

Introduction

This introduction describes how the catalogue is organized, the catalogue numbering system used and the availability of non-printed data sources. It also indicates additional sources of Statistics Canada products and information services, lists Statistics Canada Regional Reference Centres and depository libraries and, finally, provides instructions for ordering publications.

The Catalogue comprises four major sections: an introduction, a list of discontinued publications, bibliographic descriptions with abstracts for each publication, and a title, subject, commodity and personal author index.

Publication descriptions are organized by catalogue number, and consequently, are grouped by subject. Serial entries include: catalogue number, title, frequency, date of first issue, language(s), series statement where applicable, International Standard Serial Number (ISSN), Dewey Decimal Classification Number and a brief descriptive abstract. Monograph entries include: catalogue number or catalogue number range for those issued in more than one volume, title, statement of responsibility, series statement where applicable, edition statement, pagination, size, date of publication, International Standard Book Number (ISBN), Dewey Decimal Classification Number, and a brief descriptive abstract. Prices are available in a separate listing supplied with this Catalogue.

Publications of the 1981 and 1986 Censuses are grouped by Census year. The third digit of the catalogue numbers identifies which year: 9 for 1981 or 1 for 1986. Thus, catalogue number 92-901 precedes 92-104.

OTHER DATA FORMATS

CANSIM (Canadian socio-economic information management system)

The Electronic Data Dissemination Division (EDDD) is responsible for CANSIM, Statistics Canada's computerized database network and information retrieval service. It provides public access to current and historical statistics in various forms, as well as specialized data manipulation and analysis packages, graphics facilities, and a bibliographic search service.

On-line Access

The CANSIM Time Series Database, or Main Base, offers detailed and conceptually compatible sets of aggregated time series on many subjects, most pertaining to business and the economy. The Main Base, now comprising about 400.000 series, is available to the public at a commercial data processing service bureau. A subset of the complete base, known as the Mini Base, is available from licensed secondary distributors who, in turn, offer the public a wide variety of data access services.

Data Retrieval Services

CANSIM retrieval services are also offered by Statistics Canada personnel. CANSIM time series data can be obtained in conventional tabular formats and in various colour graphic forms. This service adds dimension to the analysis of statistics, and includes many ancillary options for listing and transforming retrieved data.

Further, the Electronic Data Dissemination Division (EDDD) provides retrieval services to meet specific user requirements for data on two other systems. It maintains the CANSIM Cross-classified Database that features statistical tables containing social and economic data, plus the Census Summary Data System that comprises 1971, 1976, 1981 and 1986 Census characteristics for various geographical areas. EDDD staff also distribute Census Summary Tapes.

Microcomputer Products

Many clients use CANSIM data as inputs to spreadsheet or other programs on microcomputers. To accommodate such users, EDDD custom packages data onto microcomputer diskette. Subscribers can download data directly from the Main Base. An electronic fact-sheet retrieval service is also available.

Bibliographic Search Services

EDDD also maintains a bibliographic information search service to produce customized inventories of data for a given topic or group of topics. The information database consists of an online directory of all CANSIM disseminated data and bibliographic references to current publications.



Machine Readable Data Files

A catalogue of Statistical Services, 1988 describes data files from which unpublished data may be requested in various formats. Clients can consult this listing in Regional Reference Centres and in the Statistics Canada Library in Ottawa.

CATALOGUE NUMBERS

Nearly all Statistics Canada publications have a unique five-digit catalogue number to provide easy identification. These numbers are formulated as follows:



First digit*. All publications are classified into one of the following eight major subject groups:

- 1 General
- 2 Primary Industries
- 3 & 4 Manufacturing
- 5 Transportation, Communications and Utilities
- 6 Commerce, Construction, Finance, Prices and Trade
- 7 Employment, Unemployment and Labour
- 8 Education, Culture, Health and Welfare
- 9 Census and Intercensal Studies

Second digit*. Each major group is further divided into a number of sub-groups. For example, Major Group 6: Commerce, Construction, Finance, Prices and Trade, is divided into the sub-groups:

- 1 Business Conditions
- 2 Prices and Consumer Expenditure
- 3 Merchandising and Services
- 4 Construction and Housing
- 5 International Trade
- 6 International Travel
- 7 Balance of Payments and International Investments
- 8 Government Finance

Third Digit. This indicates the frequency of publication.

- 0 Issued more than once a year
- 2 Issued annually
- 4 Issued biennially
- 5 Issued once only or on an occasional basis
- 6 Issued irregularly with various sub-titles
- 1 & 9 Reserved for Census publications

A change in the frequency of a publication will automatically result in a change in the third digit of its catalogue number. However, some lapses have occurred; the Statistics Canada Library has detailed notes available for consultation.

Fourth and Fifth Digits. Sequential numbers are issued to every publication in each sub-group. This ensures every publication has a unique, permanent number.

Suffix "E" or "F". This indicates publications for which separate English and French editions are issued.

The major and sub-group numbers are given in the Catalogue's Table of Contents.

Air Carrier Traffic at Canadian Airports, catalogue number 51-005, is a typical example of how the catalogue numbering system works:

- 5 Major Group: Transportation, Communication and Utilities
- 1 Sub-group: Air Transport
- Frequency: More than once a year. in this case quarterly
- 05 Fifth publication in this group to receive a catalogue number

RETENTION GUIDELINES FOR STATISTICS CANADA PUBLICATIONS IN LIBRARIES

Faced with space constraints and an array of publications with similar titles and varying frequencies. library managers may find it difficult to know which Statistics Canada publications to retain. A set of Retention Guidelines can assist in such decisions.

These guidelines allow libraries to build collections of statistical information which span approximately ten years and contain the most recently revised data. Specific recommendations concern current serials and monographs. Also included are notes about the history of publications, and more general suggestions for discontinued publications. These notes provide sufficient background information to allow managers the latitude of making retention decisions based on their subject requirements.

Separate official guidelines for depository libraries are provided by the Canadian Government Publishing Centre. Managers of depository library collections should refer to these before discarding publications.

The guidelines can be ordered as an entire set, or in individual chapters organized in catalogue number sequence. If further information or advice is required, contact the Statistics Canada Library at (613) 951-8219.

HOW TO GET HELP

CATALOGUES AND GUIDES

This catalogue excludes in-print publications with data more than ten years old, except those with updating supplements; out-of-print publications (except 1981 Census publications); and publications released after March 31, 1988. For information on excluded publications, consult STATCAN or DOBIS described in

the following section, the Current Publications Index, 1986 (11-204E), the Statistics Canada Catalogue, 1985 (11-204E) and annual issues back to 1981, the Historical Catalogue of Statistics Canada Publications 1918-1980 (11-512E), or the Statistics Canada Library reference staff. The Library maintains complete up-to-date and historical records of Statistics Canada publications, both catalogued and non-catalogued.

Other reference products may also help in locating needed statistics or in keeping up-to- date with new releases. They include: The Daily (11-001E), Infomat (11-002E), Listing of Supplementary Documents (11-207), Historical Statistics of Canada (11-516E), Index to the Inventory of Statistics Canada Questionnaires on Microfiches (12-205S), Standard Industrial Classification, 1980 (12-501E), Standard Occupational Classification, 1980 (12-565E), The Standard Geographical Classification, 1986 (12-571 -12-573), Canadian Export Classification (Based on the Harmonized System) (12-578E), Canadian Export-Import Alphabetical Index (Based on the Harmonized System) (12-579E), The Canadian International Trade Classification (65-502E), Products and Services, 1986 Census (99-103E). User's Guide, 1986 Census of Agriculture (96-101).

DOBIS

This catalogue was compiled using DOBIS, an online bibliographic information system managed by the National Library of Canada. DOBIS contains detailed bibliographic descriptions of most of Statistics Canada publications from 1960, and all Census publications dating from 1870. The database is updated daily. Eventually, all Statistics Canada publications will be included to make DOBIS a complete information source for Statistics Canada publications.

STATCAN

STATCAN, Statistics Canada's Catalogue Online, is one of several databases made accessible through CAN/OLE, the National Research Council of Canada's online information retrieval system. Updated quarterly, STATCAN contains complete bibliographic descriptions of most of Statistics Canada publications released since 1960 and Census publications dating back to 1870. Eventually, all historical publications will also be described on the database.

The descriptions, derived from DOBIS, are enhanced with abstracts and with keywords derived from the publication tables themselves. STATCAN is accessible in 1460 centres across Canada, including government, special, academic and public libraries. STATCAN can produce tailored, comprehensive bibliographies of Statistics Canada publications on the topic of your choice. HOW TO ORDER STATISTICS CANADA PUBLICATIONS

How to Subscribe to a Periodical Publication

Clients may subscribe to any Statistics Canada publication that is issued regularly. Within this catalogue such publications are identified as daily, weekly, monthly, quarterly, semi-annual or annual.

To subscribe, enter the subscription price in the "Price" column and "S" in the "Issue No" column of the order form provided. You will receive a copy of all new issues of the publications you have ordered, as they are released during the next 12 months. It should be noted that your subscription will begin with the issue following receipt of your order. If you require an earlier issue, order separately. In the case of annuals, you may wish to purchase separate copies of recently released titles.

Purchasing Back Issues

Statistics Canada offers a 70% discount off the list price of most back issues. A back issue is any publication that has been replaced by a more up-to-date issue.

The discount excludes *Infomat, The Daily, Survey Methodology* and the latest four issues of *Canadian Social Trends*. It is offered on a first-come-first-serve basis because there will be no reprints of back issues.

A pre-paid minimum order of \$20 is necessary to purchase these discounted publications. Orders can be placed at your nearest Regional Reference Centre, or by calling 1-613-951-7276. All sales are final.

How to Order a Single Issue of a Periodical Publication

Clients sometimes choose to order a single issue of a periodical publication before subscribing for an entire year. To do so, enter the publication's copy price in the "Price" column of the order form. A copy of the most recent issue will be sent.

How to Order a Single Copy of an Occasional. Biennial or Supplementary Publication

DESCRIPTIONS OF REPORTS

The publications resulting from the 1985 Census of Manufactures incorporate a major change in structure from that of previous years. As a result of this, 73 separate industry publications have been replaced by:

- a) 20 new industry group publications providing commodity input and output data;
- b) some 230 two-page industry bulletins providing principal operating statistics such as financial and employment data for each individual publication number for the industry group.

Each bulletin is further identified by the Standard Industrial Classification number for each industry included in that particular grouping.

For example, 32-250B SIC 1011 The Food Industry: Meat and Meat Products Industry (except poultry).

All publication numbers for the Census of Manufactures publications in the new format end with -250, -251 or -252.

The two-page bulletins each contain three tables which are identical in content and format to tables 1, 2 and 3 of the discontinued publications. The data from table 1 of each bulletin is also aggregated for each industry group and published as table 1 of the new industry group publications.

The content of tables 4 and 5 of the discontinued publications has been reformatted to make it easier to use and is displayed in tables 2 to 5 of the new industry group publications

This new publishing format allows improved timeliness of Census of Manufactures products. Now, users have the option of purchasing an individual bulletin containing information about one specific industry. Alternatively, the information can be purchased as a complete set for the industry group. Institutions assembling collections of Statistics Canada publications should note that each set of bulletins plus each new industry group publications assembled together constitutes one publication and should be treated as such.
