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

FEBRUARY 1961

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The preliminary estimate of milk produced in February is 1,032,000,000 pounds. This is slightly greater than production in the 29 day month last year and would make the total estimate of production during the first two months of the year 2,118,000,000 pounds. This is 1.4 per cent higher than production in January and February, 1960.

About 41 per cent of the milk produced in February, or 423,000,000 pounds, was used for dairy factory products. Dairy factory utilization was 1.6 per cent greater than in February 1960 with the quantity going into creamery butter production up 7.5 per cent and more than offsetting decreased utilization for each of cheese, ice cream and concentrated milk products.

Fluid sales of milk and cream in January rose 1.3 per cent from last year. Assuming about the same rate of increase for February accounts for 472,000,000 pounds, or almost 46 per cent of the preliminary estimate of milk production.

According to indications from the monthly survey of farms keeping milk cows 137,000,000 pounds of milk was used on farms during February. This was 7 per cent less than last year, partly due to the difference in length of month. Milk used for feeding livestock was almost equal to the quantity so used in February 1960 but milk and cream used in farm homes decreased almost 9 per cent.

The number of milk cows on farms covered in the survey was 1.7 per cent higher than last year and daily production per cow was fractionally higher.

Farm Milk Production, Utilization and Income in January, 1961

Farm Milk Production: The estimated quantity of milk produced on farms in January amounted to 1,086,175,000 pounds, an increase of 26 million pounds or 2.4 per cent above that of January, 1960. Of this amount, 461 million pounds or 42 per cent was utilized in factory production and approximately 479 million pounds or 44 per cent was used for fluid sales.

Fluid Sales: Sales of fluid milk and cream, the latter expressed as milk, amounted to 478,970,000 pounds in January, an increase of approximately 6 million pounds in comparison with January of the previous year. This included about 404 million pounds of fluid milk, comprising about 37 per cent of the farm milk supply, and fluid cream sales of 75 million pounds representing 7 per cent.

Farm Butter: Butter made on farms in January amounted to 623,000 pounds, decreasing 18 per cent from the corresponding month in 1960.

Farm Cash Income: Cash income from the sale of dairy products in January amounted to \$33,121,000. This represented an increase of approximately 2.6 per cent or \$836,000 in comparison with the same month last year. The weighted average price of \$3.52 per hundred pounds of milk was 3 cents lower than January, 1960. Fluid milk at \$4.77 per hundred was the same as in January, 1960. Creamery butter-fat decreased from 69.6 cents to 69.0 cents per pound, and farm butter at 62 cents was the same as in January, 1960. Milk used in manufacture increased from \$2.79 per hundred in January, 1960, to \$2.86 per hundred in January, 1961. Cheese milk declined to \$2.63 per hundred, a decline of 14 cents per hundred in comparison with the same month a year earlier.

Farm cash income estimates cover all money received by farmers for the sale of milk, cream and farm butter. Government subsidies and bonuses are included in these estimates.

Production and Prices of Dairy Products in January, 1961

Creamery Butter

Production: Creamery butter production amounted to 13.9 million pounds in January, 1961. This was 1.4 million pounds or approximately 11 per cent more than that produced in the same month of the previous year.

Stocks: Holdings of creamery butter in store and transit on February 1 amounted to 104.0 million pounds, approximately 8.5 million pounds higher than at February 1 last year. On January 1, 1961, stock holdings at 113.8 million pounds were 8.1 million pounds greater than at the same date a year earlier.

Supply: The quantity of creamery butter represented by stocks on January 1, plus production and imports during the month, amounted to 127.7 million pounds at January 31, 1961. This was an increase of approximately 9.5 million pounds compared to the corresponding supply figure at January 31, 1960.

Domestic Disappearance: The domestic disappearance of creamery butter in January amounted to 21.0 million pounds, an increase of 1.4 million pounds or 7 per cent more than the corresponding figure for the same month last year. On a per capita basis, it amounted to 1.18 pounds as compared with 1.12 pounds in January, 1960.

Prices at Montreal: Butter prices at Montreal, based on dealers' quotations for first grade solids, averaged 64 cents per pound in January, the same as in January, 1960.

Cheddar Cheese

Production: Cheddar cheese production amounted to approximately 3.3 million pounds, a decrease of about 0.5 million pounds compared to production in the same month of the previous year.

Prices: The price of Ontario coloured cheese averaged 32 1/2 cents per pound at Belleville in January, the same as in January, 1960.

Ice Cream Mix

The quantity of ice cream mix manufactured in January was approximately 1.0 million gallons or 6 thousand gallons more than that produced a year ago.
