

## FARM CASH INCOME FROM THE SALE OF FARM PRODUCTS 1

According to preliminary estimates, Canadian farmers (excluding Newfoundland) received during the first quarter of 1952, a total of 585.5 million dollars from the sale of farm products and from wheat adjustment and participation payments on previous years' crops. This estimate compares with 414.8 million received during the same period in 1950 and 494.4 million in 1951. In addition, supplementary payments made to western farmers under the provisions of the Prairie Farm Assistance Act amounted to 1.8 million dollars during the January - March period 1952 and compares with 12.7 million and 7.9 million dollars paid out during the respective periods of 1950 and 1951.

The increase in farmers' first-quarter receipts in 1952 over those of 1951 amounted to 18.4 per cent and occurred for the most part in to the Prairie Provinces, particularly Saskatchewan and Alberta. Two factors have largely contributed to this substantial increase. First of all, marketings of western grain were unusually heavy during the first three months of this year. This situation developed as a result of bumper prairie grain crops and adverse weather conditions which delayed harvesting and, deliveries far beyond their normal seasons. Income from the sale of wheat totalling 82.1 million dollars in 1952 compares with 34.3 million realized a year earlier. Income from the other grains also displayed significant gains. Secondly, the Canadian Wheat Board distributed to farmers nearly 49 million dollars in the form of wheat payments during the first quarter of this year. This payment compares with a total payment of about 18 million dollars made on wheat, oats and barley during the corresponding period of 1951.

Income from the sale of live stock in 1952 at 205.3 million dollars is 14.7 per cent below the figure of 240.6 for 1951. Contributing to this decline were smaller marketings of all live stock except lambs and hogs and a lowering of all prices except those for sheep. Increased production and prices provided an income from the sale of dairy products of 68.4 million dollars during the first three months of 1952, 8.8 per cent above the estimate of 62.8 million for 1951. Increased sales of eggs were almost offset by a decline in prices and income from this source in 1952 was not greatly changed from that of 1951.

Increases in cash income were registered for all provinces except Nova Scotia and British Columbia where the estimates were only slightly below those of a year ago. In absolute terms and on a percentage basis the greatest gain occurred in Saskatchewan followed by Alberta,

In Table 1 below, is summarized the preliminary estimate of cash income from the sale of farm products, by provinces, for the first quarters of 1951 and 1952, and revised estimates for 1950. Tables 2, 3 and 4, overleaf, present farm cash income by commodity sources for each province in the three years and include supplementary payments. No information is available for Newfoundland.

The estimates are based on reports of marketings and prices received by farmers for principal farm products and are subject to revisions as more complete data become available. The estimates include amounts paid out as grain participation, adjustment and equalization payments and those Dominion and Provincial payments which farmers receive as subsidies to prices. Payments made under the provisions of the Prairie Farm Assistance Act are not included in the totals for "Cash Income from the Sale of Farm Products", but are included in the grand totals in the year in which payments are made under the heading "Supplementary Payments".
