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
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

CREAMERY BUTTER PRODUCTION in August decreased approximately 10.6 per cent as compared with the output for the preceding month. During the month of August 37 million pounds were produced, and during the eight months ended August, the output reached a total of 213.7 million pounds. The decrease in the August make occured in all provinces except Alberta and British Columbia.

DAIRY BUTTER PRODUCTION in July, based on returns from representative groups of Dairy Correspondents decreased 4 per cent as compared with that produced in the same month of the preceding year and decreased 23 per cent in comparison with the June output.

WHEY BUTTER PRODUCTION in August amounted to 317,426 pounds, a decrease of 1.6 per cent over the output for the same month a year ago. Of this total 235,000 thousand pounds were made in Ontario, the remainder being produced in Quebec Manitoba, Alberta and British Columbia.

CHEDDAR CHEESE PRODUCTION decreased approximately 2 thousand pounds in August as compared with August, 1943, and was 8.2 per cent below that of the previous month. The August make was approximately 25.8 million pounds, and the total for the eight months, January to August amounted to 120.3 million pounds. An increase occured in all provinces except New Brunswick and Ontario.

ICE CREAM PRODUCTION in August amounted to approximately 2.5 million gallons, an increase of nearly 6 per cent over the August output of 1943. For the eight months, January to August 13.8 million gallons were produced, representing an increase of 3.7 per cent in comparison with the same eight-month period of the preceding year.

<u>CREAMERY BUTTER PRICES</u> at Montreal, as quoted by the Canadian Commodity Exchange for the first grade product, averaged 34 1/3 cents a pound, as compared with 33 1/4 cents a pound in August, 1943. Domestic Cheese at Montreal was unchanged being 20 cents both last year and this year. <u>Export cheese prices</u>, as set by the Government, for the first grade product continues at 20 cents a pounds, f.o.b. factory or grading station shipping point.

The domestic disappearance of creamery butter in the month of July amounted to 24.7 million pounds, an increase of 4.5 per cent over that shown in the same month last year.

The domestic disappearance of creamery and dairy butter combined amounted to 29.1 million pounds or 2.43 pounds per capita. In the same month of 1943 it averaged 2.37 pounds per capita

ORDERS AFFECTING THE PRODUCTION, PRICES AND SALE OF DAIRY PRODUCTS

August 28, 1944. Effective September 1, 1944, monthly sales of fluid cream by distributors in any designated market are to be limited to quantities sold in terms of butter-fat in the month of June 1944. (Administrator's Order No. A-1331 W.P.T.B.)

- 1. The term "distributor" refers to any person engaged in distributing or processing fluid cream, whether the cream is sold to other distributors or direct to consumers; or if the person is a producer-distributor.
- 2. The term "designated market" includes some 86 cities and towns in Canada with specified areas described in the aforesaid order.
- 3 Restrictions in regard to the sale of fluid cream do not apply to cream sold by a primary producer to a dairy, creamery, distributor or manufacturer; nor does it apply to sales made by a distributor or manufacturer to another distributor or manufacturer.
- 4. Under this order all sellers of fluid cream are required to keep adequate written records showing the particulars of their fluid cream sales.
- 5. The butter-fat contained in fluid cream may be fixed or varied as the administrator of dairy products may deem necessary.
