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PREFATORY NOTE

This report has been prepared by the Statistics Branch of the Board of Grain Commissioners in collaboration with the Agriculture Division of the Dominion Bureau of Statistics. Grateful acknowledgement is made to the Canadian Wheat Board, to mill and elevator operators and to the many other agencies and officials for their co-operation.

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CANADIAN GRAIN MOVEMENT 1948-49

The Canadian crop year 1948-49, commencing August 1, 1948, coincided with a period in which world food production and supplies showed considerable improvement over the immediate postwar years. World grain production in 1948 approached or exceeded prewar levels in nearly all regions and the world grain export surplus was the largest since 1930-31. Other highlights of the period were the abolition of the international allocation of all foodstuffs except rice; the discontinuance or relaxation of the rationing of bread and other foodstuffs throughout most of Europe; gradually declining prices, particularly of breadgrains; and the ratification during the latter part of the crop year of the International Wheat Agreement culminating a long series of attempts to achieve some measure of stability in international wheat marketing.

Canada shared in the improved production picture, with outturns of all grains in 1948 exceeding those of 1947. The 1948 wheat crop of 386.3 million bushels was up some 44.6 million from the previous year. Although the carryover into the crop year of 77.7 million bushels was 8.4 million below that of the preceding crop year, total supplies at 464.3 million bushels were some 35.6 million greater than in 1947-48. Increased marketings, rail and lake movement, and exports of Canadian wheat all reflected the improved supply position over the previous year.

Car unloadings of Canadian grain at the lakehead during 1948-49 amounted to 170,000 as compared with 147,000 in 1947-48. Approximately 59 per cent of the 1948-49 total consisted of wheat. Of the wheat moving out of the terminals at Fort William-Port Arthur 159.9 million bushels went via water while only 13.5 million bushels were shipped eastward by rail.

The export movement of Canadian wheat, oats, barley and flaxseed showed marked improvement over 1947-48, rye exports were practically unchanged and wheat flour exports were down about 22 per cent from the preceding crop year. Total exports of Canadian wheat and wheat flour in terms of wheat for 1948-49 amounted to 232.3 million bushels, an increase of 37.3 million over the previous year, but well below the average of 292.9 million for the five-year period 1943-44 to 1947-48. Exports of wheat and flour to the United States at 5.5 million bushels (including 3.8 million for milling in bond) were up sharply from 1947-48. Overseas shipments totalled 226.8 million bushels, an increase of 32 million over the previous crop year. In line with recent trade patterns the bulk of overseas shipments, 151.7 million bushels, went to the United Kingdom. Total shipments to all Commonwealth countries accounted for 183.7 million bushels or 79 per cent of the total exports. Shipments to some 60 countries outside the Commonwealth amounted to 48.6 million bushels, almost three times the comparatively low total for 1947-48. In the latter group, Switzerland, the United States, Italy and Belgium were among the leading purchasers.

Overseas clearances of wheat, exclusive of wheat flour, totalled 179.0 million bushels in 1948-49, an increase of 45.6 million over the previous crop year. Only 9.8 million bushels of the 1948-49 overseas clearances were shipped via United States ports, as compared with 15.7 million in the previous crop year and an average of 45.0 million for the five-year period of 1943-44 to 1947-48. With two exceptions, Sorel and Three Rivers, all Canadian ports shipping wheat cleared greater quantities in 1948-49 than in the previous crop year. Clearances of wheat through Montreal and Vancouver-New Westminster were 61.5 million and 60.4 million bushels, respectively, accounting for 72 per cent of the total shipped through Canadian ports.

Flour exports for 1948-49 amounted to 10.7 million barrels, continuing the downward trend from the peak of 16.9 million barrels in 1946-47. Exports of flour to the United Kingdom, at 5.1 million barrels, accounted for almost half the total but were well below the 8.6 million shipped the previous crop year. Other parts of the Commonwealth purchased 2.1 million barrels of Canadian wheat flour; the remaining 3.5 million went to 57 foreign countries.

WESTERN WHEAT CROP

The 1948 wheat crop in the Prairie Provinces amounted to 356 million bushels, an increase of 36 million over the previous years' outturn. While there was a decrease of approximately half a million acres from the 1947 area, this was more than offset by the increase in average yield from 13.7 to 15.6 bushels per acre. The initial price for wheat paid to western producers was

increased on April 1, 1949 by 20 cents to \$1.75 per bushel, basis No. 1 Northern in store Fort William–Port Arthur or Vancouver. The new initial payment was made retroactive to cover all deliveries of western wheat from August 1, 1945. It was also announced that the new payment would remain in effect throughout the duration of the five-year pool period ending July 31, 1950.

Marketings of wheat by western farmers during the crop year totalled 294.0 million bushels, up 47.4 million over 1947–48. No delivery quotas were established in Manitoba, and quotas of 10 bushels per seeded acre which were made effective at specified points in Saskatchewan and Alberta on August 30 were relaxed as storage and shipping conditions permitted. By November 26 all points in these two provinces had also been placed on an open delivery quota basis. With commercial supplies falling off toward the end of the crop year, the Canadian Wheat Board urged all producers of western wheat to deliver as much wheat as possible to meet domestic requirements and overseas commitments.

Inspections of wheat in the Western Division during the crop year amounted to 167,000 carloads as compared with 142,000 in the previous year. Winnipeg is the principal inspection point, and 107,000 carloads, representing some 64 per cent of the total, were inspected there during 1948–49. Quality of the 1948–49 crop, as indicated by the proportions falling into the higher grades, showed a marked improvement over 1947–48, reflecting the generally excellent harvesting conditions existing in the fall of 1948. Of all Western wheat inspected 71.3 per cent graded No. 1 and 2 Northern, in sharp contrast to only 39.7 per cent in the previous year. Equally sharp contrast was evident in the proportion of wheat grading tough—only 5.6 per cent of all grades and varieties in 1948–49 as against 31.1 per cent in 1947–48.

EASTERN WHEAT CROP

Production of wheat in eastern Canada during 1948–49 totalled 27.9 million bushels, approximately 50 per cent greater than the preceding year's outturn of 18.8 million. With the exception of about 700,000 bushels, all of the 1948 eastern wheat crop was produced in Ontario. Slightly over 26 million bushels of Ontario's crop was winter wheat, yielding an average of 30.3 bushels per acre. The quantity of Ontario winter wheat milled into flour during 1948–49 amounted to 5.7 million bushels, an increase of 2.3 million bushels over the preceding year.

COARSE GRAINS

Production of all Canadian coarse grains in 1948 exceeded the 1947 outturns. Of the 358.8 million bushels of oats and 155.0 million bushels of barley produced in 1948, the Prairie Provinces accounted for 224 million and 142 million bushels, respectively. The rye crop of 25.3 million bushels was almost double the previous year's outturn of 13.2 million and production of flaxseed, at 17.7 million bushels, was also up sharply from the preceding year. All but 3 million bushels of the 1948 rye crop and 0.9 million bushels of the flaxseed were grown in the Prairie Provinces.

Marketings of coarse grains and flaxseed in the Prairie Provinces were also above the levels of 1947–48, with 85.9 million bushels of oats, 70.3 million of barley, 17.5 million of rye and 15.2 million of flaxseed marketed during the crop year. Expressed as a percentage of production, the 1948–49 proportions of these grains marketed were oats 38.4, barley 49.5, rye 78.3 and flaxseed 90.1 per cent. As with wheat, a large proportion of the coarse grains qualified for the higher grades. Of the oats inspected 84 per cent graded No. 1 Feed or better; 61 per cent of the barley No. 1 Feed or better; 90.6 per cent of the rye No. 3 C.W. or better and 94 per cent of the flaxseed graded No. 1 C.W.

The volume of oats, barley and flaxseed exported showed marked increases over the 1947–48 totals but rye exports remained almost unchanged. Exports of coarse grains during 1948–49 consisted of 21.4 million bushels of oats (excluding rolled oats and oatmeal), 21.7 million bushels of barley, 10.2 million bushels of rye and 4.4 million bushels of flaxseed. The United States was Canada's best customer, taking over 58 per cent of the exports of coarse grains, flaxseed, milled or processed products during the crop year.

FLOUR MILLING IN CANADA

The volume of wheat flour produced in Canadian mills in 1948-49 dropped to 20.4 million barrels, a decline of 3.8 million barrels from the previous year, but still well above the pre-war (1935-39) average of 15.0 million barrels. Wheat milled for the production of this flour amounted to 90.9 million bushels, a decrease of 18.9 million bushels from the crop year 1947-48. Exports of wheat flour (based on adjusted customs returns) for the crop year under survey amounted to 10.7 million barrels, equivalent to 52.4 per cent of the same year's production, but down from the 1947-48 export by 3.0 million barrels.
