

# Farming facts 1985

Statistics Canada has a wide range of information about Canadian agriculture. Farming and expenses, livestock and poultry, and crop statistics are published regularly. Farming Facts 1988 is a sampling of the information about Canadian agriculture which is produced by Statistics Canada.

Surveys of farmers provide most of the information in this booklet. The National Farm Survey sampled about 28,000 farm operators and is the source of many annual agricultural statistics. The assistance provided by farm operators answering this and other surveys is invaluable.

Statistics Canada has other sources of information including administrative data which are the basis for many agricultural statistics. As well Statistics Canada cooperates with provincial departments of agriculture, provincial bureau of statistics, and with other federal departments in the development of data.

Statistics can be found in publications, or through CANSIM, Statistics Canada's computer data bank. Statistics are also re-published by newspapers and magazines, and broadcast on radio and television.






### Predominant Farm Type By Census Division, 1981




Total Number of Cattle, by Province ('000), January 1, 1983 to January 1, 1985

Total Number of Sheep, by Province ('000), January 1, 1983 to January 1, 1985




#### Major Grains and Oilseeds Supply and Disposition, Canada, 1983-84



(1) Grain in storage at the start of the grop year August 1, 1983









Egg Production, by Province, 1963, 1973 and 1983




#### Sources of Farm Cash Receipts from Farming Operations, 1984




#### Sources of Farm Cash Receipts from Farming Operations, 1984 (continued)



# Comparison of the Educational Level of Farmers between 1971 and 1981




