## INTRODUCTION

Purpose: The Export Commodity Classification supersedes the old Statistical Classification - Exports which was introduced in 1919. It provides a new framework within which more satisfactory export statistics can be developed, and advances the modernization and improvements of the list of commodity classes for which export statistics are available. It is also hoped that, once respondents have become accustomed to the new framework, this classification will simplify the task of providing the proper statistical information on the B-13 customs entry.

Structure of the Classification: The structure of the Export Commodity Classification differs greatly from that of its predecessor. It is divided into seven "Sections", as follows:

Section I, Live Animals, contains all live animals except live fish and other seafoods shipped for use as food, which are included in Section II.

Section II, Food, Feed, Beverages and Tobacco, contains all other commodities whose chief end use is as food, feed, beverages or tobacco. Because any commodity at one stage of processing is located in only one place in this classification, certain non-food grades of chiefly food commodities (e.g. seed wheat and seed potatoes) are classified in this Section, and certain food grades of chiefly non-food commodities (e.g. edible tallow and vegetable oils) are excluded. Within this Section the commodities are further classified by component material and stage of processing.

Section III, Crude Materials, Inedible, contains all commodities whose chief use is as materials for industry, and which have not been processed beyond the stage of cleaning, sorting or concentrating, together with the synthetic equivalents of some natural materials. Examples of the commodities included in this Section are fur skins, seeds (except seed grades of food commodities), natural rubber, logs, pulpwood, textile fibres (including synthetic fibres), metallic ores, concentrates and scrap, crude petroleum, and asbestos fibres. Within this Section the commodities are further classified by component material. Waste and scrap materials that are customarily used like particular crude materials are included with those materials; other waste and scrap materials are grouped together at the end of this Section.

Section IV, Fabricated Materials, Inedible, contains all commodities which have passed the preliminary stages of processing but which are still used chiefly as materials in some later industrial process. Some commodities in this Section are highly processed and the chief part of their value may be derived from manufacturing. But all have in common the basic characteristic of materials, i.e., they will be involved in further processing before reaching the form in which their end use is served. Examples of the commodities included in this Section are dressed furs, vegetable oils, rubber belting, lumber, plywood, millwork, pulp and paper, textile yarns and piece goods, chemicals, fertilizers, plastics and synthetic rubber, metal ingots, sheets, pipe, wire and hardware, petroleum fuels and asbestos brake linings. Within this Section the commodities are further classified chiefly by component material.

Section V, End Products, Inedible, contains all commodities which will not lose their identity through further processing, and which are commonly regarded as articles rather than as materials, together with finished identifiable parts, attachments and accessories of these articles (which are classified together with the articles themselves unless otherwise specified). Examples of the commodities included in this Section are machinery, vehicles, electrical apparatus, clothing (including fur clothing), drugs and medicines, paper goods and printed matter, and shipping and distribution containers. Within this Section the commodities are further classified chiefly by principal use or function.

The distinction between fabricated materials and end products is perhaps the greatest innovation embodied in this classification, but the principles underlying this distinction can be illustrated by considering the difference between a nail and a needle. The nail is of no use by itself; it becomes useful only in connection with other materials and then it has lost its identity as a nail by being incorporated with those other materials into something quite different from any of them. The needle, on the other hand, is used with other materials but emerges from that use still a needle which is useful again for the same purpose. In this sense the nail is a fabricated material and the needle an end product.

Section VI, Special Transactions - Trade, contains special types of transaction, essentially commercial in nature, which are not, for various reasons, classified by commodity in trade statistics: Some export packing, contractors' outfits, and small value shipments. The value of these transactions is included in published totals of Canadian exports.

Section VII, Special Transactions - Non-Trade, contains special types of transaction which do not have an international financial implication or which, for various reasons, are better considered separately from merchandise trade in economic analysis: gold, settlers' effects and tourist purchases are among the components of this Section. The value of these transactions is not included in published totals of Canadian trade. However, statistics on these classes are compiled because they have certain important uses apart from the regular statistics of Canadian trade.

Relation to Other Classifications: The Export Commodity Classification is based on the Standard Commodity Classification which was developed in the Dominion Bureau of Statistics as a tool for integrating statistical series derived from different sources. Every class, group and division in Sections I - V of the Export Commodity Classification is defined in terms of the Standard Commodity Classification, and it will now be possible to relate export statistics to the Standard Commodity Classification and, through it, to other series compiled by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics on the same basis. Sections VI and VII of the Export Commodity Classification are reserved for special transactions which have no exact counterpart in other series or which, for special reasons, must be excluded from regular totals of Canadian export trade.

It was necessary to modify extensively the detail shown in the Standard Commodity Classification in adapting it for use in the compilation of export statistics, but the basic structure of the Export Commodity Classification remains almost identical with that of its parent. It retains all the Sections and almost all the divisions of the Standard Commodity Classification, and many groups and even classes are identical in the two. Where sub-sections, sub-divisions and sub-groups appear in the Standard Commodity Classification, these have also been retained whenever possible. The summary of the Export Commodity Classification which follows this introduction (pp. 9-19) can readily be compared with the corresponding summary in the Standard Commodity Classification, Vol.I.

For the convenience of those familiar with the old Statistical Classification - Exports, each class of the Export Commodity Classification indicates the class numbers under which goods were recorded prior to January 1, 1961. Whenever a former class number is starred (\*), this indicates that only part of the former class is included with the new class. In cases where "various" appears instead of a former class number, the former codes are listed in a table at the end of this manual.

Units of Quantity: In preparing this classification, a systematic effort has been made to select units of quantity which can readily be reported and which can be made uniform as between export and import statistics; and as far as possible uniform units of quantity have been used in any group of the classification to facilitate mechanical methods of tabulation. Weight and number are the most commonly used units since one or both of these is normally available for any export or import shipment, but in some cases measures of volume, area or length are used to conform with prevailing industrial practice. Generally, weight is the most common measure of quantity in Sections II, III and IV of the classification, number in Sections I and V. In any case where no other unit of quantity is clearly indicated by the classification, the weight of the shipment should be reported on the B-13 customs entry.

The treatment of parts, attachments and accessories mentioned above in the discussion of Section V affects the interpretation of units of number used in this Section. Whenever finished parts, attachments and accessories of a commodity are included with the commodity in a single class, the value of the class covers the total value of all shipments of the commodity including parts, attachments and accessories, but the unit of number refers only to the number of complete units exported. For such classes the average value per unit can not be calculated.

For canned foods the statistical unit of quantity is shown as net weight. This means that the weight of all containers, including the cans, should be omitted in reporting, and only the weight of the contents of the cans shown. The use of this unit has been recommended by producers and processors of food commodities, and it is hoped that it will prove generally feasible for export and import statistics as well as for statistics of domestic production and inventories.

Throughout this classification the term "canned" means preserved by reason of being shut off from contact with air. It therefore includes all food preserved in hermetically sealed containers, whether these be made of metal or of glass, and also foods packed in plastic wrappings and preserved solely by sealing against penetration by air. However it does not include frozen foods packed in hermetically sealed metal containers since these are preserved by reason of being frozen rather than by reason of being shut off from contact with air. Likewise foods wrapped and sealed in plastic materials but which must be kept under refrigeration are not included as "canned".

Format: This classification is issued in loose-leaf format, punched to fit any standard 3-ring binder. As revisions are made to the classification, the relevant pages will be reprinted and may be obtained from the Dominion Bureau of Statistics. It is expected that this practice will reduce the need for frequent reprinting of the whole classification.

## INDEX OF EXPORT COMMODITY CLASSIFICATION

The purpose of the alphabetical index on the following pages is to assist the user of the Export Commodity Classification in finding the appropriate class for a specific commodity. Each class has a five digit code number: the first three digits of the code indicate the group under which the commodity falls and the final two digits give the class. Both this classification and the monthly export reports list the classes in numerical order.

Most entries in this index show the code of an individual class, e.g., binder twine, class number 369-05. In many instances, however, the user is directed to the group or groups under which a commodity may be found, e.g., boats and parts, 590- or animal feeds 151- to 157-. This is partly to avoid an unnecessarily lengthy list of individual classes and partly to ensure that the user makes a proper selection amongst the related classes in cases where a general category of goods is divided among numerous classes. By reference to the various classes enumerated under the indicated group or groups, and to the adjacent explanatory notes where required, the appropriate commodity classification can usually be determined.

The index relates to the original printing of the Export Commodity Classification and has not yet been revised to take account of various changes in the Classification made between January 1, 1961 and January 1, 1964.
