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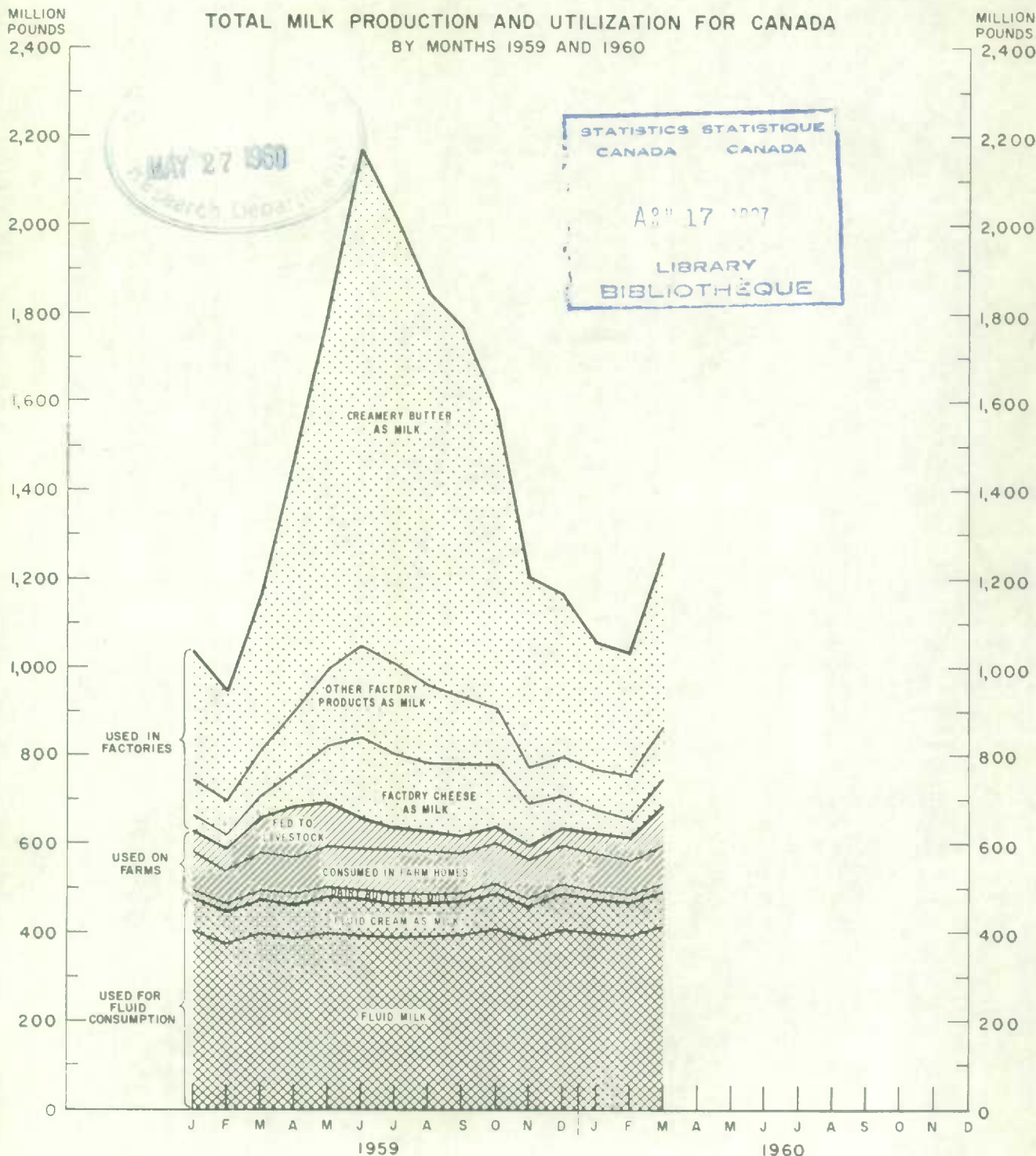
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## THE DAIRY REVIEW

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Preliminary Indications of the Dairy Situation, April, 1960

Preliminary indications are that 1,538,000,000 pounds of milk were produced in April, 4.4 per cent more than production in April last year. In the first four months of 1960, milk production amounted to 4,886,000,000 pounds, 5.8 per cent higher than the corresponding period of 1959.

Dairy Factory products utilized 840,000,000 pounds of milk during April, an increase of 6 per cent over utilization in April, 1959. In the first four months of 1960, dairy factories utilized 10 per cent more milk than in the corresponding period last year. Creamery butter manufacture, which was 5 per cent higher than in April last year, accounted for 72 per cent of the milk going into dairy factories. The utilization of milk for cheddar and other types of cheese remained sharply higher than in the corresponding period last year, showing an increase of 18 per cent in April, 28 per cent for the first four months. The production of concentrated whole milk products and ice cream during the month also used more milk than in April 1959.

Fluid sales of milk and cream in March were 3.6 per cent higher than in March 1959, but for the purpose of the preliminary estimate, it was assumed that 2.8 per cent more milk and cream was consumed than in April last year. This is the average increase of fluid sales in the first quarter of 1960 over the first three months of 1959.

From the monthly survey of farms keeping milk cows, indications are that about 224,000,000 pounds of milk were used on farms during April. This is about 1 per cent higher than in April last year. From January to April, about 715,000,000 pounds of milk were used on farms, an increase of 2 per cent over the corresponding period of last year. Milk consumed in farm homes during April amounted to 87,000,000 pounds, and for the first four months, 339,000,000 pounds. This is an increase of 1.5 per cent over corresponding periods a year earlier. About 117,000,000 pounds of milk was fed to livestock in April, 1.5 per cent more than in April last year. In the first four months, 305,000,000 pounds of milk were fed to livestock, 4.5 per cent more than in the corresponding period of 1959. Farm butter continues a downward trend with 4.5 per cent less butter being made so far this year.

On farms covered by the survey, milk production per cow was reported to be over 2 per cent greater than at this time last year, and a greater number of cows were reported in the herd and being milked.

#### Farm Milk Production, Utilization and Income in March, 1960

**Farm Milk Production:** The estimated quantity of milk produced on farms in March amounted to 1,258,850,000 pounds, an increase of 96 million pounds or 8.3 per cent above that of March, 1959. Of this amount, 575 million pounds or 45 per cent was utilized in factory production, and approximately 492 million pounds or 39 per cent was used for fluid sales. During January - March, the estimated production was 3,348 million pounds, an increase of 202 million pounds above that produced in the same period of the previous year. The quantity of milk utilized for factory production in January - March amounted to 1,426 million pounds while fluid sales accounted for 1,431 million pounds.

**Fluid Sales:** Sales of fluid milk and cream, the latter expressed as milk, amounted to 491,580,000 pounds in March, an increase of approximately 17 million pounds in comparison with March of the previous year. This included about 413 million pounds of fluid milk, comprising about 33 per cent of the farm milk supply, and fluid cream sales of 79 million pounds representing 6 per cent. During the three month period, fluid sales totalled 1,430,724,000 pounds, an increase of 39 million pounds or approximately 2.8 per cent over those of the corresponding 1959 period.

**Farm Butter:** Butter made on farms in March amounted to 777,000 pounds, decreasing 2 per cent from the corresponding month in 1959. For January - March, 2,239,000 pounds were produced, a decrease of 5 per cent from the same period last year.

**Farm Cash Income:** Cash income from the sale of dairy products in March amounted to \$36,167,000. This represented an increase of approximately 7.4 per cent or \$2,494,000 in comparison with the same month last year. The weighted average price of \$3.39 per hundred pounds of milk was 5 cents lower than in March, 1959. Fluid milk at \$4.78 per hundred was 11 cents higher than in March, 1959. Creamery butter-fat decreased from 68.5 cents to 67.1 cents per pound, and farm butter at 62 cents was 2 cents higher than in March, 1959. Milk used in manufacture decreased from \$2.97 per hundred in March, 1959, to \$2.75 per hundred in March, 1960. Cheese milk increased to \$2.64 per hundred, an increase of 3 cents per hundred in comparison with the same month a year earlier.

Farm cash income estimates cover all money received by farmers for the sale of milk, cream and farm butter. Government subsidies and bonuses are included in these estimates.

## Production and Prices of Dairy Products in March, 1960

### Creamery Butter

**Production:** Creamery butter production amounted to 16.8 million pounds in March, 1960. This was 1.7 million pounds or approximately 11 per cent more than that produced in the same month of the previous year.

**Stocks:** Holdings of creamery butter in store and transit on April 1, amounted to 76.6 million pounds, approximately 14.9 million pounds higher than at April 1, last year. On March 1, 1960, stock holdings at 84.6 million pounds were 13.6 million pounds greater than at the same date a year earlier.

**Supply:** The quantity of creamery butter represented by stocks on March 1, plus production and imports during the month, amounted to 101.4 million pounds at March 31, 1960. This was an increase of approximately 15.4 million pounds compared to the corresponding supply figure at March 31, 1959.

**Domestic Disappearance:** The domestic disappearance of creamery butter in March, amounted to 24.7 million pounds, an increase of 0.5 million pounds or 2 per cent over the corresponding figure for the same month last year. On a per capita basis, it amounted to 1.40 pounds as compared with 1.39 pounds in March, 1959.

**Prices at Montreal:** Butter prices at Montreal, based on dealers' quotations for first grade solids, averaged 64 cents per pound in March, as against 64 cents in March, 1959.

### Cheddar Cheese

**Production:** Cheddar cheese production amounted to approximately 4.8 million pounds, an increase of about 1.4 million pounds compared to production in the same month of the previous year.

**Prices:** The Montreal price of Ontario coloured cheese averaged 32 1/4 cents per pound in March. The comparative price in 1959 was 36 cents.

### Ice Cream

The quantity of ice cream manufactured in March was approximately 2.7 million gallons or 199 thousand gallons more than that produced a year ago.
