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

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The preliminary estimate of milk produced in June is 2,212,690,000 pounds. This is an increase of 2.0 per cent over milk production in June, 1960. Milk Production for the first six months of the year was estimated at 9,057,184,000 pounds, 1.2 per cent above production in the January - June period a year ago.

Approximately 70 per cent of the milk produced in June, or 1,559,428,000 pounds, was used for dairy factory products. Dairy factory utilization was 2.6 per cent greater than in June, 1960, with increased quantities being used for all but concentrated whole milk products. Creamery Butter, the most important of the products, accounted for 1,141,873,000 pounds of milk, an increase of 4.8 per cent from last year. During the January - June period, creamery butter fully accounted for the 2.3 per cent increase from 1960, in milk being used in dairy factory products.

Fluid sales of milk and cream in June, for the purpose of the preliminary estimate, were assumed to have amounted to 473,554,000 pounds, an increase of 0.3 per cent over fluid sales in June, 1960. This is the average increase of March, April and May this year compared with the corresponding period last year.

According to indications from the monthly survey of farms keeping milk cows, milk used for livestock feeding was almost 9 per cent above the quantity so used in June, 1960, while milk and cream used in farm homes was only slightly above that of a year ago. The number of cows on farms covered by the survey was slightly higher than at this time last year and production per cow increased 0.9 per cent above the level at June 15, 1960.

Except for drought conditions which were developing throughout most parts of the prairie provinces, pasture conditions in Canada, at June 15, were generally favourable to dairying. This is shown by the maps on page 3.

Farm Milk Production, Utilization and Income in May, 1961

Farm Milk Production: The estimated quantity of milk produced on farms in May amounted to 1,902 million pounds, an increase of 22 million pounds or 1.2 per cent over that of May, 1960. Of this amount, 1,201 million pounds or 63 per cent was utilized in factory production, and approximately 487 million pounds or 26 per cent was used for fluid sales. During the January - May period, the estimated production was 6,844 million pounds, an increase of 68 million pounds over that produced in the same period of the previous year. The quantity of milk utilized for factory production in the January - May period amounted to 3,535 million pounds while fluid sales accounted for 2,395 million pounds.


Fluid Sales: Sales of fluid milk and cream, the latter expressed as milk, amounted to 487 million pounds in May, an increase of approximately 7 million pounds in comparison with May of the previous year. This included about 406 million pounds of fluid milk, comprising about 21.4 per cent of the farm milk supply, and fluid cream sales of 81 million pounds representing 4.2 per cent. During the five month period, fluid sales totalled 2,395 million pounds, an increase of 4 million pounds or 0.2 per cent over those of the corresponding 1960 period.

Farm Butter: Butter made on farms in May amounted to 739,000 pounds, decreasing 11 per cent from the corresponding month in 1960. For the January - May period, 3,266,000 pounds were produced, a decrease of 17 per cent from the same period last year.


Farm Cash Income: Cash income from the sale of dairy products in May amounted to \$50,449,000. This represented an increase of 0.6 per cent or \$310,000 in comparison with the same month last year. The weighted average value of \$2.99 per hundred pounds of milk was 1 cent lower than in May, 1960. Fluid milk at \$4.70 per hundred was 2 cents lower than in May, 1960. Greamery butter-fat decreased from 67.7 cents to 67.5 cents per pound, and farm butter at 62 cents per pound was the same as in May, 1960. Milk used in manufacture averaged \$2.63 per hundred, 2 cents lower than in May, 1960. Cheese milk decreased to \$2.45 per hundred, a decrease of 6 cents per hundred in comparison with the same month a year earlier.

Farm cash income estimates cover all money received by farmers for the sale of milk, cream and farm butter. Government subsidies and bonuses are included in these estimates.

Production and Prices of Dairy Products in May, 1961

Creamery Butter

Production: Greamery butter production amounted to 36.9 million pounds in May, 1961. This was 0.7 million pounds or approximately 2 per cent more than that produced in the same month of the previous year.

Stocks: Holdings of creamery butter in store and transit on June 1 amounted to 95.9 million pounds, approximately 4.5 million pounds higher than at June 1 last year. On May 1, 1961, stock holdings at 85.4 million pounds were 4.9 million pounds greater than at the same date a year earlier. It should also be noted that 26.8 million pounds of butter oil was reported held in cold storage on June 1. Butter oil was first reported in storage on July 1, 1960. The amount at that time was 619,000 pounds.

Supply: The quantity of creamery butter represented by stocks on May 1, plus production and imports during the month, amounted to 122.3 million pounds at May 31, 1961. This was an increase of approximately 5.6 million pounds compared to the corresponding supply figure at May 31, 1960.

Domestic Disappearance: The domestic disappearance of creamery butter in May amounted to 24.0 million pounds, a decrease of 0.9 million pounds or 4 per cent less than the corresponding figure for the same month last year. On a per capita basis, it amounted to 1.33 pounds as compared with 1.40 pounds in May, 1960.

Prices at Montreal: Butter prices at Montreal, based on dealers' quotations for first grade solids, averaged 62 1/2 cents per pound in May, as against 63 cents in May, 1960.

Cheddar Cheese

Production: Cheddar cheese production amounted to approximately 12.3 million pounds, a decrease of about 62 thousand pounds compared to production in the same month of the previous year.

Prices: The price of Ontario coloured cheese averaged 32 1/4 cents per pound at Belleville in May. The comparative price in 1960 was 32 cents.

Ice Gream Mix

The quantity of ice cream mix manufactured in May was approximately 2.2 million gallons or 39 thousand gallons more than that produced a year ago.
