Farming Facts 1984 is a summary of the information about Canadian agriculture which is produced by Statistics Canada.

The National Farm Survey is the source of many annual agricultural statistics. At July 1, 1984, interviewers will survey 28,000 farmers, across Canada. Statistics on crop acreages, livestock numbers, and farm operating expenses will be collected.

Statistics Canada has other information about agriculture such as: agricultural imports and exports, per capita food consumption, food prices as part of the Consumer Price Index, employment in agriculture, and so on. Administrative data are the basis for many agricultural statistics.

Statistics Canada co-operates with provincial departments of agriculture, and with other federal departments in the development of data.

Statistics are used by many members of our society to make important economic and policy decisions. Some examples are: farmers, consumers, farm organizations, businesses, researchers, and governments.



What Happened to the Farmers Who Started Farming between 1966 and 1971, in Canada?

• Of the 87,956 farmers who started farming between 1966 and 1971, only 38% were still farming in 1981.

Investment Income:

Bond interest, dividends, mortgage interest, net rents, estate income, bank interest and other investment income.

Government Transfer Payments:

Old age security pensions, guaranteed income supplement, benefits from Canada or Quebec pension plan, unemployment insurance benefits, worker's compensation, veterans' pension, family allowances and welfare payments.

Other Income:

Retirement pensions, annuities, scholarships and other items not specified or included in the above categories.

■ Total Off-Farm Income:

Sum of all of the above sources of income except net farm income.

■ Total Income:

Sum of net farm income and total off-farm income.




Percentages of Farm Cash Receipts from Farming Operations, 1982




Percentages of Farm Cash Receipts from Farming Operations, 1982 (continued)




Percentages of Farm Operating Expenses, 1982


Chartered Banks Prime Lending Rate vs. Farm Debt Outstanding, Canada, 1970 to 1982





Egg Production, Rate of Lay and Number of Layers, Canada, 1971 to 1982




Provincial Distribution of Livestock and Poultry Inventories, July 1, 1983

Average Number of Pigs per Farm*, by Enterprise Mix, and by Type of Farm, Canada, 1981





Major Grains and Oilseeds Supply and Disposition, Canada, 1981-82 to 1983-84






Canadian Agricultural and Food Exports and Imports, 1971 to 1982






Destination of Canadian Exports of Food, Feed, Beverages, and Tobacco, 1972 and 1982


