Statistics Canada produces a wide range of information about Canadian agriculture. Statistics on farm income and expenses, livestock and crop statistics are published at regular intervals. Farming Facts 1990 provides examples of the kind of information about Canadian agriculture collected by Statistics Canada.

The data in this booklet are derived from a variety of sources, including the 1986 Census of Agriculture, the National Farm Survey and various other annual, quarterly or monthly surveys of agricultural producers. The assistance provided by farm operators answering these surveys is invaluable.


Wherever possible, Statistics Canada uses administrative data in cooperation with provincial departments of agriculture, provincial bureaus of statistics and with other federal departments in the development of agricultural statistics.

Agricultural statistics can be found in regular Statistics Canada publications, or through CANSIM, Statistics Canada's computerized data bank. Statistics are also republished by newspapers and magazines and broadcast on radio and television. 

Percentage of Farms with Total Sales of \$2,500 or more, by Product Type, Provinces and Canada





#### Livestock on Farms, Canada, 1974-1989










### Farm Families by Size as Percentage of ali Farm Families, Canada, 1971, 1981 and 1986


## Farm Families by Occupation of Farm Operator and Spouse as a Percentage of all Farm Families, Canada, 1981 and 1986


#### Number of Women Farm Operators, 1986






# Farm Operators by Level of Schooling as a Percentage of all Farm Operators, Canada, 1971, 1981 and 1986

### Sources of Farm Family\* Income in Constant (1981) Dollars, Canada, 1973, 1978, 1983 and 1988






#### Indexes of Farm Input and Farm Product Prices, Canada, 1971-1989

### Farm Product Price Indexes, Crops and Livestock, Canada, 1979-1989

















#### Realized Net Farm Income, Canada, 1980-1989





Billions of dollars





### Realized Net Farm Income in Current and Constant (1981) Dollars, Canada, 1981-1989







### Production of Selected Berries and Grapes, Canada, 1988





(Total production 570,000 tonnes)


### Apple Production by Variety, Canada, 1988

### Production of Major Dairy Products in Canada, 1963-1988






### Per Capita Consumption of Meats, Eggs and Fish, Canada, 1968-1988


