**Statistics Canada** produces a wide range of information about Canadian agriculture. Statistics on farm income and expenses, livestock and crop statistics are published at regular intervals. **Farming Facts 1989** provides examples of the kind of information about Canadian agriculture collected by Statistics Canada.

The data in this booklet are derived from a variety of sources, such as the 1986 Census of Agriculture, and from various annual, quarterly or monthly surveys of agricultural producers.

Two of these surveys are the National Farm Survey (conducted in June July) and the January Farm Survey, for which 50,000 and 16,000 respondents respectively are enumerated. The assistance provided by farm operators answering these surveys is invaluable.

In addition, Statistics Canada uses administrative data and cooperates with provincial departments of agriculture, provincial bureaus of statistics and with other federal departments in the development of agricultural statistics.

Agricultural statistics produced by the Agriculture Division can be found in regular Statistics Canada publications, or through CANSIM, Statistics Canada's computerized data bank. Statistics are also republished by newspapers and magazines and broadcast on radio and television. 






### Livestock on Farms, 1963-1988, Canada

### Cattle Numbers 1968, 1978 and 1988







# Wheat Exports by Final Destination, 1987/1988 Crop Year





## Exports of Canadian Grain\* by Clearance Sector, 1978/79 – 1987/88





### Selected Agricultural Price Indexes, 1972-1988




### Sources of Farm Cash Receipts from Farming Operations, 1988




### Sources of Farm Cash Receipts from Farming Operations, 1988 (concluded)



### Sources of Farm Operating Expenses, 1988



### Realized Net Farm Income, Canada, 1986-1989




# Farm Capital Value and Farm Debt Outstanding, Canada, 1973-1987




### Production of Major Dairy Products in Canada, 1962-1987

### Food Consumption per Capita in Canada, 1967-1987




