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Preliminary Indications of the Dairy Situation, June, 1960

Total milk production in June, according to preliminary indications, amounted to 2,205,000,000 pounds, an increase of 1.7 per cent over production in June, 1959. For the first six months of 1960, milk production is estimated at 8,975,000,000 pounds, 4.4 per cent greater than in the first half of 1959.

Dairy factory products during June utilized 1,539,000,000 pounds of milk, about 2 per cent more than in June last year. Greamery butter production accounted for 1,107,000,000 pounds, 1 per cent less than in the corresponding month last year. Concentrated whole milk products during the month used 28 per cent more milk than in June, 1959. The increase in concentrated whole milk products was due mainly to sharply increased production of whole milk powder. Cheese production during the month was only 5 per cent above production in June, 1959, compared to a 16 per cent increase for the first six months of the year. About 4 per cent less milk was used for ice cream, probably because of cooler weather than in June last year.

Fluid sales of milk and cream during May increased only 0.3 per cent over fluid sales in May, 1959. For the preliminary estimate of total milk production, 487,000,000 pounds of milk were estimated to have been used in fluid sales. This 2.8 per cent increase over milk used in fluid sales during June, 1959, is the average increase of March, April and May this year over the corresponding period last year.

Reporters in the monthly survey of farms keeping milk cows indicated that 178,000,000 pounds of milk were used on farms during June, slightly less than in June last year. Milk consumed in farm homes and milk fed to livestock were both about the same as in June last year.

On the farms covered by the monthly survey, milk production per cow remained at the same level as at June 15, 1959.

Pasture conditions across most of Canada in June were very favourable to dairying. This is shown by the maps on page 3.

Farm Milk Production, Utilization and Income in May, 1960

Farm Milk Production: The estimated quantity of milk produced on farms in May amounted to 1,878,356,000 pounds, an increase of 68 million pounds or 3.8 per cent above that of May, 1959. Of this amount, 1,188 million pounds or 63 per cent was utilized in factory production, and approximately 480 million pounds or 26 per cent was used for fluid sales. During January - May, the estimated production was 6,770 million pounds, an increase of 341 million pounds above that produced in the same period of the previous year. The quantity of milk utilized for factory production in January - May amounted to 3,454 million pounds while fluid sales accounted for 2,393 million pounds.

Fluid Sales: Sales of fluid milk and cream, the latter expressed as milk, amounted to 479,933,000 pounds in May, an increase of approximately 1 million pounds in comparison with May of the previous year. This included about 401 million pounds of fluid milk, comprising about 21.4 per cent of the farm milk supply, and fluid cream sales of 79 million pounds representing 4.2 per cent. During the five month period, fluid sales totalled 2,392,680,000 pounds, an increase of 61 million pounds or approximately 2.6 per cent over those of the corresponding 1959 period.

Farm Butter: Butter made on farms in May amounted to 798,000 pounds, decreasing 13 per cent from the corresponding month in 1959. For January - May, 3,783,000 pounds were produced, a decrease of 8 per cent from the same period last year.

Farm Cash Incomes Cash income from the sale of dairy products in May amounted to \$50,163,000. This represented an increase of approximately 3.2 per cent or \$1,568,000 in comparison with the same month last year. The weighted average price of \$3.01 per hundred pounds of milk was 3 cents lower than in May, 1959. Fluid milk at \$4.72 per hundred was 9 cents higher than in May, 1959. Creamery butter-fat decreased from 68.0 cents to 67.7 cents per pound, and farm butter at 64 cents was 5 cents higher than in May, 1959. Milk used in manufacture decreased from \$2.80 per hundred in May, 1959, to \$2.63 per hundred in May, 1960. Cheese milk decreased to \$2.54 per hundred, a decrease of 19 cents per hundred in comparison with the same month a year earlier.

Farm cash income estimates cover all money received by farmers for the sale of milk, cream and farm butter. Government subsidies and bonuses are included in these estimates.


Production and Prices of Dairy Products in May, 1960

Creamery Butter

Production: Greamery butter production amounted to 36.3 million pounds in May, 1960. This was 1.6 million pounds or approximately 4 per cent more than that produced in the same month of the previous year.

Stocks: Holdings of creamery butter in store and transit on June 1, amounted to 91.3 million pounds, approximately 19.7 million pounds higher than at June 1 last year. On May 1, 1960, stock holdings at 80.6 million pounds were 18.3 million pounds greater than at the same date a year earlier.

Supply: The quantity of creamery butter represented by stocks on May 1, plus production and imports during the month, amounted to 116.9 million pounds at May 31, 1960. This was an increase of approximately 19.8 million pounds compared to the corresponding supply figure at May 31, 1959.

Domestic Disappearance: The domestic disappearance of creamery butter in May, amounted to 25.4 million pounds, about the same as the corresponding figure for the same month last year. On a per capita basis, it amounted to 1.44 pounds as compared with 1.46 pounds in May, 1959.

Prices at Montreal: Butter prices at Montreal, based on dealers' quotations for first grade solids, averaged 63 cents per pound in May, as against 63 1/4 cents in May, 1959.

Cheddar Cheese

Production: Cheddar cheese production amounted to approximately 12.1 million pounds, an increase of about 1.3 million pounds compared to production in the same month of the previous year.

Prices: The Montreal price of Ontario coloured cheese averaged 32 cents per pound in May. The comparative price in 1959 was 35 cents.

Ice Cream

The quantity of ice cream manufactured in May was approximately 4.3 million gallons or 238 thousand gallons more than that produced a year ago.
