

GRAIN STATISTICS, 1929

The present report on the Grain Grade of Canada was compiled in the Agricultural Branch of the Dominion Bureau of Statistics in collaboration with the Board of Grain Commissioners for Canada, and is the twelfth of its series.

Statistics are presented showing in detail the various channels and markets through which the grain passes from the farm to its final destination. Comparative data are included for countries other than Canada bringing the grain and cereal resources and trade of the world into review.

The first part of the report deals with the domestic movement of grain—the production, inspection and handlings at country, interior terminal, public terminal, private terminal and private and manufacturing elevators in the Western Inspection Division (comprising Fort William and Port Arthur and all territory West thereof) and at public elevators in the East. Handlings of United States grain in the Eastern elevators and of Canadian grain in the United States are covered. Records of prices at representative markets, freight rates and insurance charges are also included.

The movement of grain from the Head of the Lakes to Buffalo and Montreal has been segregated. An arrangement was completed in March, 1925, whereby the United States Department of Commerce furnishes the Bureau monthly with statements of shipments of Canadian wheat and wheat flour from United States ports by countries of destination. These additional data are valuable for the light they throw on the export movement of grain from Canada by shipping routes and as to the countries finally importing the grain. The material in the report has been brought into final review through charts and summaries.

This report has been prepared by W. Dougan of the Agricultural Branch of the Bureau of which T. W. Grindley, Ph.D., is chief.

An important portion of the data has been supplied by Mr. E. A. Ursell, Statistician of the Board of Grain Commissioners for Canada. The tables relating to the international grain trade are based upon the statistics of the International Institute of Agriculture and other official sources. The cordial thanks of the Bureau are tendered to the several departments co-operating and to elevator and other officials who have also assisted.

MOVEMENT OF CANADIAN WHEAT, CROP YEAR 1928-29

The estimated wheat crop in 1928, amounted to 566,726,000 bushels, an increase of 87,061,000 bushels over the previous crop. This production constitutes a record crop of wheat for Canada. The second highest was in 1927 when 479,665,000 bushels were produced.

As in the previous year 1927, the spring was cold and backward, with a result, the crop was late in being sown. The growing season, however, was favourable; this produced a rapid, sturdy growth. Frosts took place in August through a widespread area in Saskatchewan and Alberta. The extent of the damage was not known until after threshing, when it was shown that there was considerable losses in grades and yields. The weather during harvesting was ideal and a large part of the crop was marketed exceptionally early.

Inspection returns show that only 32.81 per cent came within the contract grades viz. No. 1, 2 and 3 Northern which is 1.97 per cent higher than the previous year, while a larger quantity graded number 4, 5 and 6, representing 52.57 per cent of the total amount inspected.

The following table shows the total number of cars inspected, with the percentage grading within contract grades for the crop years 1920-21 to 1928-29 inclusive.

Cars inspected increased 44,918 over the previous year. During the first five months ended December 1929, 243,668 cars were inspected, and 102,129 cars during the remaining seven months. This is a reversal from the previous season's inspections, but indicates that the crop was marketed early.

The number of cars unloaded at the head of the lakes was 240,072, an increase of 39,952 over the previous year. Vancouver received 69,567 cars, an increase of 9,474, while Prince Rupert and Victoria, B.C. handled 1,903 and 114 cars respectively.

Prices during the crop year were on a lower level than the previous year. The average for the present crop year was \$1.24, which is 22.3 lower than 1927-28. In the opening month of the crop year, the price averaged \$118.3 dropping to 117.0 during the next month, September; rising again to 123.7 and 120.9 during October and November respectively. There was a 3.8c. drop during the next month, December. In January, the average price was 120.9 above which it remained until the end of April. The lowest average price during the year was in May, when it went down to 113.3 while July was the highest rising to 159.9.

The crop in the Western Division was estimated at 546,090,191 bushels: the carry over from the previous year was 54,835,440 bushels, while the imports amounted to 435,587 bushels, making a total available for distribution of 601,361,218 bushels. The bulk of this, 420,772,580 bushels, was disposed of commercially, as exports, shipments to the Eastern Division and mill grindings for consumption and export. The exports amounted to 255,738,723 bushels, 30,278,558 bushels greater than last year.

Seed requirements were 42,625,543 bushels and the amount in store at the end of the crop year was 79,205,162 bushels.

Returns show 466,250,000 bushels inspected or 85.38 % of the crop. The elevators at the Head of the Lakes reported receipts of 320,455,930 bushels. Rail shipments from the Western Division via Armstrong, Ont. (not touching the Head of the Lakes) amounted to 100,740 bushels, while the quantity moved by rail from Elevators at Fort William and Port Arthur (not including the amount ground there) was 2,188,805 bushels. The total amount shipped all rail from the Western Division was 3,176,907 bushels. Deducting the first two amounts from the last, a balance of 887,362 bushels is shown to have moved eastward, in addition to the unloadings of 320,455,930 bushels at the Head of the Lakes, making a total of 321,343,292 bushels handled.

Canadian bonded wheat received by rail at Duluth-Superior amounted to 883,606 bushels. Shipments by vessel were 868,807 bushels and by rail 34,900 bushels. Of the former, 933,353 bushels went to United States ports and 522,360 bushels to Canadian ports.

Receipts at Lake Huron and Georgian Bay Ports amounted to 75,413,384 bushels, by vessel. Shipments from these ports are practically all made by rail and are as follows:—To Montreal 36,039,446 bushels, Canadian Seaboard 12,452,817 bushels, other Canadian points 7,294,539 bushels, United States Seaboard Ports 5,422,782 bushels, other United States points 47,062 bushels, and local and mill 12,475,862 bushels, a total of 73,552,508 bushels. In addition to this a small amount of 362,645 bushels was shipped from Sarnia to Montreal. Port Colborne received 54,562,803 bushels by vessel and 2,039,449 bushels by rail. Receipts at Kingston and Toronto were by rail and amounted to 35,721 and 240,456 bushels respectively. Transshipments by vessel to Montreal amounted to 33,665,103 bushels. Direct shipments from Fort William and Port Arthur to Montreal and Quebec were 9,138,593 and 396,521 bushels respectively. Wheat was re-routed from Buffalo to the extent of 39,621,267 bushels. This makes a total movement to the St. Lawrence Ports of 83,184,129 bushels. According to the Elevator returns, at Montreal and Quebec 77,920,867 and 7,172,181 bushels were received by water respectively, a total 85,093,048 bushels, while the remarkably large amount of 42,272,253 bushels was received by rail. In addition to the foregoing, 8,260,405 bushels were forwarded by vessel from Port Colborne to Canadian Seaboard, 334,750 bushels to other Canadian points and 85,000 bushels to other United States Points. Distribution of the rail shipments from these lower lake ports was as follows:—to Montreal 80,247 bushels, Canadian Seaboard 1,069,880 bushels, other Canadian points 77,142 bushels, to local and mill 13,124,978 bushels. Shipments by water from Fort William and Port Arthur to United States Lake Ports, with comparative figures for previous years, were as follows:—

According to Customs returns 145,862,354 bushels were exported from Fort William and Port Arthur to the United Kingdom and 1,860,382 bushels to other countries. This wheat was shipped via Buffalo and other United States Lake Ports to the United States Atlantic Seaboard Ports for export. Direct shipments to the United States for consumption amounted to 9,949,737 bushels. This, with 108,457 bushels exported from other ports in the Western Division to the United States, makes a total of 10,058,194 bushels. Vancouver, B.C. exports amounted to 31,668,187 bushels to United Kingdom and 63,130,254 bushels to other countries, a total of 94,998,441 bushels. Prince Rupert showed an export of 2,818,093 bushels to the United Kingdom, while 141,239 bushels were exported from Victoria, B.C. to other countries. The total export from the Western Division amounted to 255,738,723 bushels, an increase of 30,098,558 bushels. Of the total export, 180,548,634 bushels were destined to United Kingdom and 65,131,895 bushels to other overseas countries.

The crop in the Eastern Division amounted to 20,635,809 bushels, a decrease of 2,959,241 bushels from the previous year. The carryover was 22,790,631 bushels, the amount shipped from the Western Division 139,393,380 bushels, and the imports 910,294 bushels. This makes a total available for distribution of 183,730,112 bushels.

Exports from the Eastern Division amounted to 98,685,976 bushels, 29,023,109 bushels of this going to the United Kingdom, 69,660,822 bushels to other overseas countries and 2,045 bushels to the United States. Grindings for home consumption were estimated at 31,578,750 bushels, while the equivalent of 40,050,859 bushels was exported as flour. A total of 170,315,585

bushels was disposed of commercially. Seed requirements and the amount in store at the end of crop year were 1,570,711 and 25,178,059 bushels respectively.

Prince Rupert exported 2,818,093 bushels to United Kingdom and Victoria, B.C. 141,239 bushels to other overseas countries.

The total exports of wheat from Canada during the crop year 1928-29 amounted to 354,424,699 bushels. Of this amount 190,330,943 bushels were shipped via Canadian ports, while 39,621,267 bushels were transhipped from Buffalo to Montreal making 229,952,210 bushels shipped via Canadian ports. Exports via United States Ports are shown to be 154,033,517 bushels, including the above 39,621,267 bushels. Deducting this amount leaves 114,412,250 bushels that actually went via United States Ports. The balance of 10,060,239 bushels was direct shipments to the United States.

Exports by the Pacific coast ports (Vancouver, Prince Rupert and Victoria B.C.) amounted to 97,957,773 bushels or 27.64 p.c. of the total export. The balance 131,994,437 bushels moved via Canadian Atlantic Seaboard ports.

The amount exported from the Eastern Division to the United States for consumption amounted to only 2,045 bushels. Exports overseas via inland ports of exit were 6,310,761 bushels, 5,627,523 bushels going to United Kingdom and 683,238 bushels to other overseas countries. These shipments left Eastern Canada through the following ports of exit in Ontario and Quebec:—Coaticook 3,273,490 bushels, St. John's, P.Q. 1,658,255 bushels, Welland 671,038 bushels, Sutton, P.Q. 618,283 bushels, Sarnia 52,000 bushels, Niagara Falls 14,267 bushels, St. Armand, P.Q. 13,425 bushels, and Athelstan, P.Q. 10,003 bushels.

The total export of wheat to the United Kingdom was 209,571,743 bushels according to customs returns, while other countries in the British Empire received 4,279,208 bushels and foreign countries 140,573,748 bushels. The chief importing countries other than the United Kingdom were as follows:—Japan 22,700,487 bushels, Netherlands 22,121,680 bushels, Belgium 16,577,716 bushels, Italy 15,571,311 bushels, Germany 14,693,724 bushels, China 9,131,370 bushels, France 7,238,839 bushels, Greece 7,057,061 bushels, Portugal 4,017,860 bushels, Spain 2,643,279 bushels, Denmark 2,410,499 bushels, and Sweden 2,174,414 bushels.

Canadian customs returns showed as stated above that 209,571,743 bushels were exported to the United Kingdom. This amount however includes quantities later diverted to other countries. According to reports of the United States Department of Commerce, the amount forwarded to the United Kingdom via United States Atlantic Seaboard ports was 83,919,373 bushels, the balance being diverted to other countries. This quantity, along with 58,081,866 bushels shipped through Canadian Seaboard ports, makes 142,001,239 bushels actually shipped to the United Kingdom instead of 209,571,743 bushels.

The difference between the movement via Canadian ports and United States ports as originally shown was 36,297,426 bushels in favour of the former. Transhipments from Buffalo amounted to 39,621,267 bushels. After making this deduction, the amount in favour of Canadian ports increased to 115,539,960 bushels.

Returns received at the United States Department of Commerce showed that 83,919,373 bushels were cleared from the following United States Atlantic Seaboard ports:—New York 55,427,949 bushels; Baltimore 12,932,871 bushels; Philadelphia 10,329,612 bushels; Boston 2,420,009 bushels; Portland 2,247,361 bushels and Norfolk 561,571 bushels. The difference between the actual clearances and the amount shown exported from United States ports by Canadian customs returns is 70,123,944 bushels. The amount re-routed from Buffalo was 39,621,267 bushels.

Canadian wheat ground in bond amounted to 20,602,000 bushels, while the export from Canada to United States for consumption was 10,060,239 bushels. The difference, 10,541,761 bushels, consisted of wheat billed for shipment overseas, but diverted and ground in bond for final export as flour. The quantity in store in the United States Atlantic Seaboard ports on July 26, 1929 was 11,966,032 bushels.

During the crop year 1928-29 Canada maintained the leading place as an exporter of wheat, the total being 354,424,699 bushels. Other important exporting countries were: Argentina 216,229,000 bushels; United States 107,668,000 bushels; Australia 79,141,000 bushels; Hungary 13,797,000 bushels; Jugo-Slavia 8,801,000 bushels; Roumania 658,000 bushels and India 810,000 bushels.


Complete data showing the movement of wheat and other grains by inspection divisions and for Canada as a whole are contained in tables 88, 89 and 90, pages 126 to 129. Summaries of the handling of grain by the different classes of elevators—country, private and manufacturing, interior terminal, public terminal, private terminal and public elevators in the East—show the movement through each important grain centre in Canada during the crop year. A more detailed study of the movement can be made from these summaries.

The production of oats in Canada in 1928 amounted to 452,123,000 bushels. This was one of the largest oat crops produced in Canada and exceeds the previous year's crop by 12,410,300 bushels. The Western Division produced 302,432,506 bushels, an increase of 28,487,801 bushels. Stocks on hand at the beginning of the crop year were 19,627,432 bushels, while imports amounted to 4,944 bushels, making a total of 322,164,882 bushels available for distribution in the Western Division. Some 34,134,985 bushels were accounted for commercially and according to official returns 44,756,500 bushels were inspected or 14.8 per cent of the crop. Oats are consumed largely on the farm and do not enter commercial channels to a large extent.

Elevator receipts at the Head of the Lakes amounted to 31,597,036 bushels. Lake shipments included 19,982,719 bushels for Canadian ports and 283,654 bushels for United States ports. The rail shipments from the Western Division were 7,493,486 bushels; the movement eastward not touching Fort William and Port Arthur was 1,765,369 bushels, while the amount shipped from Fort William and Port Arthur (not including mill grindings) was 3,812,279 bushels. Deducting the last two amounts from the former leaves 1,915,838 bushels which passed through the Head of the Lakes in addition to the 31,597,036 bushels received at the elevators above, making the total handled 33,512,874 bushels.

Public elevators in the East report 7,660,795 bushels received at Lake Huron and Georgian Bay ports. Shipments out by rail amounted to 6,656,014 bushels. Port Colborne and Kingston elevators received 11,863,270 bushels by vessel and 143,732 bushels by rail. The shipments from these ports were 9,712,913 bushels by vessel and 1,925,934 bushels by rail. Water shipments to Montreal totalled 9,117,433 bushels while 595,480 bushels were shipped to the Canadian Seaboard. The distribution of the rail shipments was as follows:—To Other Canadian Points 778,353 bushels; Canadian Seaboard 350,021 bushels; and Local and Mill 797,560 bushels.


Direct shipments by water from the Head of the Lakes to Montreal and Quebec were 2,296,348 bushels and 1,524,739 bushels respectively. Oats re-routed from Buffalo amounted to 408,294 bushels. This makes the total movement of 12,346,814 bushels to the St. Lawrence ports by water. Elevators at Montreal and Quebec report 13,411,062 bushels being received by vessel.

Shipments from Lake Huron and Georgian Bay ports to Montreal were 1,085,896 bushels. The elevators at Montreal show rail receipts amounting to 2,041,602 bushels. The difference indicated is accounted for by shipments for Montreal being shown to other Canadian points and by direct rail shipments from the West.

Exports from the Western Division were as follows:—To the United States for consumption, 702 bushels; to the United Kingdom 914,495 bushels; and to other countries 243,654 bushels. The total export overseas was 1,158,149 bushels. Of this latter amount 512,253 bushels were cleared from the Head of the Lakes for the United Kingdom. Vancouver shows an export of 645,838 bushels and Dawson 58 bushels.

Oat production in the Eastern Division was estimated at 149,720,494 bushels, an increase of 16,047,501 bushels. The carryover from the previous year amounted to 8,977,528 bushels, while the quantity received from the Western Division was 27,476,205 bushels, and the import 3,636,223 bushels. This makes a total available for distribution of 189,810,450 bushels. Milling returns account for 5,957,601 bushels, 2,577,320 bushels for home-consumption and 3,380,281 bushels for export. The export of oats as grain was as follows: To United States 32,536 bushels; United Kingdom 3,727,972 bushels; Other Countries 7,909,026 bushels, a total of 11,669,534 bushels.

Canadian Atlantic Seaboard ports show an export of 12,828,385 bushels, 4,642,467 bushels going to the United Kingdom and 8,152,680 bushels to other countries. Exports via United States ports from Eastern Canada amounted to 134,764 bushels. These left Canada through the following inland ports of exit:—Niagara Falls, 21,723 bushels; Bridgeburg 18,111 bushels; Prescott 54,469 bushels; and St. John's, 40,461 bushels. Seed requirements in the Eastern Division were 11,625,002 bushels and the amount in store at the end of the crop year was 12,364,855 bushels.



Exports of oats from the Head of the Lakes amounted to 512,253 bushels; the quantity shipped from the Eastern Division for consumption was 669,534 bushels making, with 134,764 bushels exported by inland ports of exit as above to the United States for furtherance, a total of 1,316,551 bushels. These, with direct shipments of 702 bushels from the Western Division make a total of 1,317,253 bushels moved from Canada to the United States, of which 33,238 bushels were for consumption and 647,014 bushels for export via United States Seaboard ports.

Vancouver and Dawson exported 645,838 and 58 bushels, a total of 645,896 bushels via Canadian Pacific Seaboard ports. Exports overseas via Canadian Atlantic Seaboard ports were 11,502,234 bushels as shown above, a total movement via Canadian ports of 12,148,130 bushels, while 647,017 bushels were originally shown as exported via United States Seaboard ports. An amount of 408,294 bushels was later re-routed from Buffalo to Montreal, making a final movement via Canadian Seaboard ports of 12,557,190 bushels and via United States ports of 238,723 bushels.

Total export of oats amounted to 12,828,385 bushels compared with 12,168,037 bushels during the previous crop year. As in former years, the bulk of this export, 4,642,467 bushels went to the United Kingdom, while the other principal importing countries were:—Netherlands 2,613,394 bushels, Belgium 2,594,869 bushels, France 754,075 bushels, Newfoundland 610,791 bushels, Germany 360,018 bushels, Bermuda 281,304 bushels.

MOVEMENT OF CANADIAN BARLEY, CROP YEAR 1928-29

The barley crop in Canada amounted to 136,391,400 bushels in 1928, as compared with 96,938,000 bushels in 1927, an increase of 39,453,400 bushels.

Production in the Western Division was estimated at 113,081,713 bushels making, with the carryover from the previous year of 2,834,403 bushels and imports of 810 bushels, a total of 115,916,926 bushels available for distribution. The disposition of this barley was as follows:—exported as grain 28,362,557 bushels, shipped to the Eastern Division 14,888,219 bushels and milled for consumption 395,523 bushels, making a total of 43,646,299 bushels disposed of commercially. The amount retained for seed was 10,252,416 bushels, and the quantity in store at the end of the crop year 8,261,981 bushels, a total of 62,160,696 bushels accounted for. Loss in cleaning and unmerchantable grain amounted to 621,949 and 5,170,713 bushels respectively. The balance, 47,963,568 bushels, was fed on farms or otherwise consumed.

Receipts at the Head of the Lakes amounted to 45,016,131 bushels. Rail shipments from the Western Division to outside points were 2,252,212 bushels, including 1,697,210 bushels moved from Fort William and Port Arthur elevators by rail. Armstrong shipments totalled 180,978 bushels. The balance of 374,024 bushels was also shipped from the Head of the Lakes, making a total movement of 45,390,155 bushels. Lake shipments amounted to 16,136,583 bushels, 6,020,377 bushels to Canadian ports and 10,116,206 bushels to United States ports.

Lake Huron and Georgian Bay receipts amounted to 5,571,116 bushels. The distribution of this was as follows:—To Montreal 2,079,485 bushels, to Canadian Seaboard 1,751,473 bushels, to Other Canadian Points 614,508 bushels, to United States Seaboard 438,610 bushels, to Local and Mill 84,706 bushels, a total of 4,968,782 bushels.


Elevators at Port Colborne and Kingston received 5,534,847 bushels by vessel and 11,267 bushels by rail. The bulk of this 4,679,155 bushels was transhipped to Montreal, while 607,435 bushels were shipped to Canadian Seaboard. Small amounts were forwarded by rail as follows: To Canadian Seaboard 128,863 bushels, to United States Seaboard 43,333 bushels, to Other Canadian Points 24,009 bushels and for home consumption 1,072 bushels.

According to the water shipments from the Head of the Lakes 1,237,115 bushels were destined for Montreal and 26,626 bushels to Quebec, while the amount re-routed from Buffalo to Montreal was 3,475,454. These amounts with the quantity moved from Port Colborne make the total shipments via St. Lawrence of 9,418,350 bushels. The elevator reports at Montreal and Quebec show 9,443,061 bushels as received by vessel and 11,267 bushels by rail. Production in the Eastern Division amounted to 23,309,687 bushels. This, with a carryover of 625,290 bushels, an import of 7,443 bushels and a receipt of 14,888,219 bushels from the Western Division, makes a total of 38,830,639 bushels available for distribution. Exports amounted to 11,785,145 bushels (all of which went to overseas countries); amount milled for consumption was 415,371 bushels, a total of 12,200,516 bushels disposed of commercially. Seed requirements were 1,598,668 bushels, while 2,758,876 bushels remained in store at the end of the crop year, accounting for 16,558,060 bushels. Loss in cleaning and grain unmerchantable were estimated at 128,203 and 2,137,687 bushels respectively, the balance 20,006,689 bushels being fed on the farms or otherwise consumed.

Exports from the Eastern Division include 2,348,113 bushels to the United Kingdom and 9,437,032 bushels to other countries. Exports were handled at Canadian Atlantic Seaboard ports of 11,042,774 bushels:—Montreal 7,862,847, Halifax, N.S., 1,321,176 bushels, St. John, N.B., 957,729 bushels, Quebec 901,022 bushels.

Export shipments through Canadian Inland ports of exit amounted to 742,371 bushels through the following ports:—Sutton, Que., 293,974 bushels, St. John's, Que., 139,734 bushels, Niagara Falls 111,051 bushels, Cornwall, Ont., 69,125 bushels, Prescott 66,653 bushels, Coaticook 60,134 bushels, St. Armand 1,700 bushels.

An export of 27,811,001 bushels was made from the Western Division to Overseas Countries through the United States Atlantic Seaboard ports. This, in addition to 742,371 bushels similarly shipped from the Eastern Division, makes a total movement via United States ports of 28,553,372 bushels, of which 13,335,170 bushels went to the United Kingdom and 15,218,202 bushels to other overseas countries.



Barley exports from Vancouver, B.C., are shown to be 493,939 bushels and 45,144 bushels from Victoria, B.C.

Shipments amounting to 3,475,454 bushels were later made from Buffalo to Montreal. After this adjustment is made, the total exports handled at Canadian ports are increased to 15,057,311 bushels and those via United States ports reduced to 25,077,918 bushels. The bulk of the exports of barley went to the United Kingdom 30,362,697 bushels, to Germany 5,909,504 bushels, to the Netherlands 2,660,785 bushels, to Belgium 790,393 bushels, to Norway 194,454 bushels, to Irish Free State 163,230 bushels and to United States 12,473 bushels.

MOVEMENT OF CANADIAN GRAIN, CROP YEAR 1928-29

(WHEAT, OATS, BARLEY, FLAX AND RYE)

The spring of 1928 was similar to that of 1927, with the result the seeding in Western Canada was somewhat late. The growing season was excellent and Canada reaped record crops in both Wheat and Barley, while the Oat production was the second highest, but Flax and Rye show slight reductions from the year 1927.

On the map on page 24 receipts and shipments of grain by groups of elevators are shown in the form of a series of pools. It has been found impossible to specify the different destinations of the shipments individually, and the alternative is used of grouping the ports under the following headings: "Canadian Seaboard," "Other Canadian Ports," "United States Seaboard" and "Other United States Points."

Of the total shipments, 409,680,774 bushels were received at the Head of the Lakes, 99,257,632 bushels at Vancouver, B.C., 2,501,046 bushels at Prince Rupert, B.C. and 193,438 bushels at Victoria, B.C. Private and Manufacturing elevators report 50,496,766 bushels as milled, manufactured or sold for feed, while shipments out accounts for 27,841,974 bushels as grain. Of the total receipts at the Head of the Lakes 92,177,561 bushels were forwarded to Georgian Bay Ports, by vessel, 77,917,147 bushels to Port Colborne and Toronto and 16,453,065 bushels to Montreal and Quebec direct. Rail shipments from the Head of the Lakes amounted to

10,430,467 bushels, while 3,959,271 bushels came through from Private and Manufacturing elevators. The total quantity shipped to Canadian ports amounted to 200,937,511 bushels, while 604,425 bushels were bonded for through shipments to Europe. Other shipments were made to the United States Lake ports.

Public elevators in the East act as transfer houses or distributors and are situated at Georgian Bay, Lower Lake, St. Lawrence and Atlantic Seaboard ports. Wheat is the principal grain handled by these elevators, and in order to show its relation to the total grain movement, figures for wheat and total grain are both given.

LOWER LAKE PORTS (PORT COLBORNE AND KINGSTON)

Port Colborne received 73,868,230 bushels by vessel and 2,048,550 bushels by rail, Toronto and Kingston receipts were 449,299 and 3,599,618 bushels by vessel together with 232,327 and 251,020 bushels by rail respectively, making the total received 80,449,224 bushels, an increase of 6,141,486 bushels over 1927-28. The bulk of this 49,885,816 bushels moved from Port Colborne to Montreal, while rail shipments amounted to 20,152,312 including 15,922,454 bushels to local and mills. 
ST. LAWRENCE PORTS

Handlings at Montreal show an increase over the previous year. The amount received at Montreal was 101,132,331 bushels by vessel and 45,186,431 bushels by rail, an increase of 34,485,984 bushels. The carryover was 7,002,192 bushels, making the total handled 153,320,954 bushels compared with 118,418,656 bushels in 1926-27.

Port of Quebec shows an increase. Vessel and rail receipts were 9,368,811 bushels and 3,614,651 bushels respectively, making with a carryover of 1,707,932 bushels, the total handled 14,691,394 bushels as against 7,930,978 bushels during the previous year.

Rail shipments from Georgian Bay and Lower Lake Ports show that 40,728,248 bushels were moved to Montreal, while the amount received according to the elevator returns was 45,186,431 bushels. Rail receipts at Quebec amounted to 3,614,651 bushels, compared with 950,561 bushels during the previous year. The increased movement was direct from the Prairie Provinces, shippers taking advantage of the reduced freight rate via Armstrong, Ont.

Transhipments to Montreal from Port Colborne amounted to 49,885,816 bushels; direct shipments by water from the Head of the Lakes to Montreal and Quebec were 14,485,179 bushels and 1,967,886 bushels respectively, re-routed grain from Buffalo accounted for 44,864,156 bushels, making a total water movement to St. Lawrence ports of 110,304,686 bushels. Receipts



by vessel at the elevators in Montreal and Quebec were 101,132,331 and 9,368,811 bushels respectively, a total of 110,501,142 bushels, receipts by rail were 48,801,082 bushels, making a grand total of 159,302,224 bushels received by vessel and rail. Of this amount 128,665,130 bushels were shipped from Montreal and 9,663,408 bushels from Quebec to overseas countries. The total movement overseas via the St. Lawrence route amounted to 138,328,538 bushels.

CANADIAN ATLANTIC SEABOARD

Increased handlings are shown at the Port of Saint John, N.B., during the crop year. The receipts amounted to 13,468,609 bushels, the carryover to 340 bushels, a total of 13,468,949 bushels, an increase of 3,644,816 bushels. The elevator at Halifax, N.S., handled 4,722,513 bushels during the year, compared with 2,305,107 bushels for the previous crop year, an increase of 2,417,406 bushels.

The disposition of this grain from the Atlantic ports included shipments of 4,458,606 bushels to the United Kingdom, 8,901,890 bushels to other countries, and 2,266 bushels consumed locally from Saint John, N.B. Halifax exported 4,377,421 bushels to the United Kingdom and other countries. Portland, Me., handled 3,795,535 bushels, of which 3,585,623 bushels were shipped overseas and 260 bushels were shipped to Montreal by rail.


MOVEMENT OF UNITED STATES AND ARGENTINE GRAIN THROUGH CANADA, CROP YEAR 1928-29

The map on the following page shows the movement of United States grain through Eastern Canada. The bulk of the grain is handled twice, first on its entry at the lake ports and secondly when it is finally shipped out through the St. Lawrence and Atlantic ports. As in previous years the handlings of Argentine corn are shown in addition to United States grain. Production of grain in Canada reached a new high record in 1928 which accounted for the decreased handlings of United States grain in Canadian Elevators, although there was an increased production in the Republic.

LOWER LAKE PORTS (PORT COLBORNE AND KINGSTON)

Port Colborne elevators received 28,680,547 bushels by vessel as compared with 33,038,517 bushels in the previous crop year. Included in the former amount is 304,359 bushels of Argentine corn. The carryover from the crop year 1927-28 amounted to 674,367 bushels, making the total handled 29,354,914 bushels. The bulk of this, 22,896,061 bushels, was reshipped to Montreal, while the balance of 5,491,115 bushels was shipped to Canadian Seaboard. The rail shipments amounted to 687,634 bushels, the distribution of which was as follows:—To Canadian Seaboard ports, 25,539 bushels, local points, 175,875 bushels, and other Canadian points, 486,220 bushels.

Kingston received 193,855 bushels of United States corn and 164,504 bushels of Argentine corn by vessel. This, with a small carryover of 17,256 bushels, makes the total handled 402,666 bushels. Shipments from Kingston totalled 366,383 bushels.

ST. LAWRENCE PORTS

According to returns made by Montreal elevators, 47,932,001 bushels were received by vessel and 19,767,733 bushels by rail. This with a carryover of 2,108,568 bushels from the previous year makes a total of 69,808,312 bushels. During the previous crop year 83,558,220 bushels were handled. Water receipts include 2,203,876 bushels of Argentine corn. The shipments from Port Colborne to Montreal were 22,896,061 bushels, while other shipments through the Welland Canal amounted to 19,077,619 bushels. Of this amount 11,080,698 bushels were transshipped from Buffalo, the balance coming direct from the United States ports of Milwaukee, Chicago and Duluth.

Shipments by vessel from Montreal to the United Kingdom and other overseas countries amounted to 65,121,466 bushels. This, with 10,000 bushels moved to other Canadian points makes a total water movement from Montreal of 65,131,466 bushels. Rail shipments included 145,042 bushels for the Canadian Seaboard and 2,265,120 bushels used locally. The total amount shipped from Montreal was therefore 67,541,628 bushels.

Handleings at Quebec, including 481,666 bushels of Argentine corn, amounted to 836,668 bushels. Water receipts of 754,195 bushels included 85,507 bushels of barley and 245,174 bushels of corn from the United States and 423,514 bushels of Argentine corn. Local requirements took 608,585 bushels and 68,841 bushels were moved out by water to overseas countries. With the water shipments of 65,131,466 bushels from Montreal this makes a total movement via the St. Lawrence route of 65,190,307 bushels, a decrease of 13,616,158 bushels.

CANADIAN ATLANTIC SEABOARD PORTS

The Port of Saint John, N.B., received 16,778,085 bushels of United States grain by rail and 559,332 bushels of Argentine corn by vessel. The carryover was 164,153 bushels, making the total handled 17,501,570 bushels. The shipments to overseas countries amounted to 16,643,341 bushels—1,847,437 bushels to United Kingdom, and 14,795,904 bushels to other overseas countries. The rail shipments included 479,755 bushels consumed locally.

Halifax receipts were made up of 1,004,463 bushels of Argentine corn and 1,324,936 bushels of United States grain, which with carryover of 46,098 bushels made the total handlings 2,375,497 bushels. Local shipments accounted for 473,254 bushels by rail, while 1,678,872 bushels were shipped to overseas countries.

Statements of rail shipments to the "Canadian Seaboard" from Georgian Bay, Lower Lake and St. Lawrence ports showed that 17,108,589 bushels were moved. This is 994,432 bushels less than shown by the rail receipts at St. John, N.B., and Halifax. The difference is accounted for by some grain being diverted to Canadian Seaboard after being billed to Other Canadian ports. The total re-export from St. Lawrence and Seaboard ports amounted to 83,512,520 bushels, a decrease of 4,939,755 bushels from the previous crop year.





PUBLICATIONS OF THE DOMINION BUREAU OF STATISTICS RE GRAIN, FLOUR MILLING, ETC.

- (1) Monthly Bulletin of Agricultural Statistics, carried out in collaboration with Provincial Departments of Agriculture, recording general agricultural conditions statistically from month to month, with special references to acreages, conditions and yields of field crops, agricultural prices, wages, etc., etc. The September, November and January issues of the Bulletin contain the official annual estimates of the crop.
- (2) An annual report of the Grain Trade of Canada, showing the general movement of grain throughout Canada from the farm to final market and in relation to the grain trade of the world.
- (3) A weekly statement showing stocks of grain in store, receipts and shipments at country elevators, interior terminal elevators, public and private terminal elevators in the Western Inspection Division, and at public elevators in the East, together with a statement showing stocks of Canadian grain at United States Lake and Atlantic ports.
- (4) Monthly supplements are added to the weekly grain statistics mentioned above, showing exports of grain and principal grain products by ports of exit and by shipping routes, together with inspections by months in both the Western and Eastern inspection divisions.
- (5) A monthly statement showing grain ground and products produced by merchant and custom mills in Canada.
- (6) An annual report on the Flour Milling Industry.
- (7) The monthly and annual trade statistics of the Bureau contain full details of the imports and exports of grain, flour, etc., whilst canal statistics and general transportation statistics include a full treatment of grain traffic by rail and water. Grain and flour prices are comprehensively covered in the monthly and annual reports on prices of the Internal Trade Branch.
