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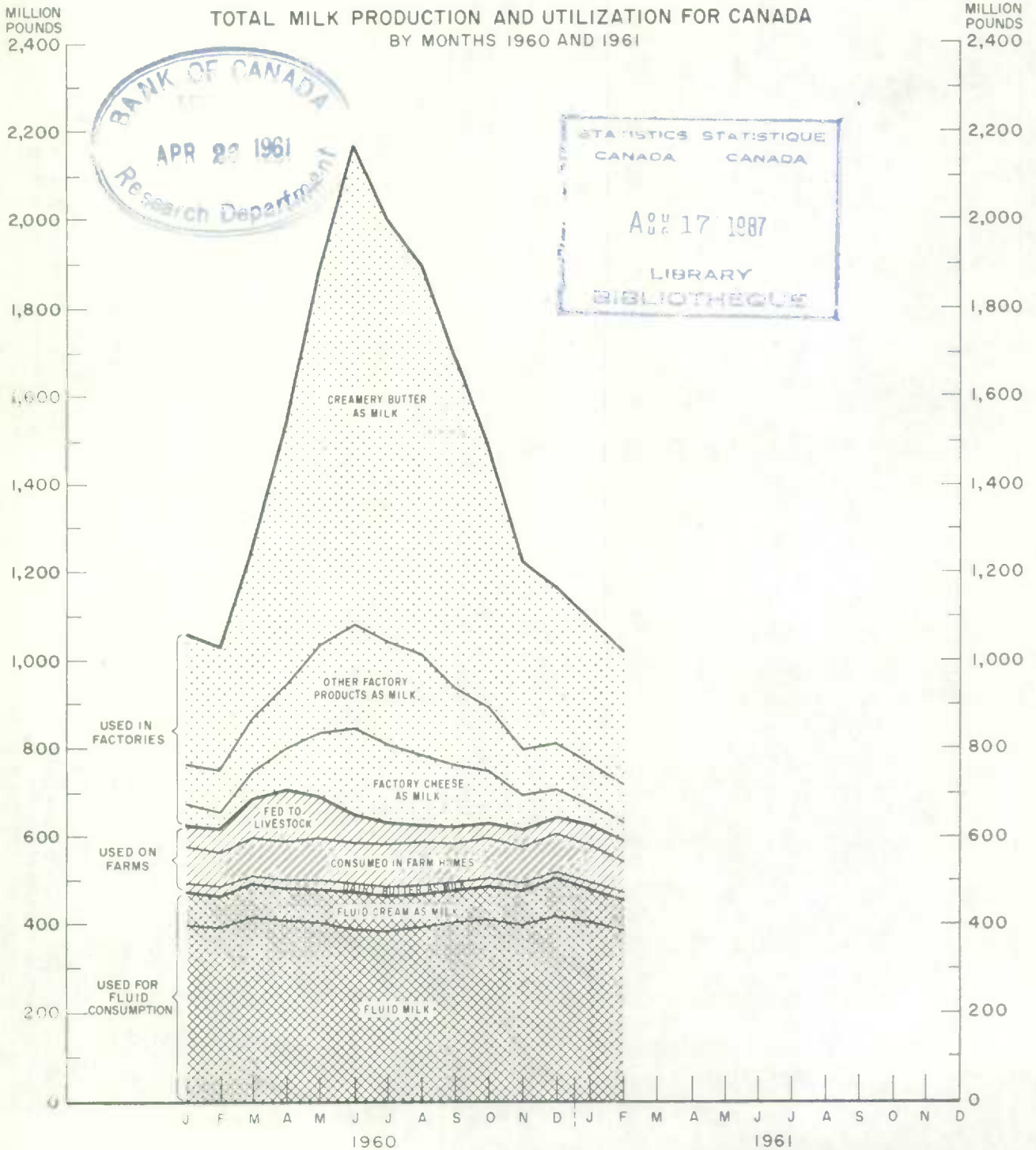

THE DAIRY REVIEW

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Preliminary Indications of the Dairy Situation, March, 1961

The preliminary estimate of milk produced in March is 1,292,000,000 pounds. This is 2.6 per cent greater than production in the same month last year, and would make the total estimate of production during the first three months of the year 3,396,000,000 pounds. This is 1.4 per cent higher than production in the January to March period, 1960.

About 46 per cent of the milk produced in March, or 596,846,000 pounds, was used for dairy factory products. Dairy factory utilization was 4.1 per cent greater than in March, 1960, with increased quantities going into all products except factory cheese other than cheddar. The quantity going into creamery butter production, the most important of the products, was up 4.6 per cent.

Fluid sales of milk and cream in February dropped 1.5 per cent from last year. After adjustments were made for the extra day in February, 1960, however, sales showed an increase of 2.0 per cent. Assuming about the same rate of increase for March accounts for 502,114,000 pounds, or almost 39 per cent of the preliminary estimate of milk produced during the month.

According to indications from the monthly survey of farms keeping milk cows, 193,000,000 pounds of milk was used on farms during March. This was almost the same as that used last year. Milk used for feeding livestock was 10 per cent over the quantity so used in March, 1960, offsetting the combination of decreases of 7 and 17 per cent in milk and cream used in farm homes and for farm-made butter.

The number of milk cows on farms covered in the survey was 1.4 per cent higher than last year and daily production per cow was fractionally higher.

## Farm Milk Production, Utilization and Income in February, 1961

**Farm Milk Production:** The estimated quantity of milk produced on farms in February amounted to 1,018,450,000 pounds, a decrease of 11 million pounds or 1.1 per cent below that of February, 1960. Of this amount, 423 million pounds or 42 per cent was utilized in factory production, and approximately 459 million pounds or 45 per cent was used for fluid sales. During January-February, the estimated production was 2,105 million pounds, an increase of 15 million pounds above that produced in the same period of the previous year. The quantity of milk utilized for factory production in January-February amounted to 885 million pounds while fluid sales accounted for 938 million pounds.

**Fluid Sales:** Sales of fluid milk and cream, the latter expressed as milk, amounted to 458,653,000 pounds in February, a decrease of approximately 7 million pounds in comparison with February of the previous year. This included about 388 million pounds of fluid milk, comprising about 38 per cent of the farm milk supply, and fluid cream sales of 70 million pounds representing 7 per cent. During the two month period, fluid sales totalled 937,623,000 pounds, a decrease of 1 million pounds or approximately 0.1 per cent below those of the corresponding 1960 period.

**Farm Butter:** Butter made on farms in February amounted to 579,000 pounds, decreasing 22 per cent from the corresponding month in 1960. For January-February, 1,202,000 pounds were produced, a decrease of 20 per cent from the same period last year.

**Farm Cash Income:** Cash income from the sale of dairy products in February amounted to \$31,072,000. This represented a decrease of approximately 0.9 per cent or \$272,000 in comparison with the same month last year. The weighted average price of \$3.52 per hundred pounds of milk was 3 cents lower than in February, 1960. Fluid milk at \$4.76 per hundred was the same as in February, 1960. Creamery butter-fat decreased from 69.2 cents to 68.1 cents per pound, and farm butter at 62 cents was the same as in February, 1960. Milk used in manufacture increased from \$2.76 per hundred in February, 1960, to \$2.82 per hundred in February, 1961. Cheese milk decreased to \$2.62 per hundred, a decrease of 8 cents per hundred in comparison with the same month a year earlier.

Farm cash income estimates cover all money received by farmers for the sale of milk, cream and farm butter. Government subsidies and bonuses are included in these estimates.

## Production and Prices of Dairy Products in February, 1961

### Creamery Butter

**Production:** Creamery butter production amounted to 12.7 million pounds in February, 1961. This was 0.9 million pounds or approximately 8 per cent more than that produced in the same month of the previous year.

**Stocks:** Holdings of creamery butter in store and transit on March 1 amounted to 92.5 million pounds, approximately 7.9 million pounds higher than at March 1 last year. On February 1, 1961, stock holdings at 104.0 million pounds were 8.5 million pounds greater than at the same date a year earlier.

**Supply:** The quantity of creamery butter represented by stocks on February 1 plus production and imports during the month, amounted to 116.7 million pounds at February 28, 1961. This was an increase of approximately 9.4 million pounds compared to the corresponding supply figure at February 29, 1960.

Domestic Disappearance: The domestic disappearance of creamery butter in February amounted to 21.1 million pounds, a decrease of 1.6 million pounds or 7 per cent less than the corresponding figure for the same month last year. On a per capita basis, it amounted to 1.17 pounds as compared with 1.27 pounds in February, 1960.

Prices at Montreal: Butter prices at Montreal, based on dealers' quotations for first grade solids, averaged 64 cents per pound in February, the same as in February, 1960.

Cheddar Cheese

Production: Cheddar cheese production amounted to approximately 2.9 million pounds, a decrease of about 0.2 million pounds compared to production in the same month of the previous year.

Prices: The price of Ontario coloured cheese averaged 32 3/4 cents per pound at Belleville in February. The comparative price in 1960 was 32 cents.

Ice Cream Mix

The quantity of ice cream mix manufactured in February was approximately 1 million gallons or 82 thousand gallons less than that produced a year ago.

The table below is a summary of data collected in a special survey for 1960 on production of sherbet and water ices.
