PRODUCTION OF BUTTER AND CHEESE

The production of creamery butter in Canada during the month of May, 1937 amounted to 24,444,582 pounds as compared with 25,171,449 pounds in May, 1936, a decrease of approximately 727 thousand pounds or 2.9 per cent. The cumulative production for the five months ending May 1937, amounted to 65,385,826 pounds, as compared with 66,333,819 pounds for the same period last year, a decrease of approximately 948 thousand pounds or 1.4 per cent.

Cheese production in Canada in the month of May, 1937, reached a total of 11,259,643 pounds. In the seven provinces, New Brunswick, Quebec, Ontario, Manitoba, Saskatchewan, Alberta and British Columbia, for which comparative data are available for the same month last year, an increase of about 2 million pounds or 20.6 per cent is recorded. The cumulative production for the five months ending May, 1937, amounted to 16,685,178 pounds. In the seven provinces for which comparative data are available for the same period last year, an increase of approximately 2 million pounds or 14.5 per cent is recorded.
