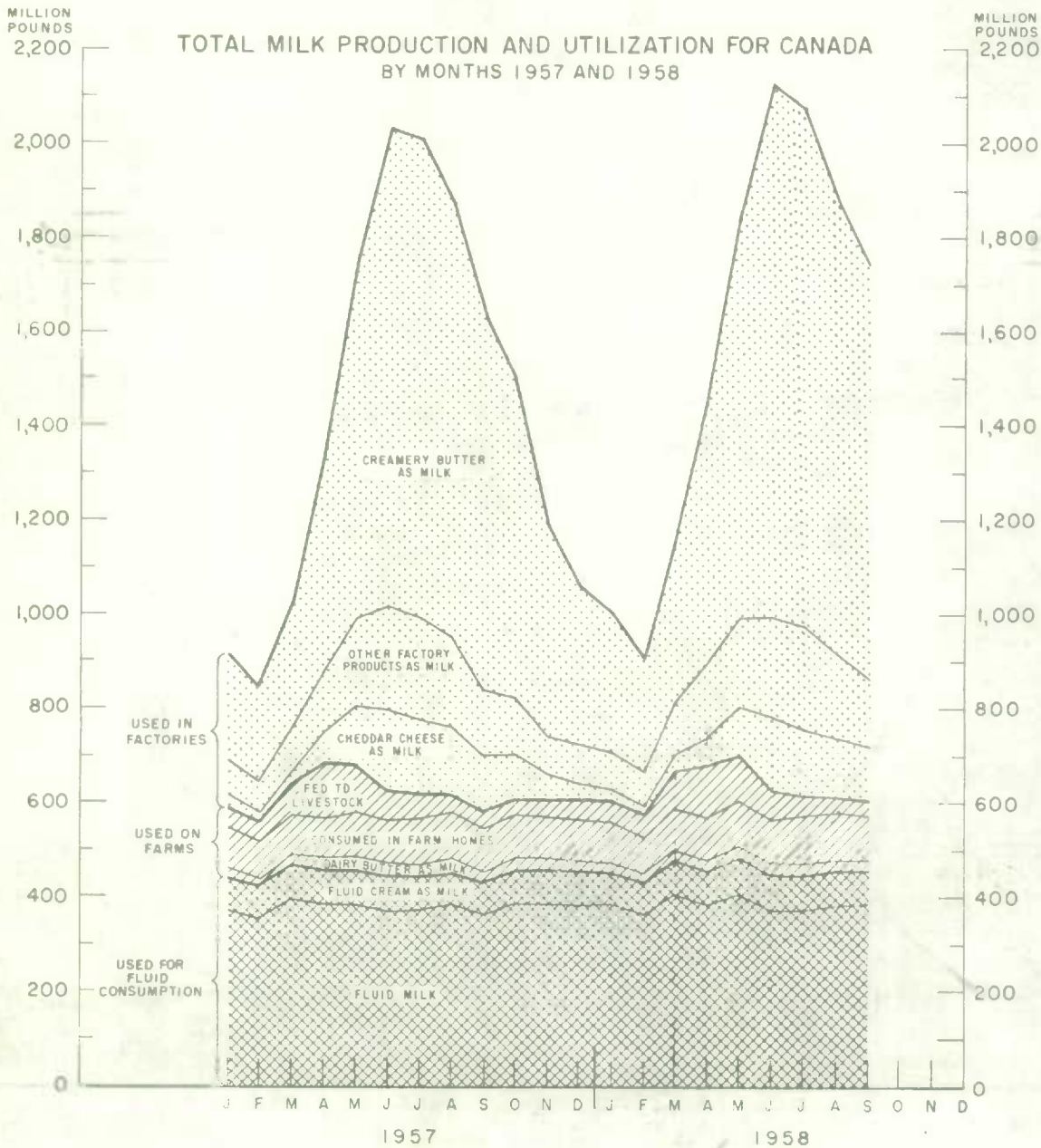

THE DAIRY SITUATION, OCTOBER, 1958

The mild open fall of 1957 was repeated in September and October of 1958 and milk production this year reached an even higher level than in the recovery period of 1957. The preliminary estimate places total milk production in Canada at about 1,563,000,000 pounds in October, 4.1 per cent greater than in October 1957. Cumulative January-October milk production is expected to have reached 15,737,000,000 pounds, 5.5 per cent greater than in the first 10 months of 1957.

The manufacture of dairy factory products again in October used more than half of total milk production, exceeding last years total of milk going into dairy factory products by 5.6 per cent. Creamery butter production, the most important dairy factory product, continued to use the largest share of the increase in milk production, both on a percentage basis and on a volume basis, in cumulative January-October data and in October data. The utilization of milk for concentrated whole milk products fell 15 per cent below the corresponding month last year while cheddar cheese and ice cream production used slightly less and slightly more milk respectively than in the same month a year earlier. The January-October cumulative figures show an increase of 12 per cent in milk going into creamery butter, a decrease of 9 per cent in milk going into cheddar cheese and about the same as last year for milk going into concentrated whole milk products and ice cream.

Fluid sales of milk and cream during the month of September increased 5.4 per cent over fluid sales in the corresponding month a year earlier, a surprising increase after the very small increases shown by previous months. For the purpose of the tentative estimate, however, fluid sales in October were expected to have exceeded fluid sales last October by about 2 per cent, the average increase of July, August and September over the corresponding three months of 1957.

Dairy correspondents report 16 per cent more milk fed to livestock in October than in October 1957 but the cumulative January-October increase over the same period last year amounted to only 3 per cent. Milk consumed in farm homes during the month of October was reported to be 1 per cent greater than in the corresponding period last year, both in October and in the first 10 months of 1958. The October 15th survey showed no change from October 1957 for number of milk cows in the herd or in cows milked. Production per cow however, as in past months, remained sharply higher than in October last year on farms reporting to the monthly survey.

FARM MILK PRODUCTION, UTILIZATION AND INCOME IN SEPTEMBER, 1958

Farm Milk Production: The estimated quantity of milk produced on farms in September amounted to 1,742,167,000 pounds. This represents an increase of 112 million pounds or 6.9 per cent above that of September, 1957. Of this amount, 1,139 million pounds or 66 per cent was utilized in factory production, while fluid sales absorbed approximately 453 million pounds or 26 per cent of the total milk supply. During January - September, the estimated production was 14,174 million pounds, an increase of 760 million pounds more than that produced in the same period of the previous year. The quantity of milk utilized for factory production in January - September amounted to 8,485 million pounds while fluid sales accounted for 4,101 million pounds.

Fluid Sales: Sales of fluid milk and cream, the latter expressed as milk, amounted to 452,809,000 pounds in September, an increase of approximately 23 million pounds in comparison with September of the previous year. This included about 384 million pounds of fluid milk, comprising about 22 per cent of the farm supply, and fluid cream sales of 69 million pounds representing 4 per cent. During the nine-month period, January - September, fluid sales totalled 4,101,279,000 pounds, an increase of 84 million pounds or approximately 2 per cent over those of the 1957 period.

Dairy Butter: The dairy butter make in September amounted to 1,013,000 pounds, decreasing 11 per cent from the corresponding month in 1957. For the nine months, January - September, 8,969,000 pounds were produced, a decrease of 5 per cent from the same period last year.

Farm Cash Income: Cash income from the sale of dairy products in September amounted to \$47,436,000. This represented an increase of approximately 10 per cent or \$4,137,000 in comparison with the same month last year. The weighted average price of \$2.98 per hundred pounds of milk was 6 cents higher than in September 1957. Fluid milk at \$4.64 per hundred was 11 cents higher than September, 1957. Creamery butter-fat increased from 63.6 cents to 66.5 cents per pound, and dairy butter at 61 cents was 1 cent higher than in September, 1957. Milk used in manufacture declined from \$2.93 per hundred in September, 1957, to \$2.85 per hundred in September, 1958. Cheese milk advanced to \$2.64 per hundred, an increase of 2 cents per hundred in comparison with the same month a year earlier.

PRODUCTION AND PRICES OF DAIRY PRODUCTS IN SEPTEMBER, 1958

BUTTER

Production: Total butter production including creamery, dairy and whey butter amounted to 38.9 million pounds in September, 1958. This was 3.7 million pounds or approximately 11 per cent more than that produced in the same month of the previous year.

Stocks: Holdings of butter in store and transit on October 1 amounted to 111.7 million pounds, approximately 21.6 million pounds more than last year. On September 1, 1958, the stock holdings of 101.9 million pounds represented an increase of 18.4 million pounds as compared with the previous year.

Supply: The quantity of butter represented by stocks on September 1, plus production and imports during September, amounted to 140.8 million pounds. This was an increase of approximately 22.1 million pounds in comparison with September, 1957.

Domestic Disappearance: The domestic disappearance of butter in September including creamery, dairy and whey butter, amounted to 29.1 million pounds, an increase of 0.5 million pounds or 2 per cent. On a per capita basis the domestic disappearance amounted to 1.72 pounds, the same as that reported a year ago.

Prices: Butter prices at Montreal, based on dealers' quotations for first grade solids, averaged $63\frac{1}{2}$ cents per pound in September as against $61\frac{1}{4}$ cents last year.

CHEDDAR CHEESE

Production: Cheddar cheese production amounted to approximately 10.6 million pounds, representing a decrease of about 0.4 million pounds as compared with that produced in the same month of the previous year.

Prices: The Montreal price of Ontario coloured cheese averaged $35\frac{1}{8}$ cents per pound in September. The comparative price in 1957 was $35\frac{3}{8}$ cents.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS

The total quantity of concentrated milk products manufactured in September was approximately 58.4 million pounds, an increase of 7.8 million pounds as compared with last year. Concentrated whole milk products decreased 0.8 million pounds while milk by-products increased 8.6 million pounds. Evaporated milk, the most important of the whole milk products, showed a decrease of 0.9 million pounds and the production of skim milk powder, the leading skim milk product, increased 8.7 million pounds.

ICE CREAM

The quantity of ice cream manufactured in September was approximately 3.0 million gallons or 59 thousand gallons more than that produced a year ago.
