THE INFORMATION YOU PROVIDE IN THE SURVEY CAN HELP TO ANSWER QUESTIONS, SUCH AS:

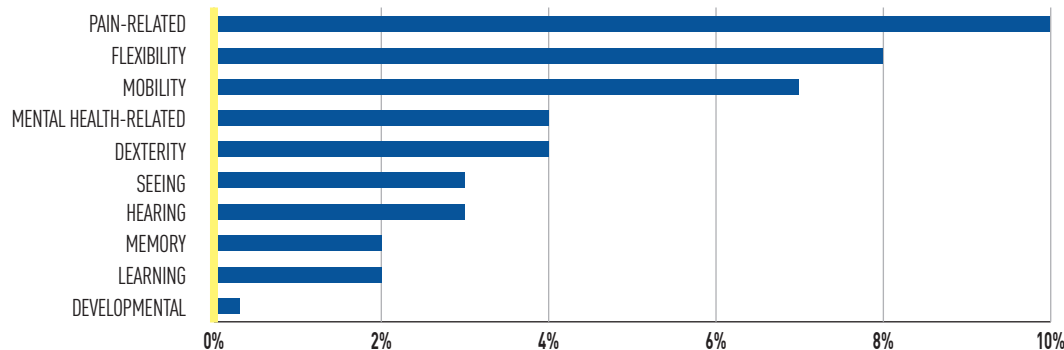
- Do people with disabilities have the aids or assistive devices they need to succeed?

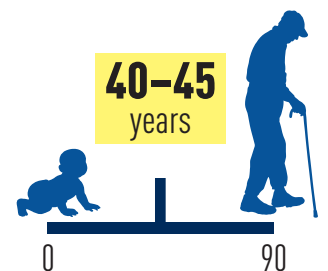
Canadians aged 15 years and older reported a **DISABILITY**. This represents about...



MOST COMMON DISABILITIES ARE RELATED TO PAIN, FLEXIBILITY AND MOBILITY



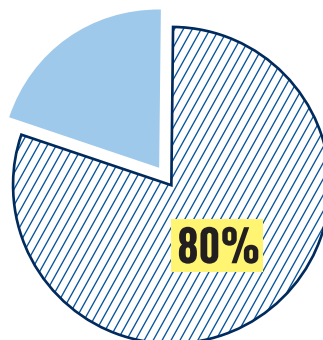
The average age of onset of disabilities reported is the **EARLY 40s**.
