### 12: Working Manuals

### 12-202E CANSIM Summary Reference Index. E. and F. 44 pp.

This index summarizes the contents of the CANSIM Main Base by subject and source publication. It provides a key to publication 12-203, CANSIM Main Base Series Directory, and is the first step in locating and obtaining time series from the system. Amendments to this publication are issued periodically. Formerly issued as a non-catalogued publication.

# 13: Comprehensive Studies

# 13-557 Earnings and Work Histories of the 1972 Canadian Labour Force, Bil. 144 pp.

Analysis of the 1972 earnings of Canadians by work history characteristics in conjunction with demographic characteristics. Demographic characteristics include sex, age and education. Work history characteristics include the number of years in the labour force and the mobility experienced between 1967 and 1972. A technical appendix to this report contains a multi-variate regression model explaining the male-female earnings differential. \$2.10

# 13-561 Distributional Effects of Health and Education Benefits, Canada, 1974. Bil. 152 pp.

This report presents, for the first time, data on the utilization of health (medical and/or hospital) and educational services by Canadians. The utilization as well as estimated monetary benefits accruing from these services are studied in respect to selected socio-demographic characteristics such as family income, sex, age, life cycle, size of family and area of residence. This report is based on special supplementary data collected in April 1975 by the Survey of Consumer Finances. \$2.10

13-562 System of National Accounts, Financial Flow Accounts, Volume 1, Quarterly Flows 1962 - 1975. Bil. 506 pp.

This volume contains a comprehensive historical record of the Financial Flow Accounts from the first quarter 1962 to the fourth quarter 1975. The last such comprehensive publication appeared in 1969. Included in the publication are annual matrices and quarterly and annual time series for all sectors and subsectors as well as for the major categories of financial instruments. The data reflect all revisions and conceptual changes that have been made in the Financial Flow Accounts up to the end of 1976.

# 15: Input-Output Tables

15-506E The Input-Output Structure of the Canadian Economy, 1961 - 71. E. and F. 323 pp.

Contains the accounting framework, classification system and some definitions used for the input-output tables. The report describes the input-output model used for the impact tables and contains inputs, outputs, final demand and impact tables at two levels of aggregation, S and M, for each of the years from 1961 to 1971. This report supersedes the Input-Output Tables published in three earlier reports (Catalogue Nos.: 15-501, 15-502 and 15-505). \$5.25

25-505 Canadian Forestry Statistics Revised, 1974. Bil. 56 pp.

31-003 Capacity Utilization Rates in Canadian Manufacturing, Quarterly, Bif. 82 pp. First Issue, First Quarter, 1961 to Third Quarter, 1976.

Presents capacity utilization rates for Canadian manufacturing by major group according to the 1970 Standard Industrial Classification, as well as aggregates for durable, non-durable and total manufacturing. The series are an analytical extension of the capital stocks series presented in publication 13-211, Fixed Capital Flows and Stocks.

The report discusses implications of the findings, with special emphasis on the effect the number and educational attainment of future school leavers will have on the labour force. Results of a survey of the employment status and salaries of 1974 post-secondary graduates are presented to indicate job market prospects in various disciplines. \$3.50

### 83-226 Nursing in Canada: Canadian Nursing Statistics. Bil. 143 pp. First Issue, 1975.

86-201 Social Security, National Programs, Bil. 797 pp. First Issue, 1976 (a review for the period 1946 to 1975).

This report covers the period from 1946 to 1975 with statistical and descriptive information on all major programs (medicare, hospital insurance, Canada and Quebec pension plans, unemployment insurance, family allowances, old age security, social allowances and services) and some smaller programs. Data is examined in relation to socio-economic variables such as labour force, population, Gross National Product, personal income, average wages and salaries. Statistics focus on (a) people—beneficiaries, contributors and claimants, and on (b) payments—to individuals, organizations or provinces.




