

## Preliminary Indications of the Dairy Situation, April 1961

The preliminary estimate of milk production in April is 1,556,000,000 pounds. This is an increase of 0.5 per cent over milk production in April, 1960. In the first four months of the year, milk production was estimated at 4,946,000,000 pounds, one per cent above production in the January - April period of last year.

Dairy factory products utilized 846,000,000 pounds of milk during April, about the same amount used in April, 1960. Except for a 6 per cent decline in the amount of milk used to make ice cream mix, the pattern of milk utilization for dairy products was very similar in April of both years. Butter manufactured during the month accounted for 607,000,000 pounds of milk, cheese and concentrated whole milk products just over 90,000,000 pounds each and ice cream about 50,000,000 pounds. During the January - April period, 2.5 per cent more milk was used in dairy factory products than in the first four months of 1960. The utilization of milk for creamery butter was about 5 per cent higher than in the corresponding period of 1960 but considerably less milk was used for other dairy factory products.

Fluid sales of milk and cream in April, for the purpose of the preliminary estimate, were assumed to have amounted to 485,000,000 pounds, an increase of 0.8 per cent over fluid sales in April, 1960. This is the percentage increase shown by the month of March compared to the same month a year earlier.

Indications from the monthly survey of farms keeping milk cows are that 225,000,000 pounds of milk was used on Canadian farms in the month of April. This is one per cent more than the corresponding figure for April, 1960. Milk consumed in farm homes at 84,000,000 pounds, was 4 per cent lower than consumption in farm homes during April last year. On the other hand, farm livestock consumed 127,000,000 pounds of milk, an increase of 9 per cent over the corresponding month a year earlier. It was estimated that butter manufactured on farms during April used 20 per cent less milk than in April last year. Both cow numbers and milk production per cow on the farms covered by the survey were fractionally higher than at this time last year.

## Farm Milk Production, Utilization and Income in March, 1961

Farm Milk Production: The estimated quantity of milk produced on farms in March amounted to 1,285 million pounds, an increase of 26 million pounds or 2.1 per cent over that of March, 1960. Of this amount, 597 million pounds or 47 per cent was utilized in factory production, and approximately 496 million pounds or 39 per cent was used for fluid sales. During the January - March period, the estimated production was 3,390 million pounds, an increase of 41 million pounds over that produced in the same period of the previous year. The quantity of milk utilized for factory production in the January - March period amounted to 1,482 million pounds while fluid sales accounted for 1,434 million pounds.

Fluid Sales: Sales of fluid milk and cream, the latter expressed as milk, amounted to 496 million pounds in March, an increase of approximately 4 million pounds in comparison with March of the previous year. This included about 417 million pounds of fluid milk, comprising about 32 per cent of the farm milk supply, and fluid cream sales of 79 million pounds representing 6 per cent. During the three month period, fluid sales totalled 1,434 million pounds, an increase of 3 million pounds or 0.2 per cent over those of the corresponding 1960 period.

Farm Butter: Butter made on farms in March amounted to 642,000 pounds, decreasing 21 per cent from the corresponding month in 1960. For the January - March period, 1,844,000 pounds were produced, a decrease of 20 per cent from the same period last year.

Farm Cash Income: Cash income from the sale of dairy products in March amounted to \$36,900,000. This represented an increase of 1.5 per cent or \$545,000 in comparison with the same month last year. The weighted average value of \$3.37 per hundred pounds of milk was 4 cents lower than in March, 1960. Fluid milk at \$4.76 per hundred was 1 cent lower than in March, 1960. Greamery butter-fat decreased from 68.6 cents to 67.9 cents per pound, and farm butter at 62 cents per pound was the same as in March, 1960. Milk used in manufacture averaged \$2.77 per hundred, the same as in March, 1960. Cheese milk decreased to \$2.57 per hundred, a decrease of 5 cents per hundred in comparison with the same month a year earlier.

Farm cash income estimates cover all money received by farmers for the sale of milk, cream and farm butter. Government subsidies and bonuses are included in these estimates.

Production and Prices of Dairy Products in March, 1961

## Creamery Butter

Production: Creamery butter production amounted to 17.4 million pounds in March, 1961. This was 0.8 million pounds or approximately 5 per cent more than that produced in the same month of the previous year.

Stocks: Holdings of creamery butter in store and transit on April 1, amounted to 83.4 million pounds, approximately 6.7 million pounds higher than at April 1, last year. On March 1, 1961, stock holdings at 92.5 million pounds were 7.9 million pounds greater than at the same date a year earlier. It should also be noted that 22.6 million pounds of butter oil was reported held in cold storage on April 1. Butter oil was first reported in storage on July 1, 1960. The amount at that time was 619,000 pounds. Supply: The quantity of creamery butter represented by stocks on March 1, plus production and imports during the month, amounted to 110,0 million pounds at March 31, 1961. This was an increase of approximately 8.7 million pounds compared to the corresponding supply figure at March 31, 1960.

Domestic Disappearance: The domestic disappearance of creamery butter in March, amounted to 22.9 million pounds, a decrease of 1.7 million pounds or 7 per cent less than the corresponding figure for the same month last year. On a per capita basis, it amounted to 1.27 pounds as compared with 1.38 pounds in March, 1960.

Prices at Montreal: Butter prices at Montreal, based on dealers' quotations for first grade solids, averaged 63 1/2 cents per pound in March, as against 64 cents in March, 1960.

Cheddar Cheese

Production: Cheddar cheese production amounted to approximately 4.9 million pounds, an increase of about 0.1 million pounds compared to production in the same month of the previous year.

Prices: The price of Ontario coloured cheese averaged 33 1/4 cents per pound at Belleville in March. The comparative price in 1960 was 32 cents.

Ice Cream Mix

The quantity of ice cream mix manufactured in March was approximately 1.4 million gallons or 99 thousand gallons more than that produced a year ago.
