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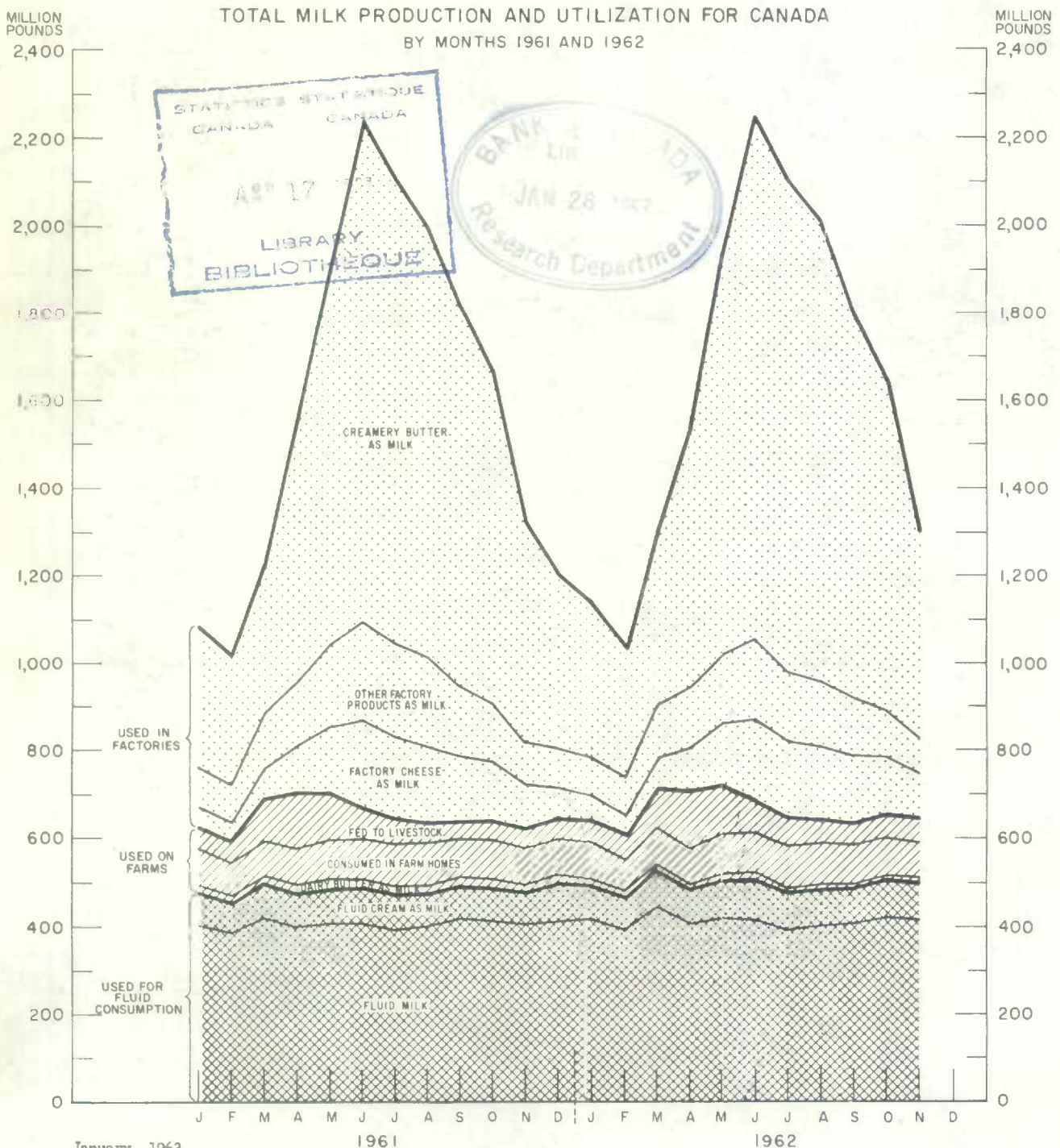
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Preliminary Indications of the Dairy Situation, December, 1962

The preliminary estimate of milk produced in December is 1,213,000,000 pounds. This is an increase of 0.9 per cent over milk production in the same month last year and brings the total for the twelve months of 1962 to 19,300,000,000 pounds. This is 0.2 per cent above production in the January to December period a year ago.

During December, 557,000,000 pounds or 46 per cent of total milk production was utilized in the manufacture of dairy factory products. This was 0.1 per cent greater than that utilized during December, 1961. Thus, preliminary estimates of milk used in dairy factories in 1962 amounted to 11,300,000,000 pounds, 0.7 per cent less than the corresponding figure for the previous year. Creamery butter production during the year used 8,400,000,000 pounds of milk, 2.6 per cent more than in 1961, while milk used for factory cheese, concentrated whole milk products and ice cream mix declined 1.0, 8.8 and 24.9 per cent, respectively. However, in December, milk utilized for concentrated milk products increased sharply in comparison with utilization a year ago. This is the first month since April, 1961, when current utilization exceeded that of the corresponding month a year earlier.

Fluid sales of milk and cream during December, for the purpose of the preliminary estimate, are calculated at 510,000,000 pounds, an increase of 1.8 per cent over fluid sales in December, 1961. This assumes the same relationship to year-earlier estimates as the September to November average.

According to indications from the monthly survey of farms keeping milk cows, milk and cream consumed in farm homes was 3.1 per cent below that used in December, 1961, but more milk was fed to livestock than a year earlier. Farm dairy correspondents report 0.8 per cent fewer cows kept on farms at December 15, and 1.2 per cent less cows being milked than at the same date last year. Milk production per cow, for cows milked on farms in the sample, increased 5.9 per cent above the level at December 15, 1961.

Farm Milk Production, Utilisation and Income in November, 1962

Farm Milk Production: The estimated quantity of milk produced on farms in November amounted to 1,300 million pounds, a decrease of 26 million pounds or 1.9 per cent below that of November, 1961. Of this amount, 659 million pounds or 51 per cent was utilized in factory production, and approximately 499 million pounds or 38 per cent was used for fluid sales. During the January - November period, the estimated production was 18,061 million pounds, an increase of 36 million pounds over that produced in the same period of the previous year. The quantity of milk utilized for factory production in the January - November period amounted to 10,783 million pounds while fluid sales accounted for 5,434 million pounds.

Fluid Sales: Sales of fluid milk and cream, the latter expressed as milk, amounted to 499 million pounds in November, an increase of approximately 18 million pounds in comparison with November of the previous year. This included about 419 million pounds of fluid milk, comprising about 32 per cent of the farm milk supply, and fluid cream sales of 80 million pounds representing 6 per cent. During the eleven month period, fluid sales totalled 5,434 million pounds, an increase of 121 million pounds or 2.3 per cent over those of the corresponding 1961 period.

Farm Butter: Butter made on farms in November amounted to 471,000 pounds, decreasing 28 per cent from the corresponding month in 1961. For the January - November period, 6,248,000 pounds were produced, a decrease of 19 per cent from the same period last year.

Farm Cash Income: Cash income from the sale of dairy products in November amounted to \$38,916,000. This represented a decrease of 0.7 per cent or \$260,000 in comparison with the same month last year. The weighted average value of \$3.36 per hundred pounds of milk was 6 cents higher than in November, 1961. Fluid milk at \$4.81 per hundred was 1 cent lower than in November, 1961. Creamery butter-fat increased from 68.6 cents to 68.7 cents per pound, and farm butter at 57 cents per pound was 4 cents lower than in November, 1961. Milk used in manufacture averaged \$2.82 per hundred, 1 cent lower than in November, 1961. Cheese milk increased to \$2.86 per hundred, an increase of 17 cents per hundred in comparison with the same month a year earlier. Part of the increase may be attributed to the collection of more detail information from Ontario cheese factories since the beginning of the year, which has resulted in higher calculated average unit values than a year ago.

Farm cash income estimates cover all money received by farmers for the sale of milk, cream and farm butter. Government subsidies and bonuses are included in these estimates.

Production and Prices of Dairy Products in November, 1962

Creamery Butter

Production: Creamery butter production amounted to 20.4 million pounds in November, 1962, a decrease of approximately 1.2 million pounds as compared to production in the same month of the previous year.

Stocks: Combined holdings of creamery butter and butter oil (in butter equivalent) in store and transit on December 1, amounted to 251.4 million pounds, approximately 44.4 million pounds higher than at December 1 last year. On November 1, 1962, stock holdings at 260.3 million pounds were 48.3 million pounds greater than at the same date a year earlier.

Supply: The combined quantity of creamery butter and butter oil represented by stocks on November 1, plus production and imports during the month, amounted to 280.7 million pounds at November 30, 1962. This was an increase of approximately 47.1 million pounds compared to the corresponding supply figure at November 30, 1961.

Domestic Disappearance: The combined domestic disappearance of creamery butter and butter oil in November amounted to 29.4 million pounds, an increase of 2.7 million pounds or 10.2 per cent more than the corresponding figure for the same month last year. On a per capita basis, it amounted to 1.59 pounds as compared with 1.46 pounds in November, 1961.

Prices at Montreal: Butter prices at Montreal, based on dealers' quotations for first grade solids, averaged 50 $\frac{3}{4}$ cents per pound in November, as against 62 $\frac{1}{2}$ cents in November, 1961.

Cheddar Cheese

Production: Cheddar cheese production amounted to approximately 7.9 million pounds, a decrease of approximately 0.2 million pounds as compared to production in the same month of the previous year.

Prices: The Belleville price of Ontario coloured cheese averaged 37 $\frac{1}{2}$ cents per pound in November. The comparative price in 1961 was 34 $\frac{1}{2}$ cents.

Ice Cream Mix

The quantity of ice cream mix manufactured in November was approximately 1.2 million gallons or 11 thousand gallons more than that produced a year ago.
