
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
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

FARM CASH INCOME FROM THE SALE OF FARM PRODUCTS, JANUARY - SEPTEMBER, 1955

A preliminary estimate indicates that during the first nine months of 1955, farm cash income from the sale of farm products and participation payments on previous years' grain crops amounted to 1,667.5 million dollars. This preliminary estimate compares with 1,657.3 million dollars realized during the same period of 1954 and the all-time high January - September total of 1,963.8 million dollars established in 1953. Increase in cash income occurred in all provinces except Quebec Manitoba and Saskatchewan. On a commodity basis the more important increases in cash returns were recorded for wheat, flaxseed, potatoes, tobacco, cattle and calves, dairy products and eggs. The more important reductions occurred in the case of participation payments, oats, barley and hogs. In addition to cash income from the sale of farm products, supplementary payments made under the provisions of the Prairie Farm Assistance Act to farmers in western Canada during the first nine months of 1955 amounted to 32.5 million dollars; this compared with 1.1 million and 2.3 million dollars received during the corresponding periods of 1953 and 1954 respectively.

Field Crops Farmers cash income from the sale of wheat during the January - September period of 1955 amounted to 262.8 million dollars as against 213.7 million for the corresponding period of a year ago; substantially higher marketings more that offset lower average prices. Wheat participation payments totalling 25.7 million dollars during the first nine months of this year compared with 58.4 million received during the same period of 1954. Partially offsetting the smaller wheat payments were interim payments on oats and barley amounting to 11.1 million dollars. Marketings of both oats and barley up to the end of September this year were very much below the level of the 1954 marketings for the same period. Although average prices for these two grains were somewhat higher in 1955 than in 1954 they were only a partial offset to the reduced marketings, with the result that the total returns from these products amounted to 66.5 million dollars, 36.4 per cent below the 104.6 million dollars realized a year ago. A remarkable increase in marketings of flaxseed together with somewhat higher average prices provided an income from this commodity of 15.6 million dollars in 1955, nearly three times that for the first nine months of 1954. Income from the sale of potatoes at 26.7 million dollars compared with 18.0 million dollars received during the period January - September 1954. Substantially higher average prices more than offset somewhat lower marketings.

Live Stock Cash income from the sale of live stock during the first nine months of this year totalled 493.4 million dollars, 4.8 per cent below the total of 518.5 million dollars received during the same period of 1954. Lower returns from hogs more than offset increased income from the sale of other live stock. Although marketings of hogs were above the 1954 level, they were more than offset by much lower prices. In the case of cattle, slight increases were recorded for both prices and marketings.

Live-stock Products Income from the sale of dairy products, estimated at 337.0 million dollars for the first nine months of 1955 compares with the 1954 estimate for the same period of 332.5 million dollars. Farm income from the sale of eggs at 86.3 million dollars so far this year is also running somewhat above the 1954 level as a result of slightly higher marketings and prices.

The estimates contained herein are based on reports of marketings and prices received by farmers for principal farm products and are subject to revision as more complete data become available. They include in the period in which paid, grain participation payments and those Federal and Provincial Government payments which farmers receive as subsidies to prices. Payments made under the provisions of the Prairie Farm Assistance Act are not included with cash income from the sale of farm products but are included in total cash income in the year in which payments were made, being classified as "Supplementary Payments."

In Table I below is summarized the preliminary estimate of cash income from the sale of farm products, by provinces, for the first nine months of 1954 and 1955, and revised estimates for 1953. Tables 2, 3 and 4 present farm cash income by commodity sources for each province in the three years and include supplementary payments. No information is available for Newfoundland.

NOTE: Marketing estimates for some live-stock products for 1952, 1953, 1954 and 1955 are conditioned by 1951 Census data. Revisions for the intercensal period 1941-51 have not been completed and consequently, income estimates for these commodities since 1951 are not strictly comparable with earlier years.
