# THE DAIRY REVIEW 



The preliminary estimate of milk produced in October is $1,638,000,000$ pounds. This is slightly below production in the same month last year and would make the total estimate of production for the first ten months of the year 16,747,000,000 pounds, practically unchanged from last year.

About 61 per cent of the milk produced in October, or 989,000,000 pounds, was used for dairy factory products. This represented a slight decrease from factory utilization in October, 1962. Creamery butter production during the month used 704,000,000 pounds, 6.7 per cent less than in October, 1962, while milk used in the manufacture of cheese, concentrated whole milk products and ice cream m 1 x increased $29.6,3.7$ and 15.8 per cent, respectively, over that of a year ago. During the January - October period, slightly less milk was used in dairy factory products than in the corresponding period in 1962.

Fluid sales of milk and cream in Ootober, for the purpose of the preliminary estimate, are calculated at $514,200,000$ pounds. This is an increase of 1.4 per cent over fluid sales in October, 1962, and assumes the same relationship to year-earlier estimates as for the month of September.

According to indications from the monthly survey of farms keeping milk cows, milk and cream consumed in farm homes was 2.5 per cent above that used in October, 1962, while milk used for livestock feeding dropped 18.1 per cent from that of a year ago. Farm dairy correspondents participating in the suryey, report fewer milk cows kept on farms at October 15, and slightly more cows being milked than at the same date last year. Milk production per cow, for cows milked on farms in the sample, increased 2.9 per cent above the level at October 15, 1962. It should be noted that these sample indications are not necessarily representative of production conditions on all farms producing milk.

It should be noted here that the 1962 comparative data used and published throughout this report with respect to milk production, utilization and income, are unrevised and exactly as published during the year.

Farm Milk Production, Utilization and Income in September, 1963

Farm Milk Production: The estimated quantity of milk produced on farms in September amounted to 1,794 million pounds, a decrease of 4 million pounds or 0.2 per cent below that of September, 1962. Of this amount, 1,167 million pounds or 65 per cent was utilized in factory production, and approximately 492 million pounds or 27 per cent was used for fluid sales. During the January - September period, the estimated production was 15,108 million pounds, a decrease of 7 million pounds below that produced in the same period of the previous year. The quantity of milk utilized for factory production in the January - September period amounted to 9,092 million pounds while fluid sales accounted for 4,523 million pounds.

Fluid Sales: Sales of fluid milk and cream, the latter expressed as milk, amounted to 492 million pounds in September, an increase of approximately 7 million pounds in comparison with September of the previous year. This included about 415 million pounds of fluid milk, comprising about 23 per cent of the farm milk supply, and fluid cream sales of 77 million pounds representing 4 per cent. During the nine month period, fluid sales totalled 4,523 million pounds, an increase of 95 million pounds or 2.2 per cent over those of the corresponding 1962 period.

Farm Butter: Butter made on farms in September amounted to 420,000 pounds, decreasing 21 per cent from the corresponding month in 1962. For the January - September period, 3,850,000 pounds were produced, a decrease of 27 per cent from the same period last year.

Farm Cash Income: Cash income from the sale of dairy products in September amounted to $\$ 50,724,000$. This represented an increase of 1.3 per cent or $\$ 647,000$ in comparison with the same month last year. The weighted average value of $\$ 3.06$ per hundred pounds of milk was 3 cents higher than in September, 1962. Fluid milk at $\$ 4.79$ per hundred was 4 cents higher than in September, 1962. Creamery butter-fat decreased from 67.9 cents to 67.2 cents per pound, and farm butter at 57 cents per pound was the same as in September, 1962. Milk used in manufacture averaged $\$ 2.76$ per hundred, 9 cents higher than in September, 1962. Cheese milk increased to $\$ 2.85$ per hundred, an increase of 10 cents per hundred in comparison with the same month a year earlier.

Farm cash income estinates cover all money received by farmers for the sale of milk, cream and farm butter. Government subsidies and bonuses are included in these estimates.

Production and Prices of Dairy Products in Sentember, 1963

Cremery Butter

Production: Creamery butter production amounted to 36.2 million pounds in September, 1963, a decrease of approximately 1.9 million pounds as compared to production in the same month of the previous year.

Stocks: Combined holdings of creamery butter and butter oil (in butter equivalent) in store and transit on October 1, 1963, amounted to 268.8 million pounds, approximately 10.6 million pounds higher than at October 1 last year. On September 1, 1963, stock holdings at 261.7 million pounds were 13.4 million pounds greater than at the same date a year earlier.

Supply: The combined quantity of creamery butter and butter ofl represented by stocks on September 1, plus production and imports during the month, amounted to 297.8 million pounds of butter at September 30, 1963. This was an increase of approximately 11.5 million pounds compared to the corresponding supply figure at September 30, 1962.

Domestic Disappearance: The combined domestic disappearance of creamery butter and butter oil in September amounted to 29.0 mililion pounds of butter, an increase of 0.9 million pounds or 3.1 per cent more than the corresponding figure for the same month last year. On a per capita basis, it amounted to 1.55 pounds as compared with 1.51 pounds in September, 1962.

Prices at Montreal: Butter prices at Montreal, based on dealers' quotations for first grade solids, averaged $503 / 4$ cents per pound in September as against $501 / 2$ cents in September 1962.

## Cheddar Cheese

Productions Cheddar cheese production in Septomber amcunted to approximately 16.4 million pounds, an increase of 3.3 miliion pounds as compared to production in the same month of the previous year.

Prices: The Belleville price of Ontario coloured cheose averaged $381 / 4$ cents per pound in September. The comparative price in 1962 was $371 / 2$ cents. Ice Cream Mix

The quantity of ice cream mix manufactured in September was approximately 1.8 million gallons or 65 thousand gallons more than that produced a year ago.
