





Statistics Canada has a wide range of information about Canadian agriculture. Farm income and expenses, livestock and poultry, and crops statistics are published regularly. This booklet provides a sampling of the information that is available.

Surveys of farmers provide most of the information in this booklet. The National Farm Survey (NFS) is an annual survey of about 30,000 farm operators. It is conducted by the Agriculture Statistics Division. The assistance provided by farmers answering this and other surveys is invaluable. Without the co-operation of farmers, a great deal of important information would not be available, or would arrive too late to be of any use.

Co-operation with provincial departments of agriculture is another part of the agriculture statistics system. The provinces help Statistics Canada with data capture and verification of survey results and provide valuable administrative data.

Agriculture statistics are used by many members of our society to make important economic and policy decisions. Statistics are also the basis of socio-economic research, to help us understand Canada's agriculture and food system.



Farm and Non-farm Populations, Canada, 1931 to 1981


• In 1931 there were two non-farm residents for every farm resident. In 1981, there were 21 non-farm residents for every farm resident,



Non-farm


Age Distribution of Farm Operators, Canada, 1971 and 1981

• In 1971 the average age of farm operators was 49 years; in 1981 it had decreased to 47 years.




Census-farm Operators Reporting "Some Days of Off-farm Work", Canada, 1941 to 1981



Major Grains and Oilseeds Supply and Disposition, Canada, 1980-81 to 1982-83






Average Farm Size, Canada, 1921 to 1982


Average Capital Value of Farms, Canada, 1981

1981 Census Farms by Amount of Gross Sales in 1980, Canada


In 1980, 23% of census farms reported sales of less than \$5,000 and accounted for 1% of gross sales.

1981 Energy Expenditures on Farms


• In the operation of his business, the average farmer spends \$3,823 on energy annually.





Percentages of Farm Cash Receipts from Farming Operations, 1981





• In 1981 the average per farm realized net income in Canada was \$13,098.




Number and Value of Mink and Fox Pelts Produced on Farms, Canada, 1970 to 1981
