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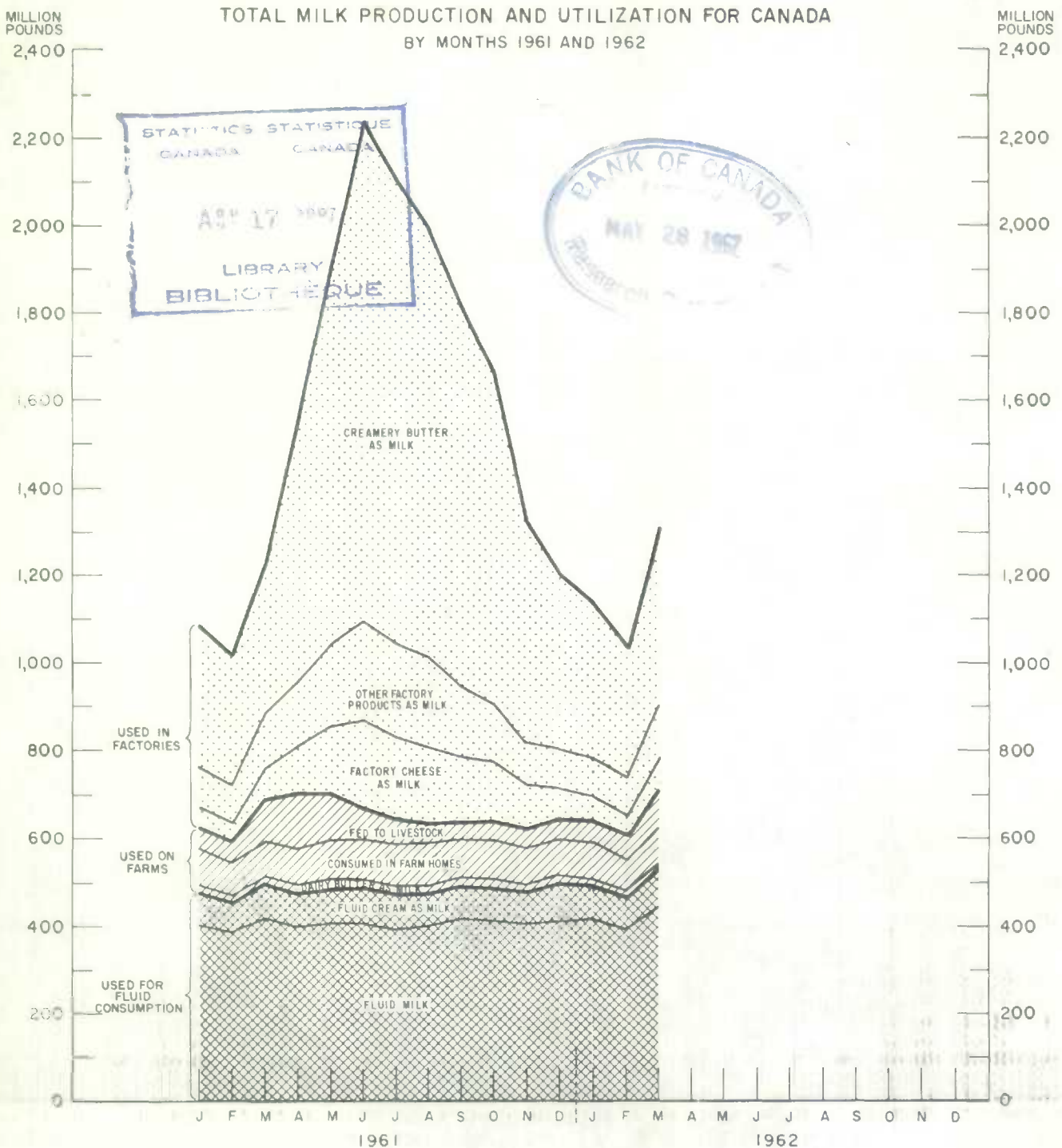
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THE DAIRY REVIEW

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Preliminary Indications of the Dairy Situation, April, 1962

The preliminary estimate of fluid milk produced in April is 1,553,000,000 pounds. This is 0.6 per cent less than production in the same month last year, and would make the total estimate of production during the first four months of the year 5,040,000,000 pounds. This is 1.5 per cent higher than production in the January - April period a year ago.

About 53 per cent of the milk produced in April, or 829,100,000 pounds, was used for dairy factory products. This was a decline of 3.4 per cent from factory utilization in April, 1961. Less milk was used in the manufacture of butter, cheese and concentrated whole milk products than a year ago, which more than offset a 12.4 per cent increase in milk utilized for ice cream mix. Creamery butter, the most important of the products, declined 3.1 per cent. During the January - April period, 0.3 per cent more milk was used in dairy factory products than in the corresponding period in 1961.

Fluid sales of milk and cream in April, for the purpose of the preliminary estimate, were assumed to have amounted to 496,700,000 pounds, an increase of 4.0 per cent over fluid sales in April, 1961. This is the average percentage increase shown for the January - March period, when compared to sales a year earlier.

According to indications from the monthly survey of farms keeping milk cows, milk and cream consumed in farm homes was 2.9 per cent below that used in April, 1961, while milk used for livestock feeding was 3.7 per cent above that of a year ago. Farm dairy correspondents participating in the survey, report 1.0 per cent more cows on farms at April 15, but 1.3 per cent less cows being milked than at the same date last year.

Farm Milk Production, Utilization and Income in March, 1962

Farm Milk Production: The estimated quantity of milk produced on farms in March, amounted to 1,312 million pounds, an increase of 16 million pounds or 1.2 per cent over that of March, 1961. Of this amount, 598 million pounds or 46 per cent was utilized in factory production, and approximately 530 million pounds or 40 per cent was used for fluid sales. During the January - March period, the estimated production was 3,487 million pounds, an increase of 85 million pounds over that produced in the same period of the previous year. The quantity of milk utilized for factory production in the January - March period amounted to 1,526 million pounds while fluid sales accounted for 1,494 million pounds.

Fluid Sales: Sales of fluid milk and cream, the latter expressed as milk, amounted to 530 million pounds in March, an increase of approximately 30 million pounds in comparison with March of the previous year. This included about 444 million pounds of fluid milk, comprising about 34 per cent of the farm milk supply, and fluid cream sales of 86 million pounds representing 6 per cent. During the three month period, fluid sales totalled 1,494 million pounds, an increase of 57 million pounds or 4.0 per cent over those of the corresponding 1961 period.

Farm Butter: Butter made on farms in March amounted to 570,000 pounds, decreasing 13 per cent from the corresponding month in 1961. For the January - March period, 1,642,000 pounds were produced, a decrease of 13 per cent from the same period last year.

Farm Cash Income: Cash income from the sale of dairy products in March amounted to \$38,080,000. This represented an increase of 2.6 per cent or \$979,000 in comparison with the same month last year. The weighted average value of \$3.37 per hundred pounds of milk was 1 cent higher than in March, 1961. Fluid milk at \$4.76 per hundred was also 1 cent higher than in March, 1961. Creamery butter-fat decreased from 67.9 cents to 66.8 cents per pound, and farm butter at 62 cents per pound was the same as in March, 1961. Milk used in manufacture averaged \$2.67 per hundred, 10 cents lower than in March, 1961. Cheese milk increased to \$2.66 per hundred, an increase of 10 cents per hundred in comparison with the same month a year earlier. Part of the increase may be attributed to the collection of more detail information from Ontario cheese factories since the beginning of the year, which has resulted in higher calculated average unit values than a year ago.

Farm cash income estimates cover all money received by farmers for the sale of milk, cream and farm butter. Government subsidies and bonuses are included in these estimates.

Production and Prices of Dairy Products in March, 1962

Creamery Butter

Production: Creamery butter production amounted to 17.5 million pounds in March, 1962, a decrease of approximately 65 thousand pounds as compared to production in the same month of the previous year.

Stocks: Combined holdings of creamery butter and butter oil (in butter equivalent) in store and transit on April 1 amounted to 176.4 million pounds, approximately 65.0 million pounds higher than at April 1 last year. On March 1, 1962, stock holdings at 183.6 million pounds were 67.2 million pounds greater than at the same date a year earlier.

Supply: The combined quantity of creamery butter and butter oil represented by stocks on March 1, plus production and imports during the month, amounted to 201.1 million pounds at March 31, 1962. This was an increase of approximately 67.1 million pounds compared to the corresponding supply figure at March 31, 1961.

Domestic Disappearance: The combined domestic disappearance of creamery butter and butter oil in March amounted to 24.7 million pounds, an increase of 2.1 million pounds or 9 per cent more than the corresponding figure for the same month last year. On a per capita basis, it amounted to 1.34 pounds as compared with 1.24 pounds in March, 1961.

Prices at Montreal: Butter prices at Montreal, based on dealers' quotations for first grade solids, averaged 63 1/2 cents per pound in March, the same as in March, 1961.

Cheddar Cheese

Production: Cheddar cheese production amounted to approximately 5.2 million pounds, a decrease of approximately 88 thousand pounds as compared to production in the same month of the previous year.

Prices: The Belleville price of Ontario coloured cheese averaged 32 1/2 cents per pound in March. The comparative price in 1961 was 33 1/4 cents.

Ice Cream Mix

The quantity of ice cream mix manufactured in March was approximately 1.5 million gallons or 72 thousand gallons more than that produced a year ago.

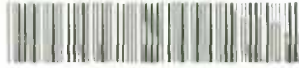
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
