

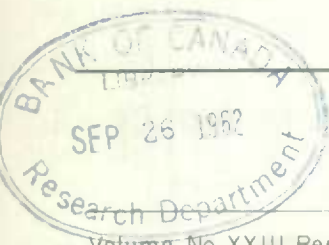

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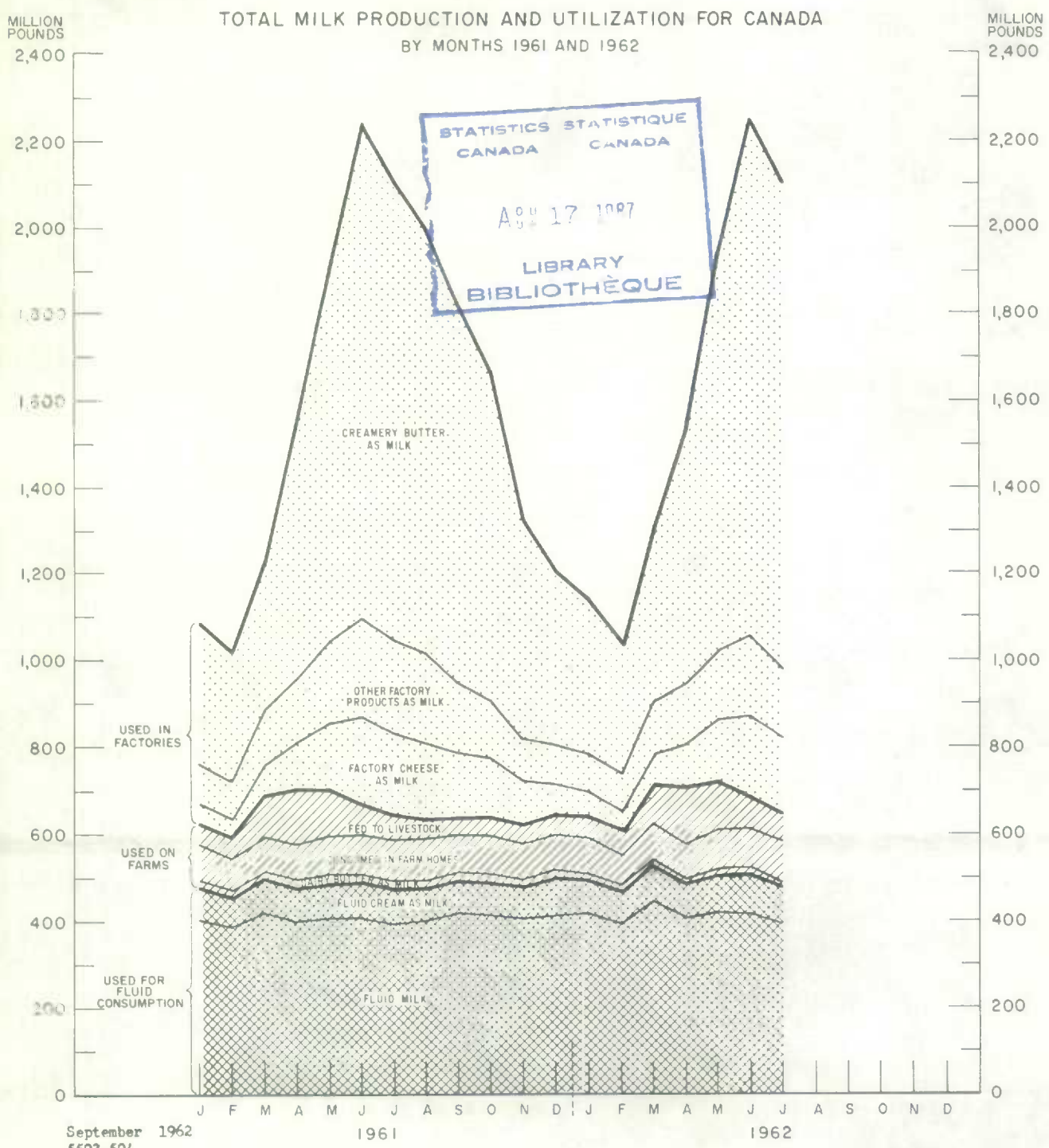

# THE NATIONAL ARCHIVES

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## Preliminary Indications of the Dairy Situation, August, 1962

The preliminary estimate of milk produced in August is 2,006,000,000 pounds. This is 0.5 per cent greater than production in the same month last year and would make the estimate of production for the first eight months of the year 13,313,000,000 pounds. This is 0.7 per cent above production in the January to August period a year ago.

Approximately 68 per cent of the milk produced in August, or 1,373,000,000 pounds was used for factory dairy products. This represented an increase of 0.8 per cent over factory utilization in August, 1961. Seven point four per cent more milk was used in the manufacture of creamery butter than a year ago, which more than offset respective decreases of 3.2, 13.0 and 43.0 per cent in milk utilized for cheese, concentrated whole milk products and ice cream mix. It will be noted from the table below that because of the above-normal use of butter in the manufacture of ice cream mix, it was necessary to reduce the milk equivalent of this product in order to avoid duplication between the milk equivalent of butter and ice cream mix. Milk utilized for dairy factory products in the period, January to August, was only slightly above that of the corresponding period a year earlier.

Fluid sales of milk and cream during July were 0.3 per cent above the corresponding figure a year earlier. Assuming the same rate of increase for August, fluid sales have been estimated to be 478,700,000 pounds or approximately 24 per cent of the preliminary estimate of total milk production for August.

According to indications from the monthly survey of farms keeping milk cows, milk and cream consumed in farm homes was 4.8 per cent below that used in August, 1961, while an above-normal increase of 17.2 per cent was recorded for milk used for livestock feeding when compared with that of a year ago. Farm dairy correspondents participating in the survey, report 1.7 per cent less cows being milked than at the same date last year.

Pasture conditions throughout Canada at August 15, were generally fair to good and remained favourable to dairying. Regional variations are shown by the maps on page 3.



## Farm Milk Production, Utilization and Income in July, 1962

**Farm Milk Production:** The estimated quantity of milk produced on farms in July amounted to 2,104 million pounds, a decrease of 2 million pounds or 0.1 per cent below that of July, 1961. Of this amount, 1,461 million pounds or 69 per cent was utilized in factory production, and approximately 477 million pounds or 23 per cent was used for fluid sales. During the January - July period, the estimated production was 11,306 million pounds, an increase of 77 million pounds over that produced in the same period of the previous year. The quantity of milk utilized for factory production in the January - July period amounted to 6,591 million pounds while fluid sales accounted for 3,460 million pounds.

**Fluid Sales:** Sales of fluid milk and cream, the latter expressed as milk, amounted to 477 million pounds in July, an increase of approximately 1 million pounds in comparison with July of the previous year. This included about 394 million pounds of fluid milk, comprising about 19 per cent of the farm milk supply, and fluid cream sales of 83 million pounds representing 4 per cent. During the seven month period, fluid sales totalled 3,460 million pounds, an increase of 89 million pounds or 2.65 per cent over those of the corresponding 1961 period.

**Farm Butter:** Butter made on farms in July amounted to 581,000 pounds, decreasing 21 per cent from the corresponding month in 1961. For the January - July period, 4,148,000 pounds were produced, a decrease of 14 per cent from the same period last year.

**Farm Cash Income:** Cash income from the sale of dairy products in July amounted to \$55,737,000. This represented an increase of 0.3 per cent or \$190,000 in comparison with the same month last year. The weighted average value of \$2.87 per hundred pounds of milk was 1 cent higher than in July, 1961. Fluid milk at \$4.71 per hundred was 2 cents higher than in July, 1961. Creamery butter-fat at 67.0 cents per pound was the same as in July, 1961, and farm butter at 57 cents per pound was 4 cents lower than in July, 1961. Milk used in manufacture averaged \$2.58 per hundred, 1 cent higher than in July, 1961. Cheese milk increased to \$2.61 per hundred, an increase of 13 cents per hundred in comparison with the same month a year earlier. Part of the increase may be attributed to the collection of more detail information from Ontario cheese factories since the beginning of the year, which has resulted in higher calculated average unit values than a year ago.

Farm cash income estimates cover all money received by farmers for the sale of milk, cream and farm butter. Government subsidies and bonuses are included in these estimates.

## Production and Prices of Dairy Products in July, 1962

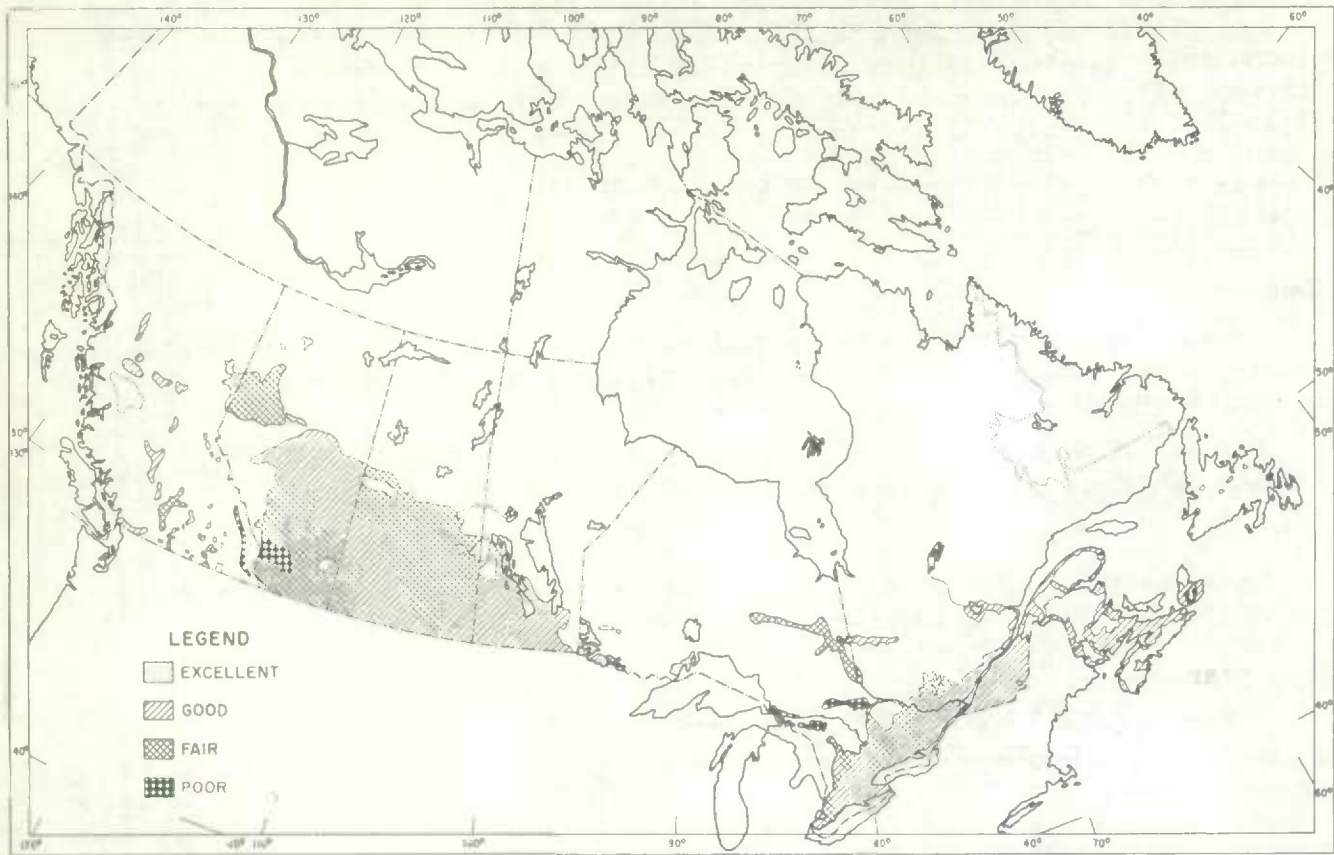
### Creamery Butter

**Production:** Creamery butter production amounted to 48.0 million pounds in July, 1962, an increase of approximately 2.7 million pounds as compared to production in the same month of the previous year.

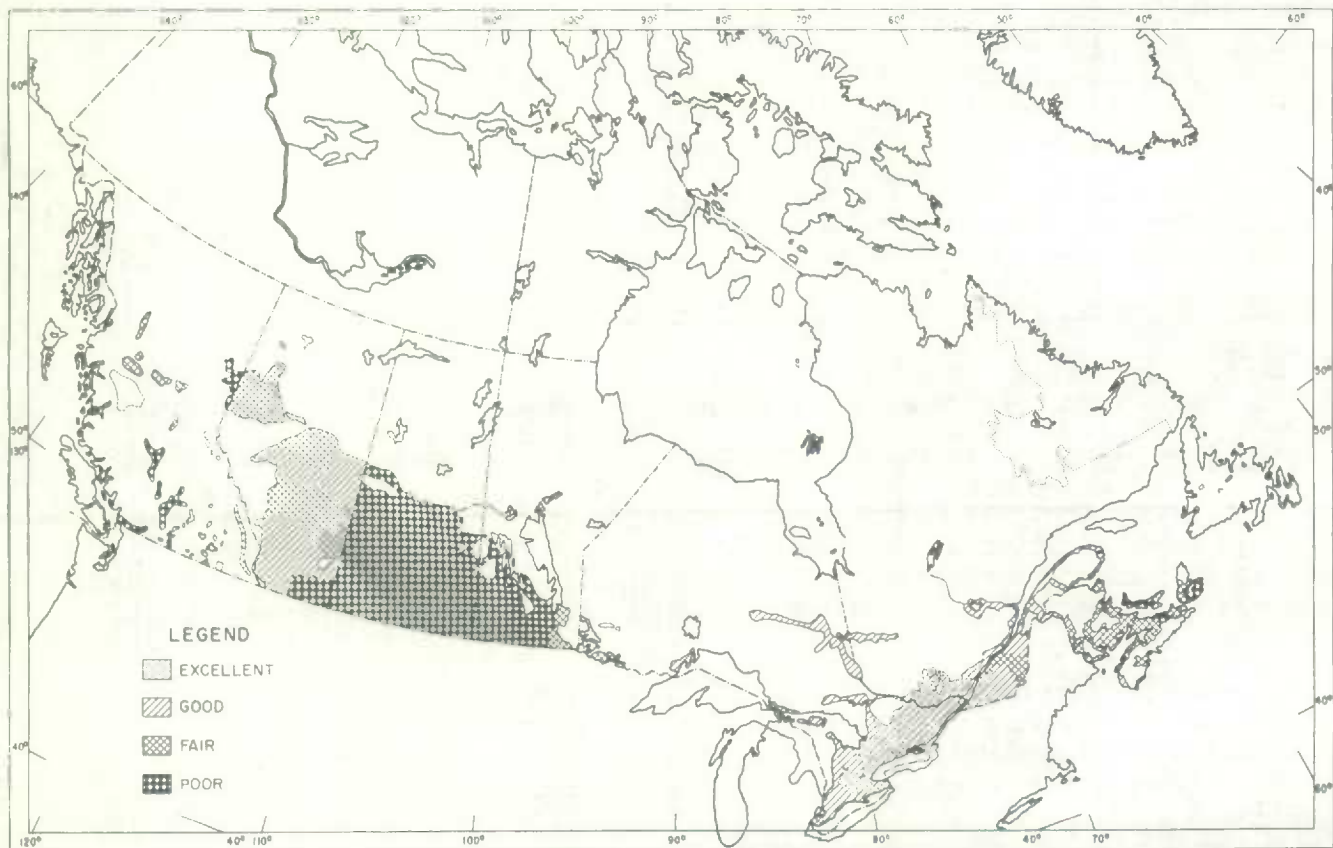
**Stocks:** Combined holdings of creamery butter and butter oil (in butter equivalent) in store and transit on August 1, amounted to 233.4 million pounds, approximately 55.5 million pounds higher than at August 1 last year. On July 1, 1962, stock holdings at 213.3 million pounds were 59.2 million pounds greater than at the same date a year earlier.

**Supply:** The combined quantity of creamery butter and butter oil represented by stocks on July 1, plus production and imports during the month, amounted to 261.3 million pounds at July 31, 1962. This was an increase of approximately 61.9 million pounds compared to the corresponding supply figure at July 31, 1961.

**Domestic Disappearance:** The combined domestic disappearance of creamery butter and butter oil in July amounted to 28.0 million pounds, an increase of 6.3 million pounds or 29.2 per cent more than the corresponding figure for the same month last year. On a per capita basis, it amounted to 1.52 pounds as compared with 1.19 pounds in July, 1961. The increase as indicated in the July disappearance figures (table 12), may be due partly to the abnormally low figure calculated for July, 1961.

**Prices at Montreal:** Butter prices at Montreal, based on dealers' quotations for first grade solids, averaged 50 1/2 cents per pound in July, as against 62 1/2 cents in July, 1961.

**Cheddar Cheese**

**Production:** Cheddar cheese production amounted to approximately 15.0 million pounds, a decrease of approximately 0.9 million pounds as compared to production in the same month of the previous year.

**Prices:** The Belleville price of Ontario coloured cheese averaged 34 3/4 cents per pound in July. The comparative price in 1961 was 33 3/4 cents.

**Ice Cream Mix**

The quantity of ice cream mix manufactured in July was approximately 2.8 million gallons or 6 thousand gallons more than that produced a year ago.
