

## FARM CASH INCOME

## FARM CASH INCOME FROM THE SALE OF FARM PRODUCTS, JANUARY-SEPTEMBER, 1952 1/

Farmers' receipts from the sale of farm products and from adjustment and participation payments on previous years' grain crops amounted to 1,840.3 million dollars, during the first nine months of 1952. This estimate is about 2.0 per cent below the corresponding 1951 figure of 1,876.6 million dollars, but is well above the 1950 estimate of 1,489.9 million dollars. In addition, supplementary payments made to western farmers under the provisions of the Prairie Farm Assistance Act amounted to only 4.5 million dollars during the first nine months of 1952 as against 13.7 million and 10.1 million dollars received during the respective periods of 1950 and 1951.

The decline in farm cash income during the first nine months of this year as compared with the same period a year ago is due largely to smaller grain participation and adjustment payments and a substantial decline in receipts from the sale of live stock, poultry and eggs. Although insufficient to offset these declines, total returns from the sale of field crops during the first three quarters of 1952 were well above those of 1951. Participation and adjustment payments on western grains during the January-September period of 1952 amounted to 64.6 million dollars as against 184.1 million for the same period of 1951. Significantly lower live stock prices together with smaller marketings of all classes of live stock except hogs provided cash returns from these products of 560.8 million dollars 24.2 per cent below the 1951 level. Lower egg prices more than offset increased sales and the income from this source was 70.7 million dollars as against 93.7 million in 1951. Contributing significantly to the increased returns from grains were the exceptionally large amounts of western grain harvested and marketed last spring. Income from the sale of potatoes was up as a result of higher prices. Receipts from dairy products were slightly higher than a year ago.

A comparison of farm cash income by quarters for 1951 and 1952 shows that gains were registered for the first and third quarters of 1952 amounting to 13.0 and 5.0 per cent respectively. More than offsetting this was the substantial decline of 17.4 per cent in the second quarter. The gain in the first quarter receipts of 1952 is largely attributable to the unusually heavy marketing of grains in the Prairie Provinces and substantial participation and adjustment payments more than offsetting a marked decline in returns from the sale of live stock. Two items appear to be largely responsible for the decline in the second quarter total. Whereas nearly 165.0 million dollars were paid out in the form of participation and adjustment payments during this period of 1951, only about 15.0 million dollars were paid in the same period of 1952.

These heavy payments in 1951 arose from the final settlement of the five-year, Canada-United Kingdom wheat agreement. Lower marketings of cattle and calves together with a general and substantial drop in average live-stock prices also contributed to the second quarter decline. The heavier-than-normal marketings of western grains which occurred during the first half of 1952 were continued in the third quarter. This together with increased returns from the sale of potatoes and vegetables more than outweighed reduced income from the sales of live stock, dairy products, poultry and eggs.

Farm cash income from the sale of farm products was down in Nova Scotia, Quebec, Ontario, Manitoba and British Columbia; in absolute terms the greatest decline occurred in Ontario while on a percentage basis it took place in Nova Scotia. For the remaining provinces farm cash income was up, with the greatest gain in absolute terms occurring in Saskatchewan and on a percentage basis in Prince Edward Island.

The estimates are based on reports of marketings and prices received by farmers for principal farm products and are subject to revisions as more complete data become available. The estimates include amounts paid out as grain participation, adjustment and equalization payments and those Dominion and Provincial payments which farmers receive as subsidies to prices. Payments made under the provisions of the Prairie Farm Assistance Act are not included in the totals for "Cash Income from the Sale of Farm Products", but are included in the grand totals in the year in which payments are made under the heading "Supplementary Payments".
