Statistics Canada has a wide range of information about Canadian agriculture. Farm income and expenses, livestock and poultry, and crop statistics are published regularly. **Farming Facts 1986** provides examples of this type of information about Canadian agriculture which is produced by Statistics Canada.

Most of the information in this booklet is derived from surveys of agricultural producers. The National Farm Survey samples about 30,000 farm operators and is the source of many annual agricultural statistics. The assistance provided by farm operators answering this and other surveys is invaluable.

Statistics Canada has other sources of information including administrative data which are the basis of many agricultural statistics. As well, Statistics Canada cooperates with provincial departments of agriculture, provincial bureaus of statistics, and with other departments in the development of data.

Agricultural Statistics can be found in publications, or through CANSIM, Statistics Canada's computerized data bank. Statistics are also republished by newspapers and magazines, and broadcast on radio and television. 


Percent of Normal Precipitation for the Prairie Provinces⁽¹⁾ by Crop District From April 1, 1985 to July 22, 1985


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Cattle Numbers on Farms at July 1, Canada, 1940 – 1985


Total Cattle Numbers by Province at July 1, 1955, 1965, 1975 and 1985

Live Hog Exports by Quarter, Canada, 1977 – 1985






Annual Poultry Production⁽¹⁾ by Province, 1964, 1974 and 1984





Grain Exports by Port of Clearance 1983/1984 Crop Year






Disposition of Major Grains, Canada, 1984/1985

Note: Total usage is defined to equal total supply; total supply equals beginning commercial stocks, stocks on farms, production and imports.




Disposition of Major Grains, Canada, 1984/1985 (Continued)






Sources of Farm Cash Receipts from Farming Operations, 1985




Sources of Farm Cash Receipts from Farming Operations, 1985 (Continued)



Sources of Farm Operating Expenses, 1985



Total Farm Capital Value and Farm Debt Outstanding, Canada, 1971 – 1984






Farm Production Indexes, Canada, 1954 – 1984








