CANADIAN GRAIN MOVEMENT 1947-48

The Canadian crop year 1947-48 commencing August 1, 1947 covered a period in which the need continued to be urgent for large shipments of grains into deficit areas. Although total world bread grain production was estimated to be higher than the 1946 outturn, extremely variable weather conditions in western Europe during the spring and summer of 1947 resulted in outturns that were about 17 per cent below the previous year and 32 per cent below the 1935-39 average. Conditions were such that import requirements of the deficit areas were substantially larger than in 1946-47. To meet the increased requirements there was a near-record production of spring wheat in the United States and the first billion-bushel winter wheat crop on record. Favourable harvests in the Argentine and Australia also did much to bolster the total world bread grain supply.

However, the Canadian outlook was not favourable. The 1947 wheat crop of 341.8 million bushels was some 72 million bushels below the previous year, the carry-over into the crop year at 86.1 million bushels was the second lowest since 1938. Total supplies, therefore, were 69.4 million bushels less than in the crop year 1946-47. A reduced movement of wheat within Canada and into export channels resulted.

A reduction in car unloadings at the lakehead during 1947-48 reflected the reduced harvest and consequent smaller deliveries by farmers. Only 89,457 cars of wheat were unloaded at Fort William-Port Arthur, compared with 115,653 carloads during 1946-47. Movement of wheat via the water route from the lakehead amounted to 134.5 million bushels, a reduction of 41.3 million bushels from 1946-47.

The extent of export movement of grain from Canada during the 1947-48 crop year was also affected by the small crop. Total exports of Canadian wheat and wheat flour for the crop year totalled 195.0 million bushels, a decrease of 47.9 million bushels from the previous crop year and 101.9 million bushels from the five-year average of 296.9 million for the period 1942-43 to 1946-47. Exports to the United States continued to show a sharp decline, only 133,560 bushels going to that country in 1947-48 compared with shipments of 1.7 million bushels in 1946-47 and 12.3 million in 1945-46. Overseas shipments of 194.8 million bushels of wheat and flour were 46.3 million bushels less than the previous year. The bulk of overseas shipments, 160.7 million bushels, went to the United Kingdom. Of the remaining 34.1 million bushels, 17.3 million went to destinations within the British Empire and 16.8 million bushels to 47 foreign countries. Exports to foreign countries were drastically reduced from the 59.6 million bushels for the previous crop year, resulting mostly from a reduced Canadian export surplus as well as economic measures instituted by some countries to conserve foreign exchange. The most noticeable decrease in purchases of Canadian wheat from the previous year occurred in the exports to Egypt, China, Philippine Islands, Belgium, Italy and the Netherlands.

Overseas clearances of wheat, exclusive of wheat flour were 133.4 million bushels in 1947-48 as compared with 161.7 million bushels in 1946-47. Shipments of 15.7 million bushels of wheat cleared through United States ports, although 3.8 million greater than last year were still sharply down from the 54.8 million for the five-year average 1942-43—1946-47. Declines in export clearances were registered at some Canadian ports while at the port of Churchill nearly 2 million more bushels of wheat moved this year over last year's total of 2.9 million bushels. Through the ports of Montreal and Vancouver-New Westminster moved the largest amounts of Canadian wheat for export, with Montreal handling 38.3 million bushels and Vancouver-New Westminster 36.1 million bushels. However the wheat shipments through the Montreal and Vancouver-New Westminster ports were some 16.9 million and 20.0 million bushels, respectively, less in 1947-48 than in the previous year. No export shipments of wheat were cleared from the ports of Victoria, Prince Rupert, Quebec and Saint John in 1947-48.

Flour exports for the crop year dropped some 4.0 million barrels from 17.7 million in 1946-47 to 13.7 million for 1947-48. The United Kingdom received 8.6 million barrels compared with 7.9 million barrels in the previous year. Exports of flour to this country represented 62.8 per cent of Canada's total exports in 1947-48 as compared with 44.6 per cent in the previous year. The remaining 5.1 million barrels exported in 1947-48 were divided among other British Empire and foreign countries, with 2.8 million going to the former and 2.2 million barrels to the latter destinations.

WESTERN WHEAT CROP

The 1947 wheat crop in the Prairie Provinces amounted to 320 million bushels, some 73 million bushels less than the 1946 outturn. Although some of the decrease may be attributed to a slightly smaller acreage seeded in 1947, most of the reduction was due to a decrease in yield per acre of 2.9 bushels from the previous year. The initial payment to wheat producers was raised on March 25, 1948, 20 cents per bushel from \$1.35 per bushel basis No. 1 Northern in store Fort William-Port Arthur or Vancouver to \$1.55. This 20 cent increase in the initial payment was also made retroactive to the 1945-46 and 1946-47 crop year deliveries.

During the crop year western farmers marketed 246.6 million bushels of wheat, 88 million bushels less than the previous year. The decrease in farmers' wheat marketings was thus considerably more than the decrease in 1947 production compared with that of 1946. On May 31, 1948, farmers were urged to market all their surplus wheat before the end of the crop year, in order to meet export demand. At the beginning of the 1947-48 crop year the Canadian Wheat Board announced that delivery quotas of 10 bushels per authorized acre would be effective at all points excepting certain specific points declared open. The quota system was used with the intention of providing fair allocation of country elevator space to individual farmers and restrictions were eased as rapidly as conditions permitted. By October 14, open quotas for wheat had been established at all western shipping points.

Inspections of wheat in the Western Division during the crop year amounted to 235.3 million bushels, a decrease of 76.4 million under the previous year. Winnipeg again remained the leading inspection point with other points ranking practically the same as in the previous year. Quality of the 1947-48 crop, as indicated by the grading, was substantially different from the previous crop year. Only 7.7 per cent of western spring wheat graded No. 1 Manitoba Hard and No. 1 Manitoba Northern compared with 14.4 per cent for No. 1 Manitoba Northern alone the previous year. The percentage grading No. 2 Manitoba Northern was also low, 34.9 per cent of all western spring wheat reaching the grade compared with 45.3 per cent for 1946.

EASTERN WHEAT CROP

Production of wheat in eastern Canada during the 1947 crop year amounted to 18.8 million bushels compared with the 1946 crop of 17.6 million bushels. With the exception of about 500,000 bushels, all the 1947 eastern wheat crop was produced in Ontario. For this crop the Ontario producer received a total payment of \$1.63 per bushel, representing the maximum ceiling price of \$1.55 plus an equalization payment of 8 cents per bushel. However, on June 18, 1948, the ceiling was removed and the wheat payment of 8 cents per bushel discontinued. No deliveries were made to the Canadian Wheat Board. The quantity of Ontario winter wheat milled into flour during 1947-48 amounted to 3.3 million bushels, as compared with 3.1 million for 1946-47.

COARSE GRAINS

Canada's coarse grain production in 1947 with the exception of flaxseed and rye was down slightly from the 1946 crop. Of the 278.7 million bushels of oats and 141.4 million bushels of barley produced in Canada, the Prairie Provinces accounted for 194 million bushels and 131 million bushels respectively. Total rye production of 13.2 million bushels included 11.6 million bushels grown in western Canada and only 690,800 bushels of the large flaxseed crop of 12,240,800 bushels were grown outside the Prairie Provinces.

Western Canada dominated the commercial disposition of coarse grains as well as the production, since most of the grain raised in eastern Canada is consumed on the farms where it is grown. Domestic shipments of the commercial supplies of western Canadian coarse grains during the 1947-48 crop year are summarized below:

Substantial quantities of Canadian coarse grains were also exported during the crop year, with rye and flaxseed showing decided increases over amounts exported during the previous year. Exports of coarse grains consisted of 5.4 million bushels of oats (excluding rolled oats and oatmeal) 2.7 million bushels of barley, 10.2 million bushels of rye and 1.8 million bushels of flaxseed.

FLOUR MILLING IN CANADA

The steadily rising flour production in Canadian mills over the last few years came to a halt in 1947-48 with an output of only 24.2 million barrels, a decline of 4.4 million barrels from the all-time high of the previous crop year. Wheat milled for the production of this flour amounted to 109.8 million bushels, a decrease of 18.0 million bushels from the record year of 1946-47. Exports of wheat flour (based on customs returns) for the crop year under survey amounted to 13.7 million barrels, equivalent to 56.5 per cent of the same year's production but down from the 1946-47 export by 4.0 million barrels.

In the following Table is shown the Record of Flour Milling in Canada during the Twenty-five Crop Years from 1923 to 1948 with Export Figures.

The percentage of milling capacity for the past crop year averaged 81.0 per cent, a decrease of 19.8 per cent from that of the previous year. In reviewing the monthly percentages, it will be observed that the mills operated in excess of 100.0 per cent of capacity for eight months in 1946-47 but for only one month in 1947-48.

Manitoba spring wheat was the chief type of wheat ground in Canada's flour mills during the crop year and represented 87.30 per cent of the total grind. A small percentage of United States wheat appeared again in the miller's grind. The Ontario winter wheat milled was higher than for the previous crop year, while Garnet wheat disappeared entirely.

Total flour produced amounted to 24,159,696 barrels, bran 360,613 tons, shorts 338,809 tons, middlings 167,302 tons, oatmeal 3,691,158 pounds, rolled oats 143,867,438 pounds, buckwheat flour 847,877 pounds, rye flour, corn flour and meal 11,571,876 pounds, barley, pot and pearl, and meal 17,341,925 pounds.

Total feeds were as follows: Ground oats for feed 500,907,587 pounds; barley feed 425,972,102 pounds; corn cracked 37,784,421 pounds; mixed grain feed 816,357,011 pounds and feed not otherwise specified 77,944 tons.

Other facts relative to the flour industry in Canada, such as the number and the provincial location of plants, the capital investment and the daily flour production capacity are shown in the several tables which follow. It will be seen from these that in 1947, there were 961 plants with a daily production capacity of 106,821 barrels of flour.


