

INTRODUCTION

CANSIM¹ (Canadian Socio-economic Information Management System) is Statistics Canada's computerized data bank and its supporting software. The CANSIM Summary Reference Index is the first step in obtaining series from the CANSIM Main Base. This reference manual summarizes the data bank contents by subject and source publication and provides primary (Matrix) identification numbers which form the key to the second reference manual, the CANSIM Main Base Series Directory, which lists the entire 200,000 time series contained in CANSIM in matrix number order. A "matrix" in CANSIM contains a group of related time series and is equivalent to a "table" in a publication.

As shown in the "Guide to Effective Use of the CANSIM Main Base Series Directory" on Page iv, the Directory contains titles and descriptive detail for each matrix and its component series. There are two identifiers for each series on the CANSIM Main Base: the series number to the left of the series title combines with the matrix number to form the CANSIM Identification Number, while the number at the right is the Databank Identification Number. Either the CANSIM or Databank identifier may be used to retrieve a series from the CANSIM Main Base.

NOTE: The Summary Reference Index is published once per year. As data are added to the CANSIM Main Base, amendments are published. If you would like your name added to our mailing list in order to receive amendments or if you require further information, please contact CANSIM (613-995-7406), Statistics Canada, Ottawa, Ontario K1A 0Z8.

HOW TO USE CANSIM REFERENCE MANUALS

As noted in the Introduction, time series identification numbers are necessary for data retrieval and manipulation. In a few cases, these identifiers are provided in the Bank of Canada Review or in the Statistics Canada publication in which the series are released in printed form, as shown in the following extract from the Canadian Statistical Review.

Databank Identification Numbers

If the publication does not list the required time series identification numbers, then they must be obtained from the CANSIM Main Base Series Directory. The "Guide to Effective Use of the CANSIM Main Base Series Directory" on Page iv illustrates the components of an entry in the Series Directory and explains the function of matrices, matrix headers, footnotes, CANSIM Identification Numbers, Databank Identification Numbers, etc. The CANSIM Main Base currently contains more than 200,000 time series, each of which is listed in this directory in matrix number order. The object, then, is to find the relevant matrix. This may be accomplished either by thumbing through the entire three volumes of the Main Base Series Directory or, more effectively, by referring to the Summary Reference Index.

The way in which the Summary Reference Index is to be used, will depend on the knowledge you bring to the search. If you know that Statistics Canada produces the series, you may also know the number of the catalogue in which the series is published. If so, refer to Appendix C of the Summary Reference Index which is a list of catalogue numbers of the Statistics Canada publications represented in CANSIM. If the publication is not listed, the required series is not available on CANSIM, and no further search of CANSIM documentation is necessary. If a publication is listed in Appendix C, this does not always mean that all data from that publication are available. Only a few summary series are available from some of the publications listed.

If the relevant publication is listed in Appendix C, or if you know that Statistics Canada produces the series but you do not know the number of the catalogue in which it is published, refer to the Table of Contents of the Summary Reference Index. While Appendix C provides information by catalogue number, the Table of Contents is organized by subject or area of interest. Read through the thirteen major subject areas listed and identify the one that is of interest to you. Each subject area is further divided into several subsections. Choose the subsection which seems most likely to include the data that you require. The subsection entitled "Canadian Statistical Review and Historical Summary" includes data from 150 catalogues pulled together and published in the Canadian Statistical Review; these publications are all listed separately in Appendix C.

Each entry in the Table of Contents includes the page number in the Summary Reference Index where the matrices available from the corresponding publication will be recorded. (Remember that a matrix roughly corresponds to a table in a publication). Matrices of seasonally-adjusted data are differentiated from those containing unadjusted data. Terminated matrices, that is, those for which updates have been discontinued, are indicated by an asterisk. Table numbers refer to the source publication.

If you want all available CANSIM data on a given subject, or in a given area of analysis, your first step is to refer to the Table of Contents of the Summary Reference Index and identify that subject or its closest counterpart among the categories provided. The remaining steps of the search procedure are the same as described above.

III PRICES AND PRICE INDEXES(1)

REVISION BASED ON 1967 EXPENDITURES

Commencing with the May 1973 index, Canadian Consumer price indexes incorporate the latest in a series of periodic updatings which characterize their development since the early 1900's. A feature of the latest revision is the inclusion of updated weights to reflect 1967 family expenditure patterns (and within the food component, 1969 spending habits), replacing the 1957 weights used previously.

To maintain a continuous, long-term series, the revised index is linked to the previously published index for April 1973. Thus the published index up to and including April 1973 remains the official measure of consumer prices to that month, and subsequent price movements are measured by the revised index.

Full details of the latest weighting pattern and other background information on the revised Consumer Price Index, including a comparison of the movements of both the old and the revised series since 1967, are contained in a paper entitled The Consumer Price Index for Canada (1961=100), (Revision Based on 1967 Expenditures), (62-539), Occasional, Price \$0.75, available from the Publication Distribution Unit, Statistics Canada, Ottawa.

In keeping with the Statistics Canada policy of periodically updating indexes to more current periods, consumer price indexes were converted to a 1971=100 time reference base beginning with the month of August 1975. This replaced the base of 1961=100 which had been in effect since January 1969.

C. Job Vacancy Survey

The Quarterly Job Vacancies Survey presents job vacancy data series from the fourth quarter 1970 to the present. The survey covers all industrial sectors, except agriculture, fishing and trapping, domestic service and the non-civilian component of public administration and defence.

Vacancy Categories

Vacancies all categories (TV): vacancies for full-time, casual, part time, seasonal and temporary jobs.
Vacancies for full-time jobs (FT): vacancies for jobs with minimum duration of four full standard work weeks or full standard work month.

Longer-term Vacancies (LT): vacancies for full-time jobs, which have been unfilled for one month or more.

Occupation classification is based on the Canadian Classification and Dictionary of Occupations 1971 (CCDO).

Industrial classification is based on the 1960 Standard Industrial Classification.

Job vacancy rates: Job vacancy rates are obtained by expressing the number of vacancies per thousand existing jobs in all industries, except agriculture, fishing and trapping, domestic service and the non-civilian component of public administration and defence.

Three month moving averages centered on the specific month are calculated by progressively dropping the earliest month and adding the latest.

Reliability of estimates: Selection of publishable groups is based on the reliability of data, which in turn, is dependent on the size of the estimates. Where at least two-thirds of the estimates in a series are 500 or above, all the estimates in that series will be published including those below 500. Due to their lower reliability, users should treat estimates below 500 with appropriate caution. The per cent standard deviations for estimates below 500 are as follows:

VI CAPITAL AND FINANCE(1)

A. Industrial Corporations, Financial Statistics, (61-003), Quarterly

The historical quarterly financial statistics for Industrial Corporations from 1962-69 inclusive were published in June 1970. Subsequent quarterly publications are available for the years 1970 and 1971 including data in the same format as that in the 1962-1969 historical publication.

In the first quarter 1972 a comprehensive revision of the quarterly survey questionnaire was made. This resulted in revisions to the table formats included in the quarterly publication. The CANSIM matrices for 1st quarter 1962 to 1st quarter 1972 have been terminated, and new matrices and series established as of first quarter 1970. B. Capacity Utilization Rates In Canadian Manufacturing

The capacity utilization rates are given by major group according to the 1970 Standard Industrial Classification, for a period going back to 1961.

The definition of capacity in this procedure is the maximum output obtainable under normal technological and market conditions.

The methodology used to produce these indexes is based on a comparison of the actual output of an industry during a certain time period with the estimated capacity output during that period.

The estimated capacity output is based on a capacity capital-output ratio derived from the industry's gross stock of fixed capital, measured in 1971 dollars. These capital stock estimates are produced by the National Wealth and Capital Stock Section of Statistics Canada.
