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

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Preliminary Indications of The Dairy Situation, September, 1960

The preliminary estimate for milk production in September is 1,676,000,000 pounds, a decrease of 5.2 per cent from milk production in September, 1959. Milk production for the first 9 months of 1960, is estimated at 14,500,000,000 pounds, 1.9 per cent more than in the corresponding period last year.

Dairy factories used 1,058,000,000 pounds of milk in September, 8 per cent less than in September last year. During the first three quarters, however, dairy factories used 2 per cent more milk in 1960 than in 1959. Creamery butter manufacturers used 738,000,000 pounds of milk in September, 12 per cent less than in September, 1959. Up to the end of September, 1 per cent less milk has been used for creamery butter than in the corresponding period of 1959. Less milk was used for cheese and for ice cream mix during September, but 27 per cent more milk went into concentrated whole milk products, than in September last year. Continued high output of whole milk products.

Sales of fluid milk and cream during August were 1.2 per cent above the corresponding figure a year earlier. For the preliminary estimate, fluid sales in September were assumed to be 468,000,000 pounds, also exceeding sales in the same month last year by 1.2 per cent.

The monthly survey of farms keeping milk cows indicated that about 147,000,000 pounds of milk were used on farms during September. This was a decrease of 1 per cent from September, 1959. Most of the decrease came from an estimated 16 per cent drop in the production of farm butter during September. About 1 per cent more milk was consumed in farm homes and about the same amount of milk was fed to livestock compared to September last year. Dairy correspondents reported about 1 per cent more cows being milked at September 15, but milk production per cow, on these farms, was reported to be 6 per cent below production per cow at September 15 last year.

As shown by the map on page 3, and reflected in the drop in milk production per cow, pasture conditions in mid September were worse than at this time last year on the farms covered by the survey. Farm Milk Production, Utilization and Income in August, 1960


Farm Milk Production: The estimated quantity of milk produced on farms in August amounted to 1,885,944,000 pounds, an increase of 37 million pounds or 2.0 per cent above that of August, 1959. Of this amount, 1,260 million pounds or 67 per cent was utilized in factory production, and approximately 468 million pounds or 25 per cent was used for fluid sales. During January - August, the estimated production was 12,824 million pounds, an increase of 363 million pounds above that produced in the same period of the previous year. The quantity of milk utilized for factory production in January - August amounted to 7,598 million pounds while fluid sales accounted for 3,798 million pounds.

Fluid Sales: Sales of fluid milk and cream, the latter expressed as milk, amounted to 467,962,000 pounds in August, an increase of approximately 6 million pounds in comparison with August of the previous year. This included about 392 million pounds of fluid milk, comprising about 21 per cent of the farm milk supply, and fluid cream sales of 76 million pounds representing 4 per cent. During the eight month period, fluid sales totalled 3,798,322,000 pounds, an increase of 68 million pounds or approximately 1.8 per cent over those of the corresponding 1959 period.

Farm Butter: Butter made on farms in August amounted to 783,000 pounds, decreasing 17 per cent from the corresponding month in 1959. For January - August, 6,201,000 pounds were produced, a decrease of 11 per cent from the same period last year.

Farm Cash Income: Cash income from the sale of dairy products in August amounted to \$51,273,000. This represented an increase of approximately 0.8 per cent or \$395,000 in comparison with the same month last year. The weighted average price of \$2.97 per hundred pounds of milk was 4 cents lower than in August, 1959. Fluid milk at \$4.70 per hundred was 9 cents higher than in August, 1959. Creamery butter-fat decreased from 68.6 cents to 67.6 cents per pound, and farm butter at 61 cents was 1 cent higher than in August, 1959. Milk used in manufacture decreased from \$2.78 per hundred in August, 1959, to \$2.59 per hundred in August, 1960. Cheese milk decreased to \$2.57 per hundred, a decrease of 30 cents per hundred in comparison with the same month a year earlier.

Farm cash income estimates cover all money received by farmers for the sale of milk, cream and farm butter. Government subsidies and bonuses are included in these estimates.

Production and Prices of Dairy Products in August, 1960

Creamery Butter

Production: Creamery butter production amounted to 37.3 million pounds in August, 1960. This was 0.8 million pounds or approximately 2 per cent less than that produced in the same month of the previous year.

Stocks: Holdings of creamery butter in store and transit on September 1 amounted to 135.6 million pounds, approximately 10.6 million pounds higher than at September 1 last year. On August 1, 1960, stock holdings at 127.1 million pounds were 15.3 million pounds greater than at the same date a year earlier.

Supply: The quantity of creamery butter represented by stocks on August 1, plus production and imports during the month, amounted to 164.4 million pounds at August 31, 1960. This was an increase of approximately 14.5 million pounds compared to the corresponding supply figure at August 31, 1959.

Domestic Disappearance: The domestic disappearance of creamery butter in August amounted to 23.9 million pounds, a decrease of 0.8 million pounds or 3 per cent less than the corresponding figure for the same month last year. On a per capita basis, it amounted to 1.35 pounds as compared with 1.42 pounds in August, 1959.

Prices at Montreal: Butter prices at Montreal, based on dealers' quotations for first grade solids, averaged 63 cents per pound in August, as against 63 1/4 cents in August, 1959.

Cheddar Cheese

Production: Cheddar cheese production amounted to approximately 13.8 million pounds, an increase of about 0.4 million pounds compared to production in the same month of the previous year.

Prices: The Kingston price of Ontario coloured cheese averaged 33 3/4 cents per pound in August. The comparative price in 1959 was 37 3/4 cents.

Ice Cream Mix

The quantity of ice cream mix manufactured in August was approximately 2.7 million gallons or 124 thousand gallons more than that produced a year ago.
