

APRIL TO JUNE 1953



It is estimated that during the first half of 1953 Canadian farmers (excluding Newfoundland farmers) realized 1,173.7 million dollars from the sale of farm products and from grain adjustment and participation payments on previous years' crops. This estimate is less than one per cent below the corresponding 1952 figure of 1,181.9 million dollars, but about 5 per cent below the 1951 estimate of 1,237.8 million dollars. Supplementary payments made to western farmers under the provisions of the Prairie Farm Assistance Act amounted to only 1.1 million dollars during the first half of 1952 as against 9.3 million and 2.4 million dollars received during the respective periods of 1951 and 1952.

The most important gains in cash receipts were recorded for wheat, dairy products, eggs and interim payments for western wheat and barley. The offsetting declines were largely accounted for by oats, potatoes, tobacco and hogs.

A large farm carry-over of the 1952 wheat crop into the spring of 1953 provided marketings during the first six months almost equal to those of the corresponding period of a year ago. However, a better quality crop in 1952 than in 1951 commanded a somewhat higher price and contributed largely to the increase in cash returns from this source - from 231.1 million dollars in 1952 to 243.7 million in 1953. The gain of nearly 8.0 million dollars in receipts from the sale of dairy products resulted from higher production more than offsetting lower prices. The rise in egg receipts from 47.0 million dollars during the first half of 1952 to 61.5 million for the same period of this year was due to a combination of increased marketings and higher prices.

Cash income from the sale of potatoes suffered a greater decline than any other single commodity during the January-June period of 1953 - dropping from 31.2 million dollars during the 1952 period to 18.7 million dollars this year. A substantial reduction in potato prices from the unusually high level of a year ago was responsible for this significant decrease. Cash receipts from hogs provided the next most significant decline when they dropped approximately 7.0 per cent to 149.1 million dollars. Although prices averaged higher during the first six months of this year, marketings were considerably lower. Farmers income from the sale of oats at 23.5 million dollars was nearly 11.0 million dollars below the level of the first half of 1952. Much smaller marketings more than offset slightly higher prices. A smaller crop and reduced prices combined to provide an income from tobacco approximately 13.0 per cent below the 1952 level of 52.5 million dollars.

Farm cash income from the sale of farm products was down in all provinces except Nova Scotia and Saskatchewan. In absolute terms the greatest decline occurred in Quebec while on a percentage basis it took place in Prince Edward Island. Income was up in Nova Scotia by nearly 3.0 per cent and in Saskatchewan by more than 14.0 per cent.

The estimates are based on reports of marke tings and prices received by farmers for principal farm products and are subject to revisions as more complete data become available. The estimates include amounts paid out as grain participation, adjustment and equalization payments and those Dominion and Provincial payments which

farmers receive as subsidies to prices. Payments made under the provisions of the Prairie Farm Assistance Act are not included in the totals for "Cash Income from the Sale of Farm Products", but are included in the grand totals in the year in which payments are made under the heading "Supplementary Payments".
