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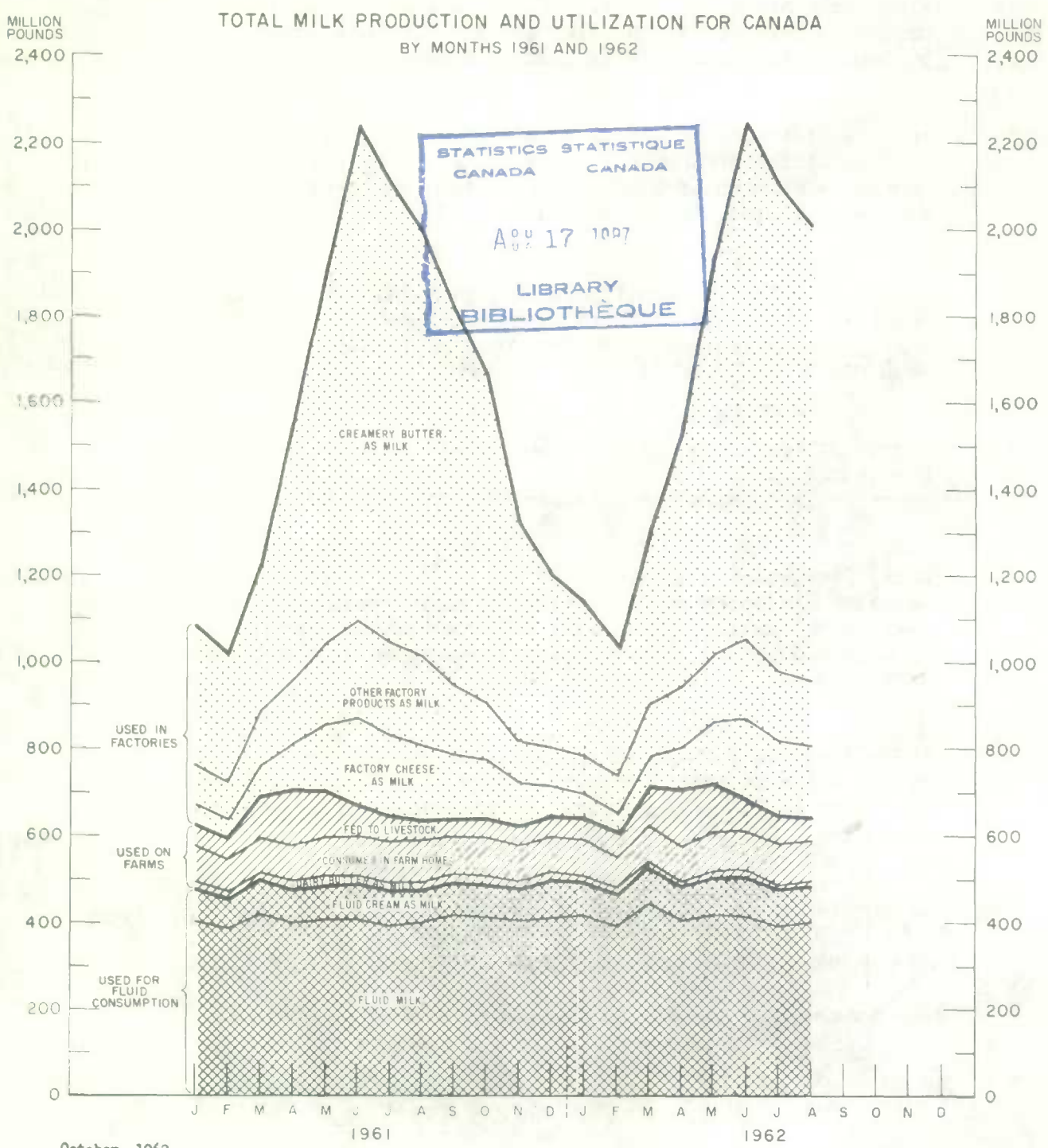

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Preliminary Indications of the Dairy Situation, September, 1962

The preliminary estimate of milk produced in September is 1,814,000,000 pounds. This is only slightly above production in the same month last year and would make the estimate of production for the first nine months of the year 15,131,000,000 pounds. This is 0.6 per cent above production in the January to September period a year ago.

About 64 per cent of the milk produced in September, or 1,168,000,000 pounds, was used for factory dairy products. This represented a decrease of 0.6 per cent from factory utilization in September, 1961. While approximately 2 and 6 per cent, respectively, more milk was utilized in the manufacture of creamery butter and factory cheese than a year ago, this was more than offset by respective declines of 3 and 39 per cent in milk used for concentrated milk products and ice cream mix. Compared with the corresponding month a year earlier, milk utilized for factory cheese increased for the first time since February. During the January to September period, milk utilized for factory products was almost identical to that used in the corresponding period a year ago.

Fluid sales of milk and cream during August were 1.2 per cent above the corresponding figure a year earlier. Assuming the same rate of increase for September, fluid sales have been estimated to be 499,700,000 pounds or approximately 28 per cent of the preliminary estimate of total milk production for September.

According to indications from the monthly survey of farms keeping milk cows, milk and cream consumed in farm homes was 0.5 per cent below that used in September, 1961, while the use of milk for livestock feeding was moderately greater than a year ago. Farm dairy correspondents participating in the survey, report 2.8 per cent less cows being milked than at the same date last year.

Pasture conditions at September 15 were generally only fair throughout most of Canada. However, conditions were adequate to maintain milk supply. Regional variations are shown by the maps on page 3.

Farm Milk Production, Utilization and Income in August, 1962

Farm Milk Production: The estimated quantity of milk produced on farms in August amounted to 2,011 million pounds, an increase of 15 million pounds or 0.8 per cent over that of August, 1961. Of this amount, 1,373 million pounds or 68 per cent was utilized in factory production, and approximately 483 million pounds or 24 per cent was used for fluid sales. During the January - August period, the estimated production was 13,317 million pounds, an increase of 92 million pounds over that produced in the same period of the previous year. The quantity of milk utilized for factory production in the January - August period amounted to 7,963 million pounds while fluid sales accounted for 3,943 million pounds.

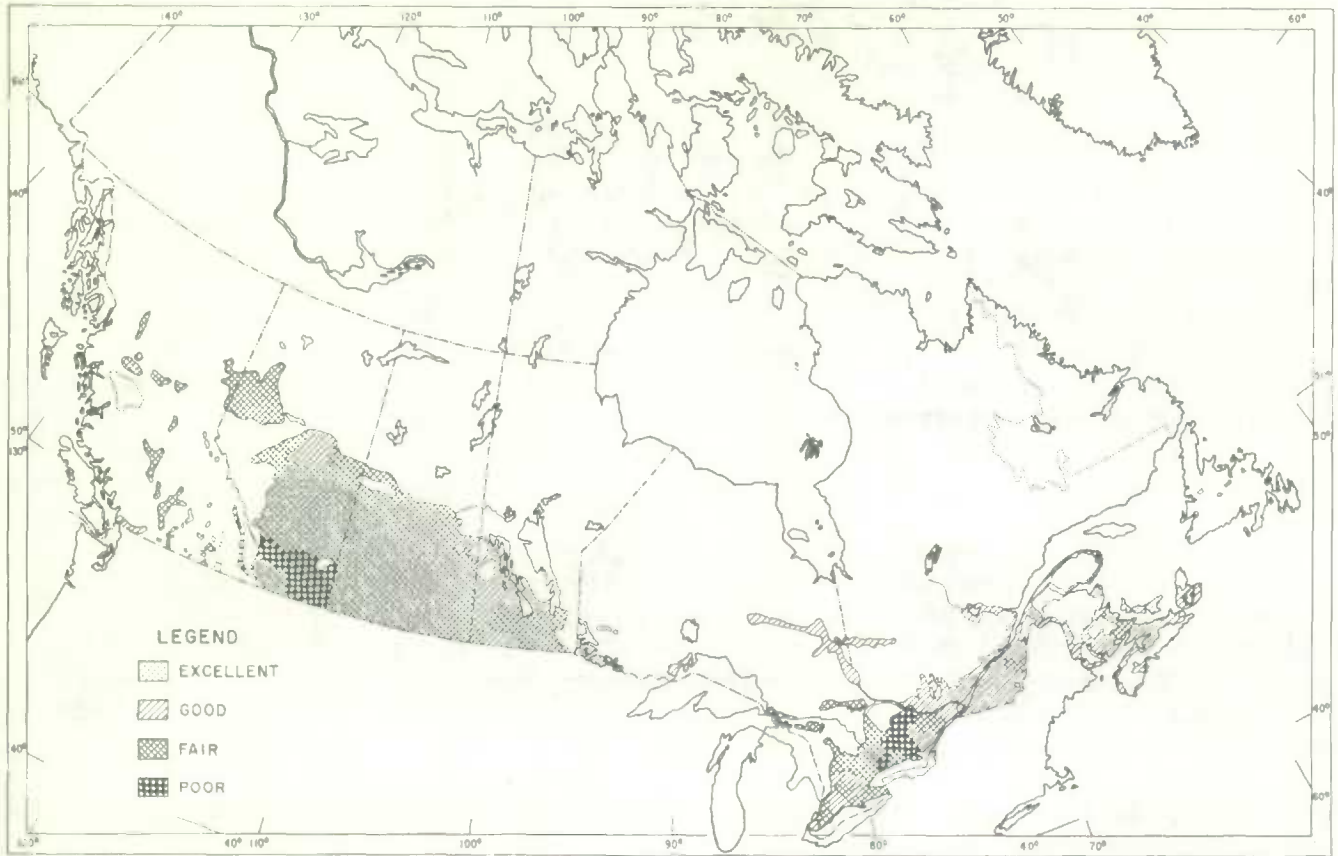
Fluid Sales: Sales of fluid milk and cream, the latter expressed as milk, amounted to 483 million pounds in August, an increase of approximately 6 million pounds in comparison with August of the previous year. This included about 402 million pounds of fluid milk, comprising about 20 per cent of the farm milk supply, and fluid cream sales of 81 million pounds representing 4 per cent. During the eight month period, fluid sales totalled 3,943 million pounds, an increase of 95 million pounds or 2.5 per cent over those of the corresponding 1961 period.

Farm Butter: Butter made on farms in August amounted to 570,000 pounds, decreasing 21 per cent from the corresponding month in 1961. For the January - August period, 4,718,000 pounds were produced, a decrease of 15 per cent from the same period last year.

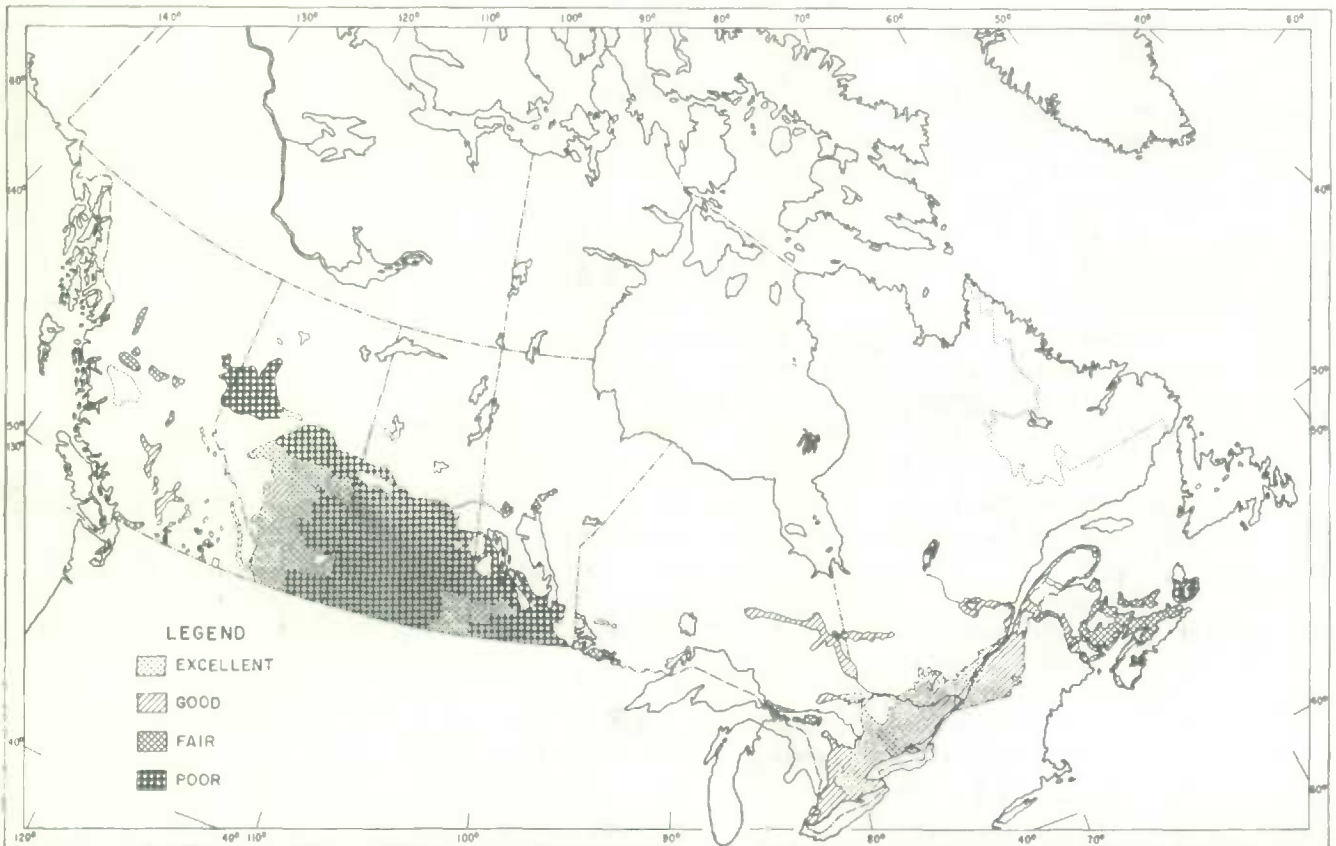
Farm Cash Income: Cash income from the sale of dairy products in August amounted to \$54,130,000. This represented an increase of 1.1 per cent or \$608,000 in comparison with the same month last year. The weighted average value of \$2.92 per hundred pounds of milk was 1 cent higher than in August 1961. Fluid milk at \$4.71 per hundred was 1 cent higher than in August 1961. Creamery butter-fat decreased from 67.3 cents to 67.2 cents per pound, and farm butter at 57 cents per pound was 4 cents lower than in August 1961. Milk used in manufacture averaged \$2.60 per hundred, 1 cent higher than in August 1961. Cheese milk increased to \$2.66 per hundred, an increase of 18 cents per hundred in comparison with the same month a year earlier. Part of the increase may be attributed to the collection of more detail information from Ontario cheese factories since the beginning of the year, which has resulted in higher calculated average unit values than a year ago.

Farm cash income estimates cover all money received by farmers for the sale of milk, cream and farm butter. Government subsidies and bonuses are included in these estimates.

Production and Prices of Dairy Products in August, 1962

Creamery Butter

Production: Creamery butter production amounted to 45.0 million pounds in August, 1962, an increase of approximately 3.1 million pounds as compared to production in the same month of the previous year.

Stocks: Combined holdings of creamery butter and butter oil (in butter equivalent) in store and transit on September 1, amounted to 248.5 million pounds, approximately 54.5 million pounds higher than at September 1 last year. On August 1, 1962, stock holdings at 233.4 million pounds were 55.5 million pounds greater than at the same date a year earlier.

Supply: The combined quantity of creamery butter and butter oil represented by stocks on August 1, plus production and imports during the month, amounted to 278.4 million pounds at August 31, 1962. This was an increase of approximately 58.6 million pounds compared to the corresponding supply figure at August 31, 1961.

Domestic Disappearance: The combined domestic disappearance of creamery butter and butter oil in August amounted to 29.9 million pounds, an increase of 4.1 million pounds or 16.1 per cent more than the corresponding figure for the same month last year. On a per capita basis, it amounted to 1.62 pounds as compared with 1.41 pounds in August, 1961.

Prices at Montreal: Butter prices at Montreal, based on dealers' quotations for first grade solids, averaged 50 1/2 cents per pound in August, as against 62 1/2 cents in August, 1961.

Cheddar Cheese

Production: Cheddar cheese production amounted to approximately 14.3 million pounds, a decrease of approximately 0.6 million pounds as compared to production in the same month of the previous year.

Prices: The Belleville price of Ontario coloured cheese averaged 36 cents per pound in August. The comparative price in 1961 was 34 cents.

Ice Cream Mix

The quantity of ice cream mix manufactured in August was approximately 2.7 million gallons or 207 thousand gallons less than that produced a year ago.
