


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Preliminary Indications of the Dairy Situation, December, 1959

Milk production in Canada during December is tentatively estimated at 1,162,000,000 pounds, 4 per cent higher than in the same month a year ago. Cumulative January to December milk production amounted to 18,121,000,000 pounds, slightly greater than production during 1958.

Dairy factories used 517,000,000 pounds of milk in December, 8 per cent more than in December, 1958. Cheddar cheese production utilized 57 per cent more milk than in the corresponding month a year earlier which is the highest monthly increase recorded for any major dairy product during 1959. For the first time since April, more milk went into creamery butter than in the corresponding month a year earlier. The summary for 1959 shows a slight decline in milk used for dairy products with 4 per cent less milk going into creamery butter but an increased supply of milk for the manufacture of cheddar cheese, concentrated whole milk products and ice cream which used 16, 3 and 9 per cent respectively more milk than in 1958.

Fluid sales of milk and cream were estimated at 490,000,000 pounds for December. This is 2.5 per cent greater than in December, 1958, and represents the average increase of September, October and November over the same three months in 1958.

From the monthly survey of farms keeping milk cows, indications are that 1/4,000,000 pounds of milk was used on farms during December, a decrease of 4 per cent from milk used on farms in the same month a year earlier. Compared to December, 1958, 3 per cent less milk was consumed in farm homes but 2 per cent more was fed to livestock. In 1959, about 15 per cent less milk was used for butter making on farms, 2 per cent less milk was consumed in farm homes and 4 per cent more was fed to livestock than during 1958.

In December, milk production per cow on farms covered by the survey remained at the same level as in December, 1958, but more cows were reported milking.

Farm Milk Production, Utilization and Income in November, 1959

Farm Milk Production: The estimated quantity of milk produced on farms in November amounted to 1,197,996,000 pounds, an increase of 11 million pounds or 0.9 per cent over that of November, 1958. Of this amount, 605 million pounds or 51 per cent was utilized in factory production, and approximately 454 million pounds or 38 per cent was used for fluid sales. During January-November, the estimated production was 16,945 million pounds, an increase of 17 million pounds over that produced in the same period of the previous year. The quantity of milk utilized for factory production in January-November amounted to 9,967 million pounds while fluid sales accounted for 5,135 million pounds.

Fluid Sales: Sales of fluid milk and cream, the latter expressed as milk, amounted to 453,993,000 pounds in November, an increase of approximately 3 million pounds in comparison with November of the previous year. This included about 382 million pounds of fluid milk, comprising about 32 per cent of the farm milk supply, and fluid cream sales of 72 million pounds representing 6 per cent. During the eleven month period, fluid sales totalled 5,135 million pounds, an increase of 122 million pounds or approximately 2.4 per cent over those of the corresponding 1958 period.

Farm Butter: Butter made on farms in November amounted to 752,000 pounds, decreasing 24 per cent from the corresponding month in 1958. For January-November, 9,192,000 pounds were produced, a decrease of 15 per cent from the same period last year.

Farm Cash Income: Cash income from the sale of dairy products in November amounted to \$36,011,000. This represented an increase of approximately 4.1 per cent or \$1,413,000 in comparison with the same month last year. The weighted average price of \$3.40 per hundred pounds of milk was 8 cents higher than in November, 1958. Fluid milk at \$4.81 per hundred was 10 cents higher than in November, 1958. Creamery butter-fat increased from 66.2 cents to 67.7 cents per pound, and farm butter at 63 cents was 2 cents higher than in November, 1958. Milk used in manufacture at \$3.04 per hundred was the same as in November, 1958. Cheese milk increased to \$3.05 per hundred, an increase of 27 cents per hundred in comparison with the same month a year earlier.

Production and Prices of Dairy Products in November, 1959

Creamery Butter

Production: Creamery butter production amounted to 18.5 million pounds in November, 1959. This was 0.4 million pounds or approximately 2 per cent less than that produced in the same month of the previous year.

Stocks: Holdings of creamery butter in store and transit on December 1, amounted to 116.2 million pounds, approximately 9.5 million pounds greater than at December 1 last year. On November 1, 1959, stock holdings at 132.1 million pounds were 18.2 million pounds greater than at the same date a year earlier.

Supply: The quantity of creamery butter represented by stocks on November 1, plus production and imports during the month, amounted to 150.6 million pounds at November 30, 1959. This was an increase of approximately 17.8 million pounds compared to the corresponding supply figure at November 30, 1958.

Domestic Disappearance: The domestic disappearance of creamery butter in November amounted to 27.3 million pounds, an increase of 1.2 million pounds or 5 per cent from the corresponding figure for the same month last year. On a per capita basis, it amounted to 1.58 pounds as compared with 1.53 pounds in November, 1958. Prices at Montreal: Butter prices at Montreal, based on dealers' quotations for first grade solids, averaged 63% cents per pound in November as against 63% cents in November, 1958.

Cheddar Cheese

Production: Cheddar cheese production amounted to approximately 7.2 million pounds, an increase of 2.2 million pounds compared to production in the same month of the previous year.

Prices: Although very little trading occurred, the Montreal price of Ontario coloured cheese averaged 37 cents per pound in November. The comparative price in 1958 was 357 cents.

Ice Cream

The quantity of ice cream manufactured in November was approximately 2.0 million gallons or 9 thousand gallons more than that produced a year ago.
