## CASH TNCOME FROM THE SATE OF FARM PRODUCTS, 1954 I/

It is estimated that during 1954 Canada's farm cash income from the sale of farm products (excluding Newfoundland) amounted to $2,377.8$ million dollars; this incluces participation payments made on previous years' western grain crops. This estimate is 14.3 per cent below the revised figure of $2,776.0$ million dollars for 1953 and 16.5 per cent below the all-time nigh of $2,849.3$ million dollars establisned in 1952. Nearly all of tre reduction in farm cash income took place in the Prairie Provinces and it occurred largely as a result of a substantial decrease in the marketings of grains, particularly wheat, and lower prices for both wheat and barley. The declines in these provinces ranged from about 15 per cent in Nanitobe to approximately 36 per cent in Saskatchewan. Income in Ontario, the only other province with reduced receipts in 1954, was down by only 2 per cent. Gains were registered for the remaining provinces ranging from less than one per cent in British Columbia to about 5 ber cent in Prince Edward Island. Supplementary payments made to western farmers under the provisions of the Prairie Farm Assistance Act amounted to 2.4 million dollars in 1954 as comparea with 1.6 million dollars in 1953 and 5.1 million in 1952.

Field Crovs the decline in income from the sale of wheat, from 654.1 milion dollars in 1953 to 322.6 million dollars in 1954, constituted tae greatest decitre ior gry single comodity. Farmers deliveries during the year totalled about 298 million bushels, only a little more than one Lelf of the amount delivered during the previous year. Wheat prices, too, were below the 1953 level. Wheat participation payments at 97.4 million dollars compared with 125.4 million for 1953. The 1954 bayments included the 10.9 cents per busnel final payment on marketings of the 1952 crop and the 10 cents per bushel interim payment on marketings of the 1953 crop. Income from the sale of coarse grains was also substantially below tiat of a year earlier as a result of lower marketings of ats and barley and lower prices for barley. In addition, participation payments for these two grains were down significantly in 1954. Smaller returns were also obtained from the sale of rye, corn, potatoes, vegetables and sugar beets. On the other hand, some increase in income was realized from the sale of flaxseed, nay, tobacco, and clover and grass seed.

Live Stock In contrast to the generally lower income from the sale of field crops, receipts from the sale of live stock during 1954 amounted to 705.1 million dollars, about 7 per cent above the previous year's estimate. Contributing to this gain were increased marketings of all classes of live stock and inigher prices for hogs. Prices for other live-stock classes averaged below the 1953 level.

Dairy Products Income from dairy products in 1954 is estimated at a new record high level of 426.2 million dollars, 2.5 per cent above the previous high level of 415.9 million dollars established a year earlier. Increased production more than offset slightly lower prices. Production increases in 1954 were attributable to a continued increase in milk cow numbers and excellent pasture conditions throughout most of the growing seeson.

Poultry \& Eggs A drop of about 18 per cent in the receipts from the sale of eggs represented the greatest reduction in income of aly of the livestock products. Substantially lower prices more than offset higher marketings to give a total income of 112.2 million dollars in 1954 as comparea with 136.3 million in 1953. On the other Land income from poultry meat at 136.5 mlllion dollars was slightly above the 1953 receipts of 134.2 million dollars.

[^0]The estimates contained herein are besed on reports of marketings and prices received by farmers for principal farm products and are subject to revision as more complete data become available. The estimates include the amounts paid on account of wheat participation certificates, osts and barley equalization and adjustment payments and those Federal and Provircial Government payments which farmers receive as subsidies to prices. Payments made under the provisions of the Prairie Farm Assistance act are not included with cash income from tise sale of farm products but are included in total cash income in tie year in which payments were made, being classified as "Supplementary Payments".

In Table 1 below, is summarized the preliminary estimate of casd income from the sale of farm proaucts, by provinces, for the calendar year 1954 , and revised estimates for 1952 and 1953. 1ables 2, 3 and 4 present farm casa income by commodity sources for each province in tine three years and incluae supplementary payments. No information is avallable for Newfoundland.

NOCE: - Warketing estimates for live stock and some live-stock Droducts for $195 \overline{2,1953}$ and 1954 are based on 1951 census data. Consequently, income estimates for these commodities for these years are not strictly comparable with earlier years.
