's current publications. The numerous individual export and import commodities, for instance, are not included, since these are found readily in classified form in the various foreign trade publications and in a special alphabetical index to these publications which is supplied on request to their users. Since the detailed report "General Review of Manufacturing Statistics," number 3I-20I, contains a detailed alphabetical list of commodities manufactured in Canada, reference is made to it only in the case of commodities not listed in one of the individual industry reports. Users of this index may assume, therefore, that number 3I-20I will apply to any manufactured commodity for which there is another entry. In the case of other omissions, the entries for related items usually afford a clue to where information on them, if available, may be found. Lastly, the Bureau's coverage is increasing and those who cannot locate what they seek should send an inquiry to the Bureau.

Commodities and subjects are listed alphabetically in the index and the accompanying numbers indicate the publications that contain information, specific or otherwise, on the commodity or subject.

INDEX ANALYTIQUE

L'index est préparé de façon à indiquer dans quelle publication du Bureau on peut trouver des renseignements sur un sujet ou une denrée. Il a pour objet d'aider au choix et à l'établissement de la commande des publications du Bureau, comme on l'a signalé dans l'introduction.

L'index contient environ 7,000 inscriptions, qui ne représentent pas, tant s'en faut, tous les sujets et denrées dont il est question dans les publications courantes du Bureau. Ainsi, les nombreuses denrées d'exportation et d'importation ne sont pas comprises individuellement, puisqu'elles se trouvent facilement et sous forme classée dans les diverses publications du commerce extérieur et dans un index alphabétique spécial de ces publications qui est envoyé aux usagers sur demande. Comme le rapport détaillé "Revue générale de la statistique de la fabrication", numéro 31-201, contient la liste alphabétique détaillée des denrées fabriquées au Canada, on n'y renvoie que dans le cas de denrées non énumérées dans l'un des rapports des industries particulières. Les usagers de l'index peuvent donc conclure que la publication numéro 31-201 s'appliquera à toute denrée fabriquée qui porte une autre inscription. Dans le cas des autres omissions, les inscriptions d'articles connexes indiquent presque toujours assez où trouver les renseignements, s'ils sont disponibles. Enfin, le Bureau élargit son domaine et ceux qui ne peuvent trouver ce qu'ils désirent devraient adresser leur requête au Bureau.
