


150 YEARS OF CANADIAN AGRICULTURE



Since Confederation (1867), the number of agricultural operations in Canada has shrunk, but agricultural operations have grown in acreage and sales.

Farm sales - 1900 and 2015 Year Total farm sales in Canada Average sales per farm 1900 \$364.9 million \$714 *In 1900, one dozen eggs cost \$0.26, and one loaf of bread cost \$0.04. 2015 \$69.4 billion \$358,503

4 pigs

7 head of cattle

33 acres of cropland



in 2016

73 pigs


65 head of cattle

483 acres of cropland



What's changed in 150 years?

Canada had 14 times as much wheat, 10 times as many pigs and 5 times as many cattle in 2016 as in 1871.

There were 3 times more horses in 1871 as in 2016.
