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

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
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#### MILK PRODUCTION AND UTILIZATION, 1956-57



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#### THE DAIRY SITUATION IN NOVEMBER, 1957

Preliminary estimates indicate total milk production for the month of November to be about 1,223 million pounds, 8.4 per cent higher than November 1956. This estimate would bring cumulative January to November total milk production to 16,426 million pounds, one and a half per cent greater than the corresponding cumulative total for 1956. Until October, monthly cumulative totals had been less than the corresponding total for 1956.

Milk used in dairy factories continues to show a sharp increase over last year. Creamery butter production, each month since August, has been using increasingly more milk than last year. Almost 25 per cent more milk was used for creamery butter manufacture this November than last November. By December 1st, creamery butter production was within 1 per cent of the corresponding total for last year. Butter production in November appears to have expanded at the expense of cheese production, which for the first time since March has been less than in the corresponding month of 1956. Lesser amounts of milk were also used for concentrated milk products and ice cream, compared to previous monthly increases over last year. The table below summarizes the comparison of 1956 and 1957 milk equivalents.

In contrast to comparisons for previous months, fluid milk sales in October were only equal to fluid sales of last October. The increase of milk prices in certain major markets may have had some influence. November fluid sales are not expected to vary significantly from last year.

Indications from the dairy correspondent's survey are that farm butter production in September and October, for the first time this year, exceeded last year's production. This trend is likely to continue for November. The continuing trend of the last four months for milk fed to livestock and whole milk consumed on farms to be below 1956 is still in evidence. Although whole milk fed to livestock in November was 5 per cent less than the same month last year the cumulative total was about 2 per cent above last year.

The estimate of an increase in total milk production in November is supported by the monthly survey which shows an increase over last year of almost 6 per cent in production per cow, and over one and a half per cent in cows being milked.

### FARM MILK PRODUCTION, UTILIZATION AND INCOME IN OCTOBER, 1957\*

Farm Wilk Production: The estimated quantity of milk produced on farms in October amounted to 1,544,060,000 pounds. This represents an increase of 94 million pounds or 6.5 per cent above that of October, 1956. Of this amount 899 million pounds or 58 per cent was utilized in factory production, while fluid sales absorbed approximately 486 million pounds or 31.5 per cent of the total milk supply. During January-October production was estimated at 15,203 million pounds, an increase of 148 million pounds in comparison with the same period of the previous year. The quantity of milk utilized for factory production in January-October amounted to 8,705 million pounds, while fluid sales accounted for 4,758 million pounds.

Fluid Sales: During October sales of fluid milk and cream (the latter expressed as milk) amounted to 485,944,000 pounds, an increase of approximately 382 thousand pounds in comparison with the previous October. This included about 411 million pounds of fluid milk, comprising about 26.6 per cent of the farm milk supply and fluid cream sales of 75 million pounds representing 4.9 per cent. During the ten month period, January-October, fluid sales totalled 4,758,381,000 pounds which was about 137 million pounds or 3 per cent over those of January-October 1956.

Dairy Butter: The dairy butter make in October amounted to 1,743,000 pounds increasing 4 per cent from the corresponding month in 1956. For the ten months, January-October 15,127,000 pounds were produced, a decrease of 3 per cent from the same period last year.

Farm Cash Income: Cash income from the sale of dairy products in October amounted to \$42,766,000. This represented an increase of 11.2 per cent or \$4,315,000 in comparison with the same month last year. The weighted average price of \$3.08 per hundred pounds of milk was 10 cents higher than in October, 1956. Fluid milk at \$4.66 per hundred was 33 cents higher than that of October, 1956. Creamery butterfat increased from 60.3 cents to 63.9 cents per pound, and dairy butter at 60 cents was 3 cents higher than in October, 1956. Milk used in manufacture increased from \$2.66 per hundred in October, 1956 to \$2.95 per hundred in October, 1957. Cheese milk at \$2.68 per hundred, was the same as in October, 1956.

# PRODUCTION, DISTRIBUTION AND PRICES OF DAIRY PRODUCTS IN OCTOBER, 1957

Butter: Total butter production (including creamery, dairy and whey butter) amounted to 31 1/4 million pounds in October, 1957. This represented an increase of 4 1/4 million pounds or 15 per cent as compared with the same month last year. The January-October output of 287 1/2 million pounds was 2 per cent below the total for the same period of the previous year.

Stock Holdings: Holdings of butter in store and transit, which amounted to 89 1/2 million pounds at October 1, advanced to 90 million pounds on November 1. Compared with those of a year ago, the stocks at October 1, showed a decrease of approximately 32 3/4 million pounds, while those of November 1 declined 27 1/2 million pounds.

The Butter Supply: The quantity of butter represented by stocks on October 1, production and imports during the month, amounted to 120 3/4 million pounds. This was a decrease of approximately 28 1/2 million pounds as compared with last year.

Domestic Disappearance: The domestic disappearance of butter in October, including creamery, dairy and whey butter, amounted to 30 3/4 million pounds, a decrease of 1 million pounds. On a per capita basis the domestic disappearance amounted to 1.88 pounds as compared with 1.97 pounds a year ago. During the January-October period the domestic disappearance of total butter amounted to 285 3/4 million pounds as compared with 275 1/2 million pounds in the same period of 1956; and the per capita disappearance of 17.49 pounds may be compared with 17.13 pounds a year earlier.

Butter Prices at Montreal: Butter prices at Montreal, based on dealers quotations for first grade solids, averaged 61 1/2 cents per pound in October, as compared with 58 cents in October, 1956.

Cheese Production: Cheddar Cheese production in October, 1957 amounted to approximately 8 3/4 million pounds, an increase of 43 thousand pounds or less than 1 per cent more than that produced in October, 1956.

Cheese Prices: Ontario coloured cheese at Montreal averaged 35 3/8 cents in October, 1957. This compares with 35 5/8 cents in October, 1956.

Concentrated Milk Products: The total quantity of concentrated milk products manufactured in October was approximately 45 1/2 million pounds, which represented an increase of 5 3/4 million pounds in comparison with the same month last year. Concentrated whole milk products decreased 3 million pounds, while by-products registered an increase of 8 3/4 million pounds. Evaporated milk, one of the most important of the whole milk products decreased 4 million pounds and the production of skim milk powder, the leading milk by-product, was 8 million pounds above the output of October, 1956.

Ice Cream: The quantity of ice cream manufactured in October was approximately 2 1/4 million gallons, an increase of 82 thousand gallons in comparison with the October production a year earlier. Production during the ten-month period January-October amounted to 31,270,000 gallons. This represented an increase of 1,701,000 gallons as compared with that produced in the same period of 1956.
