

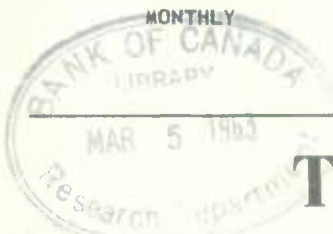
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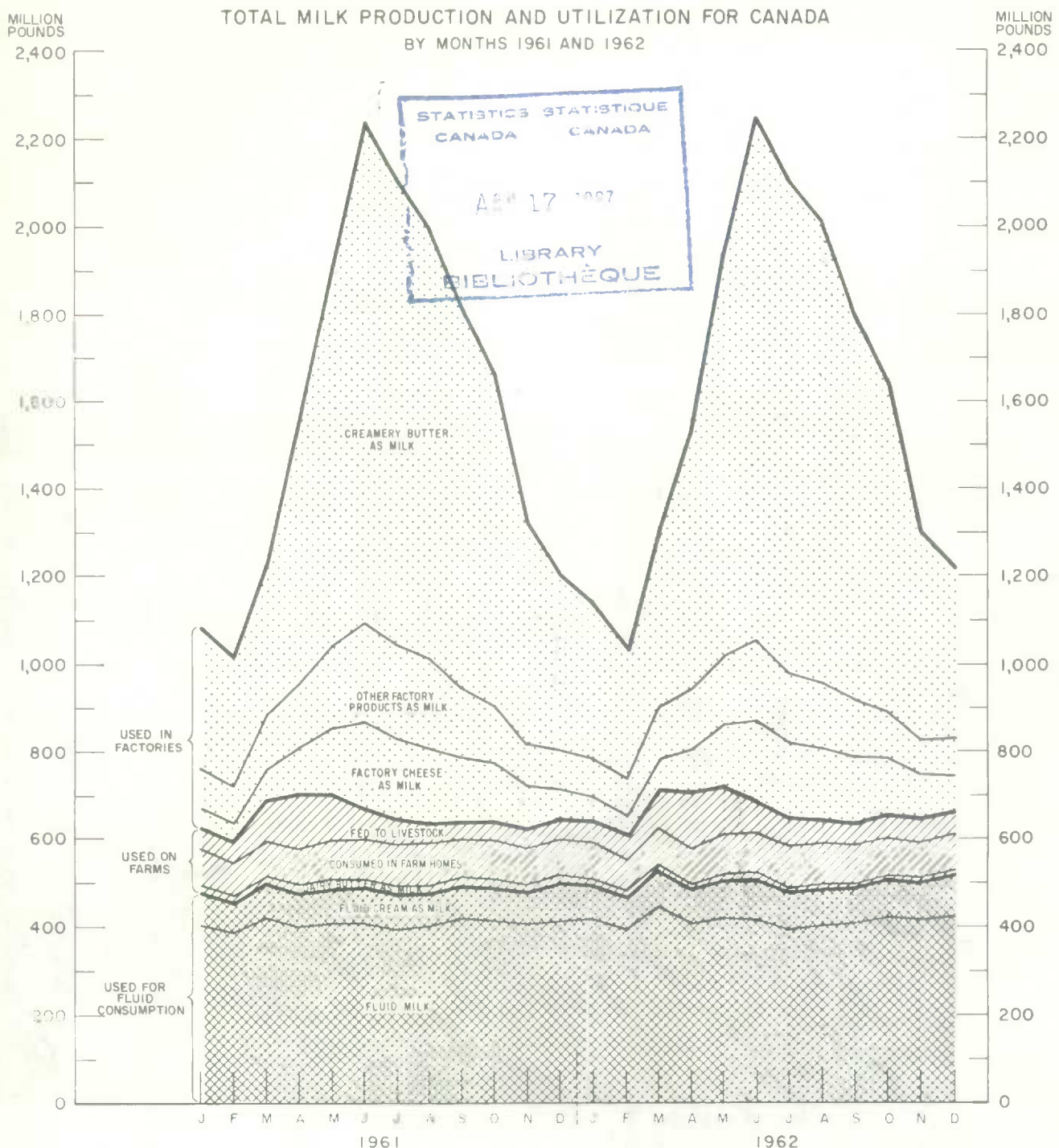

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Preliminary Indications of the Dairy Situation, January, 1963

The preliminary estimate of milk produced in January is 1,160,000,000 pounds. This is an increase of 1.9 per cent over milk production in January, 1962.

The Manufacture of dairy factory products during the month utilized 504,200,000 pounds of milk, 1.4 per cent more than in the first month of 1962. The increase was primarily due to a 31 per cent increase in the amount of milk used in the manufacture of concentrated whole milk products. More milk was also used for the production of creamery butter and factory cheese than in January last year, with increases of 0.4 and 5 per cent, respectively, for these products. About 35 per cent less milk was used for ice cream mix in January, 1963, as compared with January a year ago.

Preliminary data for 1961 and 1962 indicate that 11.3 billion pounds of milk went into the manufacture of dairy factory products last year. This is an increase of 0.7 per cent over the corresponding figure for 1961. The publication of revised milk equivalent estimates for factory products which would normally appear in Tables 1, 4, 5, 6 and 7 of this report have been delayed. If possible, revised data will be published along with revised estimates for fluid sales and farm-use milk in a supplement to next month's Dairy Review.

Fluid sales of milk and cream during January, for the purpose of the preliminary estimate, are calculated at 510,000,000 pounds, an increase of 2.9 per cent over fluid sales in January, 1962. This assumes the same relationship to year-earlier estimates as the month of December.

According to indications from the monthly survey of farms keeping milk cows, milk and cream consumed in farm homes was 3.2 per cent below that used in January, 1962, but more milk was used for livestock feeding than a year earlier. Farm dairy correspondents report 3.0 per cent fewer cows kept on farms at January 15, and 2.5 per cent less cows being milked than at the same date last year. Milk production per cow, for cows milked on farms in the sample, increased 4.9 per cent above the level at January 15, 1962.

Preliminary Farm Milk Production, Utilization and Income in December, 1962

Farm Milk Production: The estimated quantity of milk produced on farms in December amounted to 1,217 million pounds, an increase of 16 million pounds or 1.3 per cent over that of December, 1961. Of this amount, 557 million pounds or 46 per cent was utilized in factory production, and approximately 516 million pounds or 42 per cent was used for fluid sales. During the January - December period, the estimated production was 19,278 million pounds, an increase of 52 million pounds over that produced in the same period of the previous year. The quantity of milk utilized for factory production in the January - December period amounted to 11,340 million pounds while fluid sales accounted for 5,950 million pounds.

Fluid Sales: Sales of fluid milk and cream, the latter expressed as milk, amounted to 516 million pounds in December, an increase of approximately 14 million pounds in comparison with December of the previous year. This included about 425 million pounds of fluid milk, comprising about 35 per cent of the farm milk supply, and fluid cream sales of 91 million pounds representing 7 per cent. During the twelve month period, fluid sales totalled 5,950 million pounds, an increase of about 136 million pounds or 2.3 per cent over those of the corresponding 1961 period.

Farm Butter: Butter made on farms in December amounted to 503,000 pounds, decreasing 14 per cent from the corresponding month in 1961. For the January - December period, 6,751,000 pounds were produced, a decrease of 19 per cent from the same period last year.

Farm Cash Income: Cash income from the sale of dairy products in December amounted to \$36,839,000. This represented an increase of 1.8 per cent or \$667,000 in comparison with the same month last year. The weighted average value of \$3.43 per hundred pounds of milk was 1 cent higher than in December, 1961. Fluid milk at \$4.77 per hundred was 2 cents higher than in December, 1961. Creamery butter-fat increased from 68.5 cents to 68.6 cents per pound, and farm butter at 57 cents per pound was 5 cents lower than in December, 1961. Milk used in manufacture averaged \$2.82 per hundred, the same as in December, 1961. Cheese milk increased to \$2.85 per hundred, an increase of 15 cents per hundred in comparison with the same month a year earlier. Part of the increase may be attributed to the collection of more detail information from Ontario cheese factories since the beginning of the year, which has resulted in higher calculated average unit values than a year ago.

Farm cash income estimates cover all money received by farmers for the sale of milk, cream and farm butter. Government subsidies and bonuses are included in these estimates.

Production and Prices of Dairy Products in December, 1962

Creamery Butter

Production: Creamery butter production amounted to 170 million pounds in December, 1962. This was approximately the same as that produced in the same month of the previous year.

Stocks: Combined holdings of creamery butter and butter oil (in butter equivalent) in store and transit on January 1, 1963, amounted to 239.0 million pounds, approximately 41.9 million pounds higher than at January 1 last year. On December 1, 1962, stock holdings at 251.2 million pounds were 44.3 million pounds greater than at the same date a year earlier.

Supply: The combined quantity of creamery butter and butter oil represented by stocks on December 1, plus production and imports during the month, amounted to 268.2 million pounds of butter at December 31, 1962. This was an increase of approximately 44.2 million pounds compared to the corresponding supply figure at December 31, 1961.

Domestic Disappearance: The combined domestic disappearance of creamery butter and butter oil in December amounted to 29.2 million pounds of butter, an increase of 2.3 million pounds or 9 per cent more than the corresponding figure for the same month last year. On a per capita basis, it amounted to 1.58 pounds as compared with 1.47 pounds in December, 1961.

Prices at Montreal: Butter prices at Montreal, based on dealers' quotations for first grade solids, averaged 51 cents per pound in December, as against 63 1/2 cents in December, 1961.

Cheddar Cheese

Production: Cheddar cheese production in December amounted to approximately 6.3 million pounds, an increase of about 0.8 million pounds compared to production in the same month of the previous year.

Prices: The Belleville price of Ontario coloured cheese averaged 36 3/4 cents per pound in December. The comparative price in 1961 was 33 1/2 cents.

Ice Cream Mix

The quantity of ice cream mix manufactured in December was approximately 1.3 million gallons or 100 thousand gallons more than that produced a year ago.
