## PREFACE

This edition of the Statistics Canada Catalogue of Publications includes all titles available from the department as of December 31, 1978. The next planned release of the Catalogue will he early 1980.

The most important new feature of the 1978-79 Catalogue is the inclusion of a completely revised Title/Subject Index. This index provides more efficient and accurate access to material available in Statistics Canada publications and includes, for the first time, complete integration of Census and non-Census index terms. The Index contains more than 10,000 subject references and includes cross-references based on the Library of Congress Subject Headings. Another important change is the addition of dates of first issue for regular publications.

Users should note that in November 1978 Statistics Canada announced that a number of publications would be discontinued in accordance with a federal government spending restraint program. All are included in the list of discontinued publications. However, the final editions of some of these publications will not appear until 1979, and their abstracts have been identified accordingly. Modifications to publications as a result of the spending restraint (other than changes of periodicity) have been included by way of notes associated with abstracts of affected publications, including reference to the first issue for which modifications are to be included.

All publications from the 1976 Census of Population and Housing and the 1976 Census of Agriculture are included in this Catalogue, although in certain instances the publications will be released after the reference date of December 31, 1978. In addition, all publications from the 1971 Census are included. Users should note that publications from the 1976 Census will also be listed in a separate Census Catalogue.

Users should also note that the 1975 and subsequent editions of the Catalogue ceased Iisting all "vintage" publications. It is suggested, therefore, that those wishing to refer to such publications should use the 1973-74 edition, since it provides a link between the Historical Catalogue ( 11.504 ) and all post-1975 editions, with the exception of the 1956 quinquennial Census which is contained in the 1968 edition of the Catalogue.

As in the case of previous Catalogues, single copies are provided at no charge. There is, however, a nominal charge for multiple copy requests.

## INTRODUCTION

Statistics Canada responsibilities in the Canadian statistical system concern the whole range of statistics on the economic and social activities and conditions of the Canadian people.

The publishing program of the department reflects this responsibility, and is designed to make statistical information readily available to users in the forms in which it is most frequently wanted, including publications and computer print-outs, micro-form and computer tapes. Data are also available on-line through the Canadian Socio-economic Information Management System (CANSIM).

This Catalogue is presented in three main sections. Part I of the Catalogue provides annotations on publications bearing Catalogue Numbers. Part II of the Catalogue provides information on unpublished or uncatalogued material and information on major statistical publica. tions of other federal government departments and agencies. Finally, the third section of the Catalogue is a detailed Subject/Title Index.

In using Statistics Canada data, the user should he aware of the fact that all information compiled by the department is subject to the clauses of the Statistics Act which protects organizations and persons from individual disclosure.

## Formation of Five-digit Catalogue Numbers

Most Statistics Canada publications can be identified by their unique five digit Catalogue numbers. These numbers are formed in the following way:

First Digit: Under the grouping arrangement, all Statistics Canada publications are classified into 8 major subject groups, as follows:

Second Digit: Each of the above major groups is further divided into sub-groups. For example, Major Group 3 (Manufacturing) is divided into 6 sub-groups: (1) General Survey: (2) Foods, Beverages and Tobacco; (3) Leather and Rubber Products; (4) Textiles and Apparel; (5) Wood Products; (6) Paper Products and Printing.

Third Digit: The third digit indicates the frequency of publication as follows:

Fourth and Fifth Digits: The fourth and fifth digits are used to give each title its own unique permanent number. The numbers are allocated sequentially as new publications are officially approved by the department.

The following is a typical example of the above described catalogue numbering system: Catalogue Num. ber 84.001 has been assigned to the publication Vital Statistics. This Catalogue Number was created as follows:

## International Standard Serial Numbers (ISSN)

The National Library of Canada, in cooperation with Statistics Canada, is assigning 8 digit International Standard Serial Numbers to all serial Statistics Canada publications for the purpose of facilitating identification, citation, ordering and bibliographic control on an international hasis. More than $90 \%$ of Statistics Canada serial publications have been so identified to date, with the goal of complete identification prior to the release of the next edition of the Statistios Canada Catalogue.

## Local Access to Data - Reference Services Regional Advisors - Libraries

User Advisory Services has statistical Reference Centres in nine major cities across the country supported by a head office staff in Ottawa. Toll free telephone lines to the Reference Centres are available in several areas.

At no cost to the user, trained staff in the nine cities:

- Answer over 200,000 telephone inquiries a vear for statistical data or advice on the availability, meaning and uses of the data;
- Maintain libraries of all Statistics Canada's recent publications as well as some historical ones and additional related material, some of which is on microform;
- Open the libraries to the public during normal working hours, provide users with study areas to work with the publications;
- Advise users on how to purchase Statistics Canada information through publications, microfiche and microfilin, and computer based products or services;
- Retrieve information directly from CANSIM, Statistics Canada's machine-readable database or advise users about the on-line services.

Each local Reference Centre of User Advisory Services has one or more Regional Advisors who:

- Assist both experienced and inexperienced users with their data problems;
- Promote the use of statistical data by participating in conferences, convention displays, workshops, seminars and briefing sessions;
- Provide important feedback to Ottawa on the statistical needs and problems of users so as to help Statistics Canada improve the content and availability of its products and services.

In addition to being available from User Advisory Services local Reference Centres, Statistics Canada publications are also available for reference purposes from a large number of libraries throughout Canada, including most provincial legislative libraries and many public and university libraries. A complete bistorical collection of Statistics Canada material is held by the Statistics Canada Library in Ottawa and is available to the general public for reference purposes.

## Canadian Socio-economic Information Management System (CANSIM)

One of the ways of accessing Statistics Canada's information is through CANSIM, the agency's machine-readable database. CANSIM comprises two modules, the CANSIM Time-Series module, containing current and historical information from a broad range of interrelated socio-economic fields, and the CANSIM Cross-Classified module, which addresses the demand for multidimensional data mostly expressed by scholars and practitioners in the fields of demography, education, health and justice.

The Time-Series module comprises major groups of data from the following subject-matter areas:

- System of National Accounts
- Prices and Price Indexes
- Labour
- Manufacturing and Primary Industries (including Fuel. Power and Mining)
- Capital and Finance
- Construction
- Merchandising and Services
- External Trade
- Transportation
- Agriculture and Food
- Population Estimates and Projections
- Health and Welfare

It also contains data from numerous tables in the Canadian Statistical Review, the Bank of Canada Review (including selected U.S. statistics) and the (Quebee Statistical Review. The content is constantly growing as new sets of data are added. Currently some 280 publications are represented in part or in full in the CANSIM TimeSeries module.

The CANSIM Time-Series module is offered to users in two formats: the CANSIM Main Base and the CANSIM Mini Base. The CANSIM Main Base currently contains some 260,000 time series and is updated on a daily hasis, usually at the same time the data is officially released. It is located on on-line disk packs at the CANSIM bost service bureau. The CANSIM Mini Base is a standard subset of data which originates from the CANSIM Main Base. The CANSIM Mini Base currently contains ap-
proximately 17,500 of the most widely used time series. The CANSIM Mini Base is updated daily, within the next working day of the series being released on the CANSIM Main Base. The CANSIM Mini Base is offered by a number of Secondary Distributors.

Recognition of the increasing use of multi-dimemsional information in a machine-readable form has led to the development of the CANSIM Cross Classified module. The approach has been to adapt machine-processing techniques to current uses of multi dimensional statistical aggregations.

Major data sources for the CANSIM Cross-Classified module currently are the Health, Justice, and Education, Science and Culture Divisions of Statistics Canada, as well as the Statistics Canada Census of Population data base, from which larger geographical aggregations are currently being added.

The CANSIM Cross-Classified module will be of particular interest to analysts and researchers specializing in social studies and societal evolution and problems. It meets their need for cross-tabulation and analysis of data on social conditions (family structure, occupation, income and others) available from the Census data base with data on social phenomena in the fields of health, welfare, justice and others. At the present time, the CANSIM Cross-Classified module is available only at the CANSIM host service hureau.

## Publications in Microform

In addition to publications and machine readable data, Statistics Canada makes available large blocks of data in microform. A large part of the output of the 1976 Census of Population and Housing is availatule on microfiche, as are almost all 1976 Census of Agriculture tabulations and all current serial publications of the External Trade Division. Further information regarding the current microform offerings of the department can be obtained by contacting any of the Statistics Canada local Reference Centres.

The complete historical collection of Statistics Canada publications, with the exception of the Statistics Canada Daily, is being reproduced on microfiche under arrangement with Micromedia Limited of Toronto. A project to film all publications up to and including 1975, which will be completed in 1979, will bring together the most comprehensive body of Canadian statistical material ever assembled. Many rare and out-of print items are included. Beginning in 1976, quarterly installments by major group/series have been made available as they have been produced. Issues since 1975 will become available starting in the spring of 1979 . Further information

## How to Order Publications

When ordering, the Catalogue numbers, titles and issues (month, year) of publications should be quoted. Subscription orders are accepted for all serial publications, but not for biennial and occasional publications. Orders should be forwarded to Publications Distribution, Statistics Canada, Ottawa K1A 0T6. It should be noted that subscriptions do not commence with the current issue of an ordered publication, but rather begin with the next issue released following receipt of the subscription order. Individual publications may be ordered from Publications Distribution directly or the User Advisory Services local Reference Centres may be of assistance. When ordering, it is important to indicate if a subscription or a casual order, is desired. Alternatively, publications may be ordered through Government of Canada "authorized agent" bookstores throughout the country. These agents are listed in the Yellow Pages of the telephone book under "Book Dealers-Retail-Government of Canada Publications".

Those interested in all Statistics Canada data can order the Full Publication Service and receive publications automatically as soon as they are released. The current cost is $\$ 840$ per year for the service to locations in Canada and $\$ 1008$ for the service outside Canada. The Full Publication Service does not include decennial or quinquennial Census publications.

Prices listed in this Catalogue apply only to purchases within Canada. Customers in other countries must add $20 \%$ to quoted prices to cover additional postage and handling charges. An additional charge is levied if Air Mail is required. Prices of publications are subject to change without notice. Remittances should be in the form of cheque or money order made payable to the Receiver General for Canada. Currency and postage stamps should not be used in ordering publications by mail.

As credit is allowed in particular circumstances, delays in order fulfillment may he avoided by prepayment. However, Statistics Canada is prepared to invoice on a monthly basis customers who frequently order publications. Application forms for this service are available from Publications Distribution and from User Advisory Services local Reference Centres.

## 3: MANUFACTURING

## Description of Reports

Publications listed under "Manufacturing" relate to Division 5 of the Standard Industrial Classification.

These publications consist of a large number of reports, some of which provide summarized and analytical information for manufacturing as a whole and others which provide detailed information on individual manufacturing industries or on various commodities.

Although titles of the various reports are broadly indicative of the subject matter covered, explanatory notes have been included under title headings where necessary. Such notes are generally restricted to reports dealing with the manufacturing industries as a whole (sub-group 31) and to those publications dealing with commodities. The reports on individual industries are generally similar to each other in character and include such principal statistics as: number of establishments, number and type of employees and their salaries and wages, cost of fuel and electricity, value of shipments of goods of own manufacture, and value added. Comparative statistics are given for Canada for earlier years and for the preceding year for provinces. Also shown are the value and, where applicable, quantities of major products shipped and purchased materials used by establishments classified to the industry. Some reports also show total manufacturers' shipments of relevant commodities without regard to industry of origin, but this is given comprehensively for all commodities in an annual report on products shipped by Canadian manufacturers.

Primarily due to the fact that annual surveys cannot be initated until the end of the calendar year and to the time required to collect edit and compile extensive data, most annual industry reports are not available until a year or more after the end of the year of survey. However, two-page preliminary bulletins providing data on shipments of goods of own manufacture and on principal statistics by province are issued to subscribers as soon as the statistics on individual industries are compiled, expediting their availability to users considerably. Other preliminary bulletins are also published relating to manufacturing as a whole.

In addition there are a large number of publications which are published more frequently than once a year and which contain current information on commodities (generally shipments, production or consumption). Although not exactly suitable to industry analyses, except in the case of one-industry commodities, they have proven to be most useful in commodity analyses.

Current estimates of the value of shipments, inventories and orders for manufacturing industries in total, numerous sub-aggregations and selected industries are issued monthly. They are based on a sample survey of establishments representing about $75 \%$ of the shipments, determined from the Census of Manufactures.

## Preliminary Bulletins, Census of Manufactures

A preliminary bulletin for almost every report of the annual Census of Manufactures, including some 130 industry reports and most general reports, is sent free-of-charge to subscribers to the report involved. ## UNPUBLISHED INFORMATION

Part Il of this Catalogue consists of two main elements, data files and information apart from data files which is generally described as unpublished information. This latter is information which may be useful to a limited number of individuals or organizations, but which is not published because the interest in it is not considered to be sufficiently broad.

Data files include summary tapes, punch card decks and micro data files. These latter are files of individual survey records which have been stripped of any information tending to identify the individual, family, household, etc., to which the record relates.

Unpublished information includes special tabulations, copies of special statements, computer print-outs, etc. Some unpublished non-statistical information, technical papers and maps are also available.

Like all information issued by Statistics Canada, data files and unpublished information are subject to the limitations of the Statistics Act which prevents the disclosure of information tending to identify individual persons or companies.

In instances where a request for unpublished information or a data file can be met without a considerable amount of time and effort, there is no charge. In some cases where the work to be done is substantial, a charge may be made. In still other cases a standard charge is made. Where charges are not specified in this Catalogue an estimate of cost will be provided before the work is undertaken.

Some of the classifications in use in the bureau can be made available in machine-readable form. Those interested in acquiring such material should apply to the Standards Division, Statistics Canada, Ottawa K1A 0T6. Otherwise, your dealings would be with the subject area division which produces the information you are interested in or with the Regional Advisor in your region.

When making a request, users should specify clearly the materials or subject matter characteristics desired and the geographic or geo-administrative areas for which the census data are required. In some cases, the general nature of the problem, hypothesis, or project might assist in determination of their availability.

## Computer Printouts, Microfilm (71) and Microfiche (76)

In addition to the tabular results released in the form of reports or bulletins, a large number of tables were produced as computer printouts. These tables can be made available as photocopies or on microfilm (1971) and microfiche (1976). Data in these formats are individually prepared on request and a charge to cover the cost of reproduction is made.

## Microform - format and cost

1971 - all unpublished tables are available on 16 millimeter diazo microfilm and are supplied in conventional 100 foot rolls ( $1500-2500$ images). In most cases, more than one tabulation will be found on an individual roll of microfilm - cost per roll is $\$ 5.00$.

1976 - all unpublished tables are available on microfiche supplied as negative vesicular copies with images recorded at 48 times reduction. The number of pages per microfiche will be either 270 or 435 depending on the page width. The microfiche will have computer generated indexes located in the lower right hand corner. The table number and area identifiers are featured in the readable
title space. It is recommended that at least 36 power magnification lenses be used on microfiche reader printers when desiring photocopies.

To facilitate fast response and minimize handling the tables on microfiche will, with a few exceptions, be supplied only as complete tables. Prices per table range from $\$ 2.00$ to $\$ 20.00$ for most tables. A minimum order of $\$ 5.00$ will apply. For those tables with prices of $\$ 10.00$ or more, a partial set will be supplied for the desired region(s) hut the minimum charge will apply.

More information on the microform data, including table content can be supplied by Census Information Services.

## Maps and Geographic Reference Materials

Large scale maps depicting the boundaries of the Census Enumeration Areas and other statistical areas can be purchased. These include an urban map series, a rural map series and a Census Tract Map series showing enumeration areas (i.e. the territory covered by each enumerator in taking the census). In addition, various small scale maps are available depicting census divisions and other statistical areas. Maps from the Census are also available on 35 millimeter microfilm. A detailed list of the reference maps indicating scales, dimensions and costs can be obtained by requesting "Availability of Reference Maps 1971, Census Field" (G-71) and "Guide to Reference Maps available from the 1976 Census".

Official lists (1971) and Enumeration Area Reference lists (1976 Catalogue 99-810 to 99-820) identifying the composition of administrative and statistical areas (i.e. counties, cities, towns, villages, municipalities, census tracts, metropolitan areas and census agglomerations) in terms of the component enumeration areas and census codes, are available at nominal costs.

Street Indexes providing the link between civic addresses and enumeration areas (and census tracts where they exist) were compiled for 59 centres and are available in published form and on magnetic tape.

## Magnetic Tape Files

Area Master Files describe the street network and other physical features as defined by means of geographic co-ordinates within census metropolitan areas.

Cartlib is a geographic boundary file of Census divisions and Census tracts in a format usable by computer mapping programmes.

The GEOGRAPHY TAPE FILE links the smallest unit of collection namely Enumeration Areas and corresponding centroids to all higher level geographic codes such as Federal Electoral Districts, Municipalities, Counties, Cities, Towns, Villages, etc. for all of Canada. This file also provides a linkage between Census and Standard Geographic Codes.

## User Summary Tapes

A large number of tables were produced and are available on computer tapes. The tape files contain tabulated data and usually have more detail than is provided in printed reports. The summary tapes allow users to aggregate the tabulations either on a geographic basis or by combined data cells. They are available for a variety of geographic areas including enumeration areas (225-500 persons), census tracts (2,000-4,000 persons) and Census subdivisions.

The tape files are organized to provide Canada-wide coverage for a particular geographic level. Separate tape series have been produced for the short 2A form ( $100 \%$ coverage) questions, the long 2-B form ( $1 / 3$ sample) questions, and for the census of agriculture. Additionally micro data in the form of public use sample files based on $1 \%$ sample of the Census are also available.

## Special Tabulations

Insofar as confidentiality constraints permit, Statistics Canada will produce for users, at cost, special computer tabulations not included in the main programme. In most cases, these special tabulations will he produced using the Geographically Referenced Data Storage and Retrieval System (GRDSR) commonly known as Geocoding. The GRDSR system is designed to provide flexibility in cross-tablulation and specification of the geographical areas (i.e., user defined areas) for which special tabulations are to be produced for both 1971 and 1976 Censuses.

Special tahulations can be produced in hard copy (print-out) form, or on magnetic tape. Cost estimates will be provided upon submission of the tabulation specifications. Users desiring special tabulations are requested to be as precise as possible in describing their requirements. Essential specifications are: the exact variables or characteristics required; the set of responses or categories to be reported for each characteristic; and the specific geographic units for which data are to be tabulated. An illustration of the desired table layout and acceptable alternatives for any of the above will facilitate under. standing of the specifications and processing of requests. Turn-around time for such requests will depend upon the complexity of the tables and availability of resources and the demand. Contracts and prepayment or deposits may be required.

On request, special studies of import and export commodities can be undertaken to provide a finer breakdown of any published commodity class, subject to the availability of appropriate descriptions on customs documents and also to the secrecy provisions of the Statistics Act. Studies are priced on a cost recovery basis in addition to a $\$ 50$ per class feasibility study charge.

Following receipt of request, the subscriber will be informed about what information he could expect, how soon a detailed survey could be undertaken and its cost.

## Other Information

Computer tapes with the same information published in regular reports are available to users interested in obtaining revised time series of selected commodity classes or collated with related economic data. Also available on tape is information tailored to user's specifications, e.g. by mode of transport, region of lading, etc.

## Microfiche

Commencing January 1975 a new subscription service was made available to users of Trade of Canada data. This constitutes complete copies on microfilm of regularly published reports. Micro-filming facilitates easier access and quicker dissemination of information as well as enormous space savings. For example, the detailed monthly report "Exports by Commodities" (Catalogue $65-004$ ) reproduced on three microfiches can be delivered to users approximately one month before the printed report.

## Reconciliation of United States-Canada Trade Statistics

The United States-Canada Trade Statistics Committee has published two reports containing information on the methods and results of the bilateral research program on the reconciliation of the two countries counterpart trade figures for the years 1970-1972. These reports were published jointly by the U.S. Department of Commerce, Bureau of the Census, Washington, D.C., and Statistics Canada. Copies can be obtained from the External Trade Division, Statistics Canada.

## FAMILY EXPENDITURE

Some unpublished tabulations, from the 1969 family expenditure survey is available, a list of which will be supplied on request. ## LABOUR FORCE STATISTICS

## Unpublished Data

Monthly estimates and annual averages of the population, labour force, employed, unemployed, not in the labour force, unemployment rates, participation rates and employment/population ratios are available on request.

These data are cross-classified by numerous variables such as province, age, sex, marital status and educational attainment. Where applicable they are classified by industry, occupation, class of worker, job tenure, hours of
work, time lost and reason for time loss, duration of unemployment, nature of job sought (full-time/part-time, permanent/temporary), reason for leaving last joh, reason for not currently looking for work, etc. Copies of the questionnaire used to generate these data can be found in any issue of The Labour Force (Catalogue No. 71 -001).

In addition, results of the monthly Labour Force Survev are available in micro-data form.

## Economic Classifications

Draft Standard Classification of Services. A handbook for classifying intangible economic goods on the basis of the nature of the goods. The classification has roughly 600 items in seven sections. Indexed, English only, August, 1973, Bulletin \#5.

## Goods and Services (Commodities) Classifications

Standard Commodity Classification computer list equivalents of the companion Volume II, Classified Index and Volume III Alphabetical Index. These lists of approximately 50,000 items provide supporting detail to Volume I. The Classification, catalogue 12-502. Lists are available in English only.

Principal Commodity Groups is a purposeful list of 1539 homogeneous goods categories hased upon industry of origin. It is primarily designed for supply and disposition analysis of materials used, manufactured goods and goods imported into Canada. English and French.

Principal Commodity Groups by industry of origin (as noted above) cross-indexed to the following structures. Standard Commodity Classification (Catalogue 12-502); Industrial Commodity Classification (Catalogue 12-541); Trade of Canada Commodity Classifications Exports (Catalogue 12-521); Imports (Catalogue 12-524); Canadian International Trade Classification Numerical Index (Catalogue 12-544). English only. French equivalent in preparation.

Classification of (1) Automatic Data Processing Hardware and (2) Computer Services. These two classifications have been developed to provide a common framework for compilation and analysis of data. The latter classification will be introduced in a survey of computer services. Bulletin No. 14, November 1975. Bilingual.

## Standard Industrial Classification Technical Papers

Information Bulletin No. 1 - January 1972, and Information Bulletin No. 2 - uly 1972. These list corrections and changes plus rulings on new index items.

List of S.I.C. Sub-classes 2nd Edition - March 1975 Eng. and Fr. This lists all of the sub-class codes used by different divisions of the bureau. It also provides a link to publication catalogue numbers.

Canadian and United States S.I.C. Convertibility Index. This is a comprehensive list of U.S. four-digit classes which match, or partly match, with Canadian three-digit class.

## Occupational Classification Manual

Occupational Classification Manual. Comparjson tables 1979 to 1961. These tables enable researchers to aggregate detailed 1971 occupational statistics so that they become generally comparable with 1961 data classified at the broad "Division" level.

Classification Discrepancies Between the 1971 OCM and CCDO. These tables indicate occupations that have been classified differently in Statistics Canada's Occupational Classification Manual (OCM) and the Canada Employment and Immigration Commission's Classification and Dictionary of Occupations (CCDO). Such a listing is of use:
(a) to assist researchers wishing to relate statistics gathered according to the OCM and CCDO classification systems,
(b) to assist in the conduct of occupational surveys employing some 7 -digit occupational codes (found only in the (CCDO) and consequently requiring the use of the CCDO in conjunction with the OCM;
(c) to assist vocational counsellors and others wishing to relate the definitions and background material found in the CCDO to survey data gathered on the OCM base, and;
(d) to assist analysts wishing to compare titles, definitions and structural elements of the OCM and CCDO.

Comparison tables relating the 1971 Occupational Classification Manual (OCM) to the 1968 International Standard Classification of Occupations (ISCO). These tables reaggregate the 1971 OCM groups to become gencrally comparable with the 1968 ISCO major groups so that international comparisons may be undertaken.

Classification des professions recensement du Canudi 1971. bulletin no. 16. liste de titres de langue française. This list of approximately 7,800 newlyidentified French occupational titles, serves as a supple ment to the bilingual edition of the 1971 OCM

## Standard Geographical Classification

Postal Code - Geographical Code Conversion File and User's Guide. This paper describes the creation, maintenance, and record layout of magnetic tape file which relates postal codes to Standard Geographical Classification (SGC) codes (codes of census divisions and subdivisions, including municipalities), census tract (CT) codes, federal electoral district (FED) codes, and enumeration area (EA) codes. The paper also deals with some of the problems which may be encountered in the use of the file. Six appendices provide definitions for the geographical terminology used in the paper, and diagrams illustrating the structure of the postal code in urban and rural areas.

Forward Sortation Area (FSA) - Standard Geographical Classification (SGC) Conversion Table. Forward Sortation Areas are identified by the first three characters of the postal code. This tahle provides a 4 or 7 -digit SGC codes for the approximately 1000 urban FSAs and the 2-digit SGC codes for the 200 rural FSAs. The table is intended to serve as a directory for Postal Code - Geographical Colle Conversion tile, and can also be used for geographical coding at the Census division (4-digit SGC code) level for urban FSAs.

Standards Division Paper No. 17, Subprovincial Regions of Statistics Canada, 1976. A subprovincial region is a geographical unit or area intermediate in size between a census division and a province. In all provinces except Quehec, suhprovincial regions are made up of one or more 1976 census divisions. The paper discusses the subprovincial region concept, provides a listing of the 1976 census division components of the regions, cross-references to 1971 economic regions, and the regions of the Labour Force Survey.

## Social Concepts Directory For Statistical Surveys

A subject matter survey manual providing recommended usage for surveys including demographic, labour force, housing and cultural questions. Bilingual, September 1977.

## Statistics Canada Microfiche Base

This includes a complete file of all questionnaires used by Statistics Canada in the collection of statistics. It also includes related instruction material. The last update of the Base includes all questionnaires as at the end of the 1977 calendar year. Copies of the fiche and of the file index can be ohtained from the Standards Division.

## STRUCTURAL ANALYSIS

Structural Economic Models: A User's Guide. This volume describes the various structural economic models that have been made operational and are maintained by the Structural Analysis. Division and that are available as analytical tools to both public and private institutions. The User's Guide level of documentation is a fully detailed description of "what the models are" and by implication of "what the models can do". For each model sample results are appended.

At the present time the User's Guide contains documentation for the National Input-Output Model, the Price Model, the Interprovincial Input-Output Model, and the Energy Model. All of these static input-output-type models are based upon the input-output tables compiled by Statistics Canada on an annual basis.

The Structural Analysis Division maintains a distribution list so that revisions to existing documentation and new chapters can be circulated to model users as they become available.

## Review of the Activities of the Structural Analysis Division

Each year, a review of the activities of the Structural Analysis Division is produced. It includes a list of the working papers that are available from the Division.

Canada Pension Plan, Annual Report. Bilingual. Free.

In addition to regular annual report information, includes general statistics on the plan providing new beneficiaries for the year, total beneficiaries by type of benefit, social insurance cards issined, revenue and expenditure, investment fund, investments by province. number of teneficiaries by type of benefit by province. (Canada Pension Plan, Health and Welfare, Ottawa, K1A 0K 9 ).

Canada Pension Plan - Statistical Bulletin. Quarterly. Bilingual. Free.

Statistical information on the operation of the plan, including number of beneficiaries, benefit payments, average benefit amounts, characteristics of beneficiaries, age, sex, etc. (Financial and Administration Services, Canada Pension Plan, Health and Welfare Canada, Ottawa, K1A 0K9).

## LABOUR CANADA

Collective Bargaining Review. Monthly. English and French Edition. Free.

Review of collective bargaining settlements in Canada by province and industry, showing wage changes and fringe benefits by category and duration of contract, plus a summary of negotiations in progress. (Collective Bargaining Division, Labour Data Branch, Labour Canada, Ottawa K1A 0.J2.)

Labour Gazette. Monthly. English and French $\$ 1.00$ a cups. $\$ 7.50$ a year.

A review of labour affairs in Canada which includes a section on current labour statistics with a summary of strikes and lockouts for Canada during the month. This summary shows current and historic data, including number of events, number of workers involved, man-days, and percentage of estimated working time. Statements are also provided by industry, showing the unions and companies involved and the major dispute issues, (Lahour Canada, Ottawa, Ontario K1A 0J2.)

Labour Organizations in Canada. Annual. Bilingual. $\$ 3.00$ a copy. Catalogue No. L2-2.

Contains a brief commentary, the latest statistical data on union membership, and a directory of labour organizations with names of their principal officers, publications and the geographic distribution of their local branches in Canada. (Labour Organizations Division, Labour Canada, Ottawa K1A 0.J2.)

## Wage Rates, Salaries and Hours of Labour. Annual. Bilingual. Catalogue No L2-5.

Contains the results of the October 1 survey of occupational wage rates and standard hours of work in selected industries. Published in separate booklets containing final data for each of 35 major communities across Canada. In addition to the statistical measures presented in previous years, each booklet shows the median and 1st and 3rd quartiles. Information is also provided by size of establishment and union/non-union office employees. (Economics and Research Branch. Labour Canada, Ottawa K1A 0.J2.)

Working Conditions in Canadian Industry. Annual. Bilingual. $\$ 3.00$ a copy. Catalogue No. L2-15.

Results of the annual survey of wages and working conditions, covering firms of 20 or more employees and showing hours of work, paid holidays, number of employees covered by the collective agreements by province, by industry and divided into broad categories of "office". "non-office" and "other". (Economics and Research Branch, Lahour Canada, Ottawa K1A 0J2.)

## MANPOWER AND IMMIGRATION

Immigration Statistics. Annual. Bilingual. Free. Cata logue No. MP22-1.

Tabulations of immigration by age, sex, marital status, country of last permanent residence, country of birth and citizenship, province of destination and occupation. Also includes some historical tables. More limited statistiss are published on a quarterly hasis in Immigra. tion Statistics Quarterly. (Immigration Division of the Dept. of Manpower and Immigration, Ottawa.)

## NATIONAL ENERGY BOARD

Annual Report, National Energy Board, Ottawa. English and French. Free.

Appendices include new licenses to export and import various energy products, including name of company, point of export, duration of licence, and maximum annual and terminal export volumes, total exports, historical and current, daily averages for oil - imports and net transfers of petroleum to Ontario. (National Energy Board, 473 Albert St., Ottawa, Ontario K1A 0E5.)

## PUBLIC WORKS CANADA

Report of the Dominion Fire Commissioner. Annual. Bilingual. Free.

Shows provincial and federal fire losses and deaths, and losses in forest fires. Property losses by provinces are also given for buildings by occupancy and by type of building. Also included are tabulations of the causes of fires, and a municipal loss record with the number of fires for the year, and total municipal losses per capita. (Dominion Fire Commissioner. Public Works Canada, Confederation Heights, Ottawa, K1A 0M2).

## REVENUE CANADA

Taxation Statistics. Annual. Bilingual. \$4. Catalogue No. RV44.

Tables show returns filed by individual taxpayers for income classes, occupation, age and sex, and for provinces, cities and counties with cross classifications.

## SUPERINTENDENT OF INSURANCE

Reports of the Superintendent of Insurance. Annual. Bilingual.

The Superintendent of Insurance for Canada, Ottawa, issues annual reports on insurance companies, loan and trust companies and small loan companies and money lenders. The report on insurance companies is issued in three volumes. Volume I of this series entitled "Abstracts of Statements of Insurance Companies in Canada" gives general statistics on fire and casualty companies, life insurance and fraternal benefit societies; the other two volumes being detailed statements and accounts for individual fire and casualty, and life insurance companies respectively. (Insurance Department, Ottawa K1A 0 H 2 ).

Cooperative Credit Associations. Annual. Bilingual. .754 a copy, Catalogue No. IN 3-7.

Provides a detailed financial statement for Cooperative Credit Associations to which certificates have been granted under the Cooperative Credit Association Act, showing assets, liabilities, revenues, expenditures, etc. (Superintendent of Insurance, Ottawa, K1A 0H2).

## International Classification of Diseases, Adapted, Eighth Revision, Volume I, Tabular List, 671 pages.

The International Classification of Diseases, adapted for use in the United States (ICDA) is an expanded version of the Eighth Revision of the International Classification of Diseases (ICD) published by WHO. It is designed for the classification of morbidity and mortality information for statistical purposes, and for the indexing of hospital records for data storage and retrieval. The ICDA contains a coding and classification system for surgical operations and procedures not found in the ICD.

International Classification of Diseases, Adapted, Eighth Revision, Volume 2, Alphabetical Index. English and French. 685 pages.

Volume 2 of the International Classification of Diseases, adapted for use in the United States(CDA) is the Alphaletical Index to the Tabular List of Volume I. It is, however, an essential adjunct to the Tabular List, since it contains a great number of diagnostic terms which do not appear in Volume 1.

The English editions of above two publications can be purchased from the Superintendant of Documents, U.S. Government Printing Office, Washington, D.C., 20402. The French-language editions (Cat. $82 \cdot 527 \mathrm{~F}$ and 82. 528 F ) are published by Statistics Canada.

Opportunity for Choice: A Goal for Women in Canada. English and French. $\$ 3.75$ a copy. Catalogue 1C23.15/1976.

This book, produced on behalf of Statisties Canada hy the C.D. Howe Research Institute, had its origins during International Women's Year as a continuing contribution to the role of Women in Canadian Society. It is designed to broaden understanding of the role of women both for the general reader concerned with the place of women in society and for professionals in the disciplines of demography, economics, law, sociology and statistics.

The book contains a presentation of statistics Canada data on women's participation in the family, educational institutions and the labour force and a comprehensive analysis and evaluation of the evidence. It contains an examination of the effectiveness of existing policies and proposes new ones relevant to the role of women. As the title indicates, a theme of the book is the extent to which women, and men, have opportunities to make choices concerning their roles.
